### **Celebrate**

Memorial Day Monday May 31, 2010— . Memorial Day is a federal holiday which commemorates the U.S. servicemen and women who gave their lives defending their country.

### National Armed Forces Day Saturday May 15, 2010—.

In the United States, **Armed Forces Day** is celebrated on the third Saturday in May. It falls near the end of Armed Forces Week, which begins on the second Saturday of May and ends on the third Sunday of May.

The day was created in 1949 to honor Americans serving in the five U.S. military branches – the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, and Coast Guard – following the consolidation of the military services in the Department of Defense. It was intended to replace the separate Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps\_and Coast Guard Days, but observance of these days, especially within each particular service, continues to this day. 

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The first Armed Forces Day was celebrated by parades, open houses, receptions and air shows. The United States' longest running city-sponsored Armed Forces Day Parade is held in Bremerton, WA. In 2009, Bremerton celebrated the 61st Armed Forces Day Parade.

## May is...

- National Cancer Research Month— In recognition of the need for high-quality, innovative cancer research, the United States Congress has designated May as National Cancer Research Month. The initiative is intended to help renew the nation's focus on cancer research with the goal of increasing the spectrum of cancer research and care in the United States. As always, the success of our nation's medical researchers depend on having adequate funds to carry out the necessary research. The contributions and fundraising efforts of benefactors are vital to this cause.
- National Arthritis Month— Some 46 million Americans are living with arthritis, the nation's leading cause of disability. The Arthritis Foundation encourages people with arthritis to stay active and exercise 20–30 minutes a day, three times a week or more. Avoiding a sedentary lifestyle is important.

### How to recognize and treat burn injuries

a matter of degree. To know how to treat a burn, and when to call a doctor, first learn to distinguish the different types of

- First degree. Only the outer layer of skin is damaged. The skin is red, with some swelling and pain. This is the least serious type of burn and can be treated with first aid.
- Second degree. The first layer of skin has been burned through, and the layer underneath is red and splotchy. Blisters may develop, along with swelling.
- Third degree. The most serious type of burn, affecting all layers of skin and possibly causing permanent damage to tissues and even bones. Skin may appear either charred and black, or white and dry. For third-degree burns, immediate medi-

Burns can be painful—and serious. It's all cal attention is needed. Don't remove burned clothing or soak in water, but cover the area with a cool, wet sterile cloth or bandage. If possible, raise the burned area of the body above the level of the heart.

> With first-degree burns, or second-degree burns that don't cover more than 3 inches of skin, hold the burned area under cool-but not cold-running water for about 15 minutes. Don't put ice on the burn. Wrap the wound in a loose dressing of sterile gauze, keeping air and pressure off the burn. Don't break any blisters that form. The patient can take over-the-counter medications such as aspirin, ibuprofen, or acetaminophen for pain.

Keep an eye out for increased redness, swelling, or oozing, and call a doctor if any of these signs of infection develop.

### Alumni Profile

Monsignor Kenneth Richards is an alumnus of St Catherine High School. Below is an article which was printed in the Gleaner of <u>SUNDAY NOVEMBER</u> 1, 2009 and written by Athaliah Reynolds.



I AM A HAPPY PRIEST

THE WEEKEND before he was scheduled to sit the entrance exam to join the Jamaica Constabulary Force (JCF), Monsignor Kenneth Richards changed his mind and took up the invitation to attend a preparatory seminary for priests - an unlikely choice for a young man from a large St Catherine family, who enjoyed the movies and parties and wanted to have a family of his own one day.

"The grace of God", or divine intervention is how Monsignor Richards describes his conversion to Catholicism and his eventual journey into the priesthood.

"It's not something that I conceived for myself, so it is definitely the grace of God that has brought me to where I am," he recently told **The Sunday Gleaner** during an interview at his offices at the Holy Trinity Cathedral on George Headley Drive in Kingston.

He admits that when he was first asked by one of his friends to attend an aspirancy meeting for the priesthood he jokingly told him, "I am not interested in this priest business because I want to get married and have 12 children."

Monsignor Richards, however, confessed that he later recognized that when God calls you and you understand what the call is about, you make the commitment.

With a sense of purpose and determination, he entered the seminary at the young age of 19, after spending two years in Montego Bay, St James, at a preparatory seminary.

He later went on to the St Michael's Seminary and the University of the West Indies where he completed his bachelor's degree in theology.

He was officially ordained at age 27 and after 24 years of service, he was recently conferred with the title monsignor.

Monsignor Richards admits that the journey has been long and sometimes challenging, but "I've not regretted it. I'm a happy priest", he told **The Sunday Gleaner**.
