Walking with Jesus through Lent

Lent is the season of 40 days plus Sundays leading up to Easter. The number 40 in the Bible is symbolic of cleansing and renewal (Noah's Ark), of a journey toward freedom (the Exodus), and spiritual preparation and fasting (Jesus precedes his earthly ministry with 40 days of fasting in the wilderness). Even though Ash Wednesday began Lent on February 14, it's never too late to step into a season of spiritual focus. So, how will you allow God to be at work cleansing and renewing your life from the inside out? Will you carve out time and space to listen for how God's spirit is leading you on a journey toward freedom? Will you fast and pray together with this church community as we journey with Jesus towards the cross and the empty grave?

At the Ash Wednesday service we reflected on the metaphor Paul writes of in 2 Corinthians 4, "We have this treasure in jars of clay." One of the central mysteries of Christianity is that God has chosen to take up residence within our humble and flawed lives. The beginning of the story of humanity, according to Genesis 2, is that God formed us out of dirt and dust and then breathed life into us. Lent is a season in which we come to terms with our humble origins and the humble destiny of our mortal bodies. "From dust you have come, to dust you will return," I whispered to each person in the congregation as I smudged a cross on their forehead in ashes.

The point of Lent, though, is not simply the humble emptying of ourselves and the reminders of our mortality. In Lent, we choose to fast or adopt a spiritual practice for the sake of creating more time and space in our lives so that we will connect with the very breath of God, the Spirit, that has been breathed into us. After I said those words about dust, I looked into the eyes of each person in front of me and said, "...and you are loved by Christ." This is good news for us. When we recognize our own mortality and sinfulness, when we clear some space in our lives, we make room to receive God's gift of unconditional love for us.

This Lent, as we walk with Jesus towards that harsh cross and the gloriously empty grave, I pray that you will know the love of God for you. Take time to clear away some of the other stuff that fills you up to make more room for God's love. After all, we have a treasure in these clay jars.

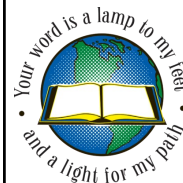

Why Per Capita?

As Presbyterians we are connected to each other as a family of God at CPC. But our connectedness stretches far beyond our own congregation to other Presbyterian congregations in our region (Presbytery and Synod), our country (General Assembly), and the world (think Kisauni, Kenya).

We support our connections to these organizational bodies by providing an annual giving called per capita, based on a certain amount for each of our members.

These “dues,” in turn, provide leadership and financing for many operations of the greater church. CPC has benefited in many areas from our connected church. Our pastor search was assisted by the online connections of Presbytery. Our Presbyter for Vision and Mission, Brian Heron, will be joining us in May to assist our elders in development and outreach. The Presbytery office has been extremely helpful as we developed guidelines and manuals for personnel, administration, and finance. Financially, CPC has been granted nearly \$50,000 in the past 10 years for roof repairs, ADA compliance (restroom remodels, automatic doors, etc), Wellness Team programs, and sanctuary technology improvements. These grants have come through both Synod and Presbytery. Additionally, some of our per capita is used to support our partner church in Warm Springs.

Our congregation’s share, or per capita, amounts this year to about \$10,940 and has been paid in full. The apportionment for each member amounts to \$32. Each year, our tradition has been to ask each member to add this amount to their regular giving whenever possible, to enable the continued work of the greater church. This ensures that more of our regular giving may be used for serving our local mission efforts. Please prayerfully consider the value of our per capita apportionment in your giving plans.

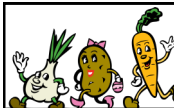
BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENINGS

Are you concerned that your Blood Pressure may be too elevated? **Free** Blood Pressure Screenings are available to all members and friends of our church on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month in the Wellness Office. For the month of March CPC nurses will be available to take your blood pressure from 9:00-10:00 a.m. Remember, high blood pressure is a silent killer. Be proactive and see your health care provider if you have any concerns.



HOSPITAL EQUIPMENT PROGRAM

HEALTHY COOKING CLASS

HEALTH TIP


Osteoporosis is a disease that weakens the bones to the point where they break easily. Most often bones in the hip, backbone (spine) and wrist are affected. Osteoporosis is called the "silent disease" because you may not notice any changes until a bone breaks. All the while, though, your bones had been losing strength for many years.

Bone is living tissue. To keep bones strong, your body breaks down old bone and replaces it with new bone tissue. As people enter their 40s and 50s, more bone may be broken down than is replaced. A close look inside shows something like a honeycomb. When you have osteoporosis, the space in this honeycomb grows larger, and the bone that forms the honeycomb gets smaller. The outer shell of your bones also gets thinner. All of this makes your bones weaker.

The risk of osteoporosis grows as you get older. At the time of menopause, women may lose bone quickly for several years. After that the loss slows down, but continues. In men the loss of bone mass is slower by age 65 or 70 men and women are losing bone at the same rate.

For some people the first sign of osteoporosis is to realize you are getting shorter or to break a bone easily. Treating osteoporosis means stopping the bone loss and rebuilding bone to prevent breaks. Diet and exercise can help make your bones stronger. Don't wait until that happens. Have a bone density test (DXA test). Talk to your doctor and see what to do to prevent weakened bones.
