The Light Shines in the Darkness

Happy Advent! Advent, the liturgical season leading up to Christmas, officially begins December 3 and I can't wait to celebrate together as a church. I love the season of Advent because it stretches the Christmas celebration out for four weeks in advance of Christmas Eve and Christmas Day itself. Advent is a season of waiting and expectation.

As we walk through this season, I want us to reflect on what we are waiting for. One of the motifs I have noticed in the scriptures we read throughout the season is the idea that in the birth of Christ, in the Incarnation, there is light that has broken into the darkness. "The people who have walked in darkness have seen a great light." (Isaiah 9:2a) "The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:5) How fitting that in December, when the days are shortest and the nights are darkest, we celebrate Advent by lighting candles, and on Christmas Eve we will all hold on to those lights in our candlelight services (5pm and 7pm on Dec 24).

Beyond the darkness of winter nights, though, we see so much darkness in our lives and our world. We are aware of our sinfulness and broken relationships. We are finishing a calendar year in which it has been impossible to keep up with the news cycles of mass killings throughout our country, refugee crises in various places around the world, political chaos at home and abroad. It is in the midst of this darkness that we hope and wait and pray this Advent. Let us place our hope in the God whose light always pushes back the darkness.

Finally, I want to say thank you for such a warm and enthusiastic welcome to this church community and to the town of Redmond. Holly and I are so happy to be here! We felt so loved starting our first Sunday, November 5. It was a real joy on Saturday, November 11, to share the celebration of my ordination as a Minister of Word and Sacrament and installation as the pastor of this church. Thanks for welcoming my friends and family who celebrated with us that weekend.

Presbyterian Meeting Highlights



On November 3-4, 2017, a total of 105 presbyters met in attendance at the First Presbyterian Church in Roseburg, Oregon. There were 59 ministers, 46 elders from 28 congregations. Brian Heron was installed as the Presbyter for Vision and Mission, the new name for the Presbytery Executive.

Of interest there was a Cross-Cultural Partnership Grant of \$30,000, a fund to encourage local churches to partner in a cross-cultural ministry. The Committee on Representation will develop goals and the process for this program.

The Presbytery sent a message to the General Assembly in two

Overtures. After debate, the following two items were approved as overtures to the General Assembly:

- I. Include language about the Administrative Personnel Association in the Book of Order.
- 2. On Responding to the Current Syrian Crisis.

For the Genesis Fellowship Church, Presbytery will make a goodwill gift of \$5,000 in support of and gratitude for their ministry and the Presbyterian Leadership Committee (PLC) will arrange to meet with them to listen to their story. (Presbytery sold this property on contract to the multiracial Fellowship in early 2008. Some believe that in light of our relationship and their unique ministry, presbytery should have been more generous than it was. Hopefully, by listening, the PLC will be able to know how our actions were understood, and what we could have done differently.)

On a personal note, Nancy and I were married in the initial Vernon Presbyterian Church and were part of the move to its new location and involved in the building of a new sanctuary and educational wing.

Andrew Hoeksema was introduced and examined by the members of Presbytery for an extensive 20-minute period of questioning on his Statement of Faith. He was excused from the assembly and there was more conversation when John Ailstock said Andrew was a good fit for the congregation. A vote was taken and he was approved unanimously to serve as pastor of Community Presbyterian Church of Redmond, Oregon!
