#### Why Church?

On January 21, I had the distinct pleasure of meeting and leading my first class of new members at Community Presbyterian Church. Those faces that you saw up front on January 28 as they joined the church represent such amazing and diverse stories of how God has been at work in their lives for decades. I encourage you to make it a point to personally introduce yourself to our new members, and to go beyond that to get to know them, even inviting them out for lunch or coffee!

Before we even talked about membership or what it means to be Presbyterian, I began my class on January 21 talking about "Why church?" Leading our new members in this reflection was a good reminder for me how God uses an imperfect local gathering of believers to change lives and to change the world. I came up with three biblical reasons of "Why church?" that I wanted to share with all of us:

- 1. God has called the people of the church to be a blessing to all other people, all nations, and all families of the earth. (Genesis 12:1-3)
- 2. The church exists to be united in revealing Jesus Christ and God's redeeming love to the world. (John 17:20-23)
- 3. The church exists as a place to cultivate generosity and reconciliation, to share meals together and to worship, so that we may all have glad and generous hearts, and, again, to be a blessing to the people around us. (Acts 2:44-47)

I want to celebrate, with gratitude, the fact that our life together as a church includes all these purposes right now. At the same time, I encourage you to read these scripture passages and think of them as inspirational, representing the direction in which we ought to grow. Will you join me in prayer for us as a church, that we may be a blessing to the town of Redmond, that we may reveal Jesus Christ and God's love to the world, and that we may bring glory to God in all that we do.

# Mt.Angel Lenten Prayer Retreat


