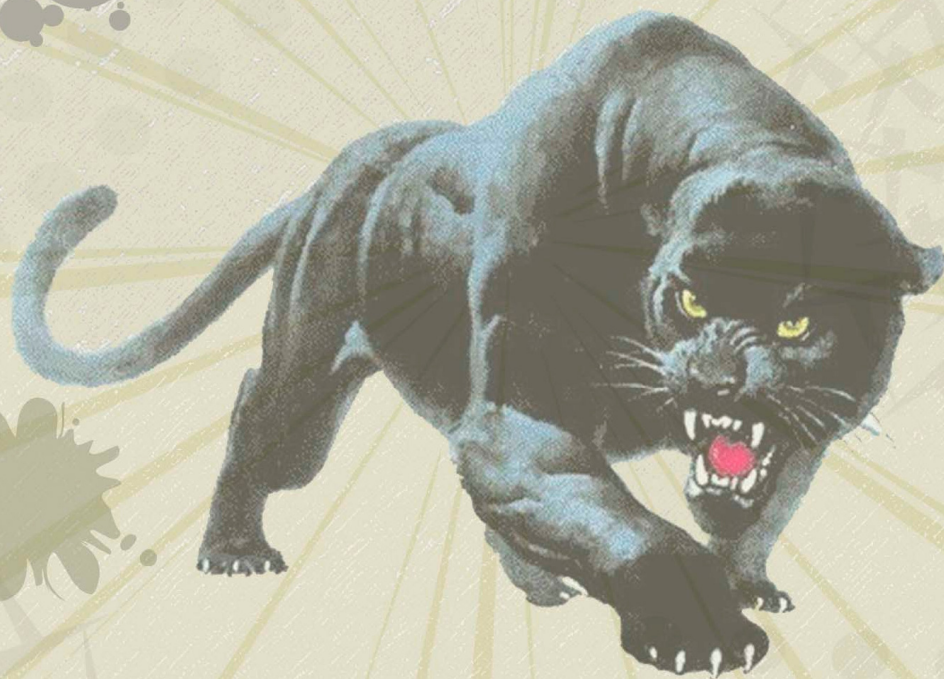

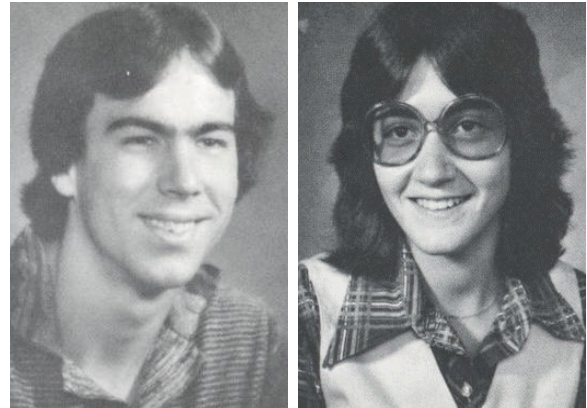
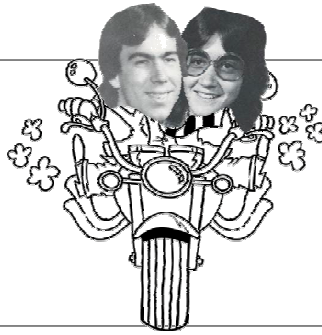

We have 2 motorcycles and love to ride and go on trips on them also playing with Lane—grandkids are so much fun.

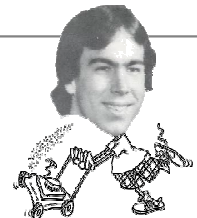
### NO PARKING

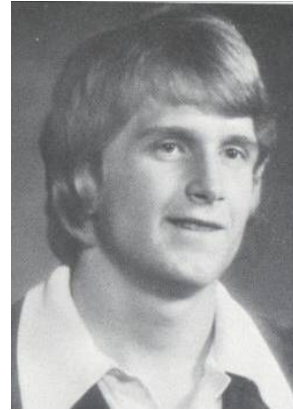

## THE PRINCIPALS OFFICE AGAIN?

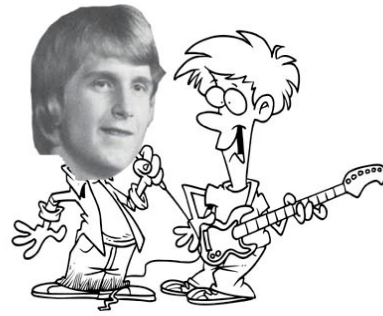
Live in Overland Park Kansas—Married for 10 years this summer. Wife's name is Geri. She is a grade school principal in the USD 500 school district. KCK!

It was only there a few months. My good memories are of Nickerson Grade School, but I am glad to have been part of both. I was not very social and didn't have too many friends. None that I hung out with.

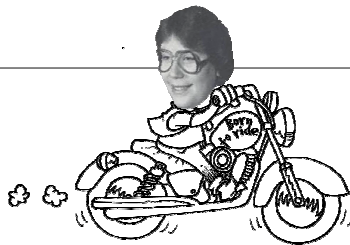
## NO REGRETS

## CARPE DIEM

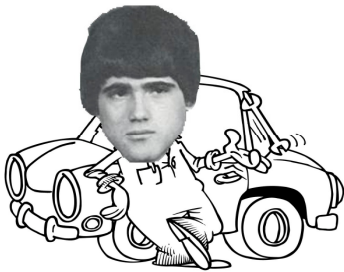
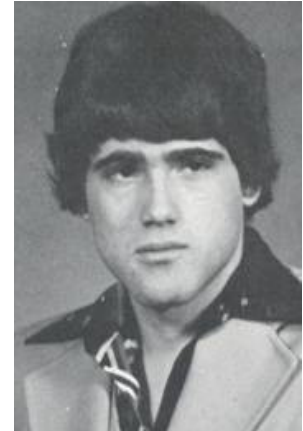

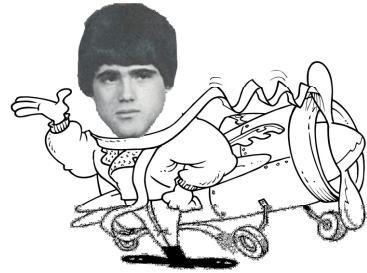


## WHEN MOM SAYS NO ASK PAPA

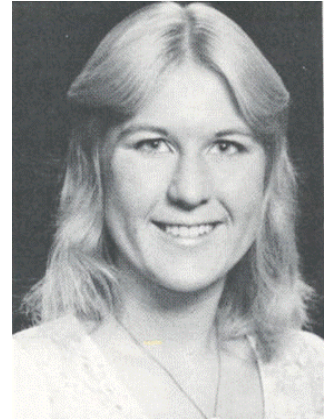
# DEBBIE RANDALL

Well, I had my 15 minutes of fame when the Pop Choir sang on the Joyce Livingston show, that was a big deal for all of us to be on TV.

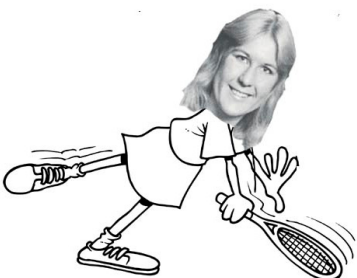
## GOTTA LOVE MY TRUCK

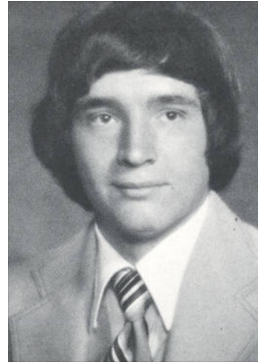
Most people are blown away that I have 10 children, but I always wanted a big family. I'm blessed to have found my husband who wanted that too.

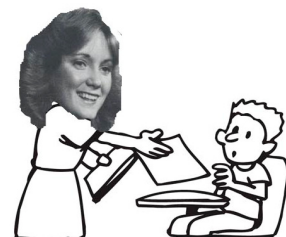
We like to spend time with family, and “new” granddaughter! We try to jet ski at the sand pit every summer. We like to travel and go to warm places in the winter.

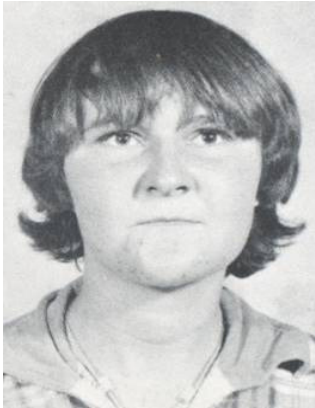

## SEASONS OF LIFE

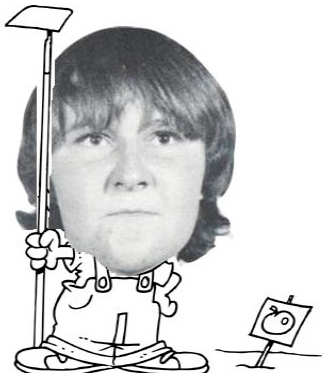
In the spring and summer, we garden and plant flowers in the fall and winter, we stay in. We enjoy each other's company.

## LIFE IS TOO SHORT

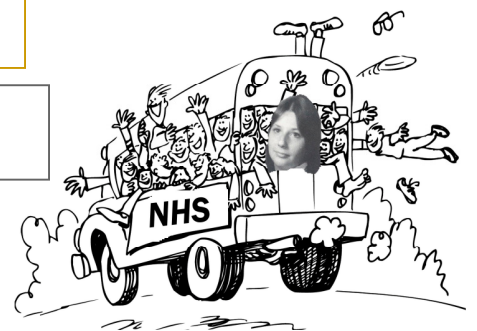

# JENNIFER OGLE FULTZ

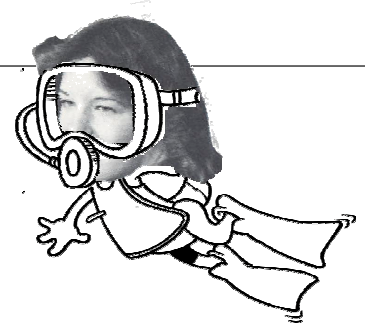

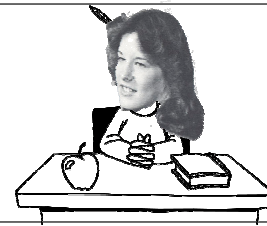
## GOOD TIMES

## WHERE WE'VE COME FROM

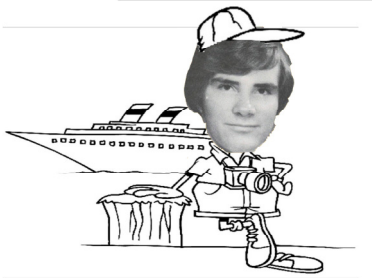
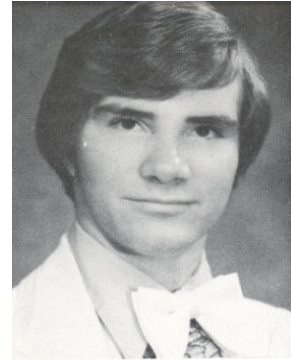
