



Dan Morrison tries for a layup.




Tommy Abercrombie has a cross body ride on his opponent.



Paul Blevins races around end as teammates Hugh Sellers and David Jaqua block.




Jim Sandefer and Wayne Veal get into the "swing" of things during baseball practice.

Though hampered by injuries throughout the entire season, the Norman High School football team had another winning season. Head coach Gene Corrotto and co-captains Hugh Sellers and Kenny Grubaugh led the Tigers to a 6-3-0 record.

We will always remember the determination and enthusiasm our Tigers displayed through the season. After losing their opening game to Ada, the Tigers came back to defeat Putnam City where halfback Paul Blevins ran 88 yards for our first touchdown. Our superb offense dominated the Duncan game, which we won 40-16. The Tigers ended a Stillwater winning streak before losing to Lawton. The following week our Tigers trounced Seminole 41-13, then lost a heartbreaker to Ardmore by two points. The season ended on a winning note when we beat Tulsa Hale 19-8.

Four Tigers were named to the All-Boomer Conference Team. Kenny Grubaugh and Paul Blevins were named to the offensive team, while Hugh Sellers and Wayne Veal were named to the defensive team. Seventeen other Tigers were given honorable mention.



Hugh Sellers charges down the field chased by two Lawton players.







Sophomore Gary Dickinson (15) charges down the field, assisted by teammates Joe Eurton (23) and Terry Patty (12) in the Lawton game.














Bob Campbell tries for two at the charity stripe.





Wrestling






Captain Gary Miller works for a front-stretcher on a Duncan wrestler.









Ted Williams has an angle pick-up on his struggling opponent.




"B" Team


These boys created good competition for the more experienced "A" team, and they promise to be tough grapplers for next year's team.


