#### **Acts: The Next Adventure!**



By the time you are reading this, we will have preached in the book of Acts at least three times. It has been fun for me to share the pulpit a bit more this month and I pray it has been good for you to hear interpretations and words of encouragement from The Next Adventure voices other than my own. Hosting guest preachers is one way we honor and remember that the church includes lots of voices and callings – male and female, young

and old and so much more!

A few weeks in, I hope you are as enthusiastic about our study in the book of Acts as I am. Acts is full of exciting stories with more than enough drama and conflict. As we read Acts, we read about the first generation of the church as they were discovering how to live into previously unexplored and uncharted territory. The apostles are constantly surprised by how and when and where the Holy Spirit appears and where it leads them next.

In a matter of pages, the Holy Spirit fills and empowers the apostles, thousands profess faith and are baptized, miraculous healings begin, and then the gospel begins to go out to Gentile peoples and cities around the known world where it has never gone before. As you read along in coming months, allow yourself to get caught up in this adventure story! At the same time, let your theological imagination carry you into reflection about what all this means for us as Christians in 2018, as Community Presbyterian Church in this new season of life and ministry. To whom and to where and how is God leading us on our next adventure as a congregation.

When I preached on the Pentecost event in Acts 2, I highlighted five ways we can reflect on and learn from the birth of the first generation church 2000 years ago:

I-The Holy Spirit empowers us for the work in front of us.

2-Obstacles are overcome. May we put our trust in the God who overcomes.

3-Change is embraced. The disciples never saw this coming but they ran with it.

4-Everyone is included: sons and daughters, young and old, slaves and free.

5-From the wisdom of the past, a new future is imagined.

As I continue through my first year of being your pastor, I look at those five statements and see each one of them true for us today at CPC. May we pray and live into the truth of these statements.

#### <u>Trash Talk</u>



Our Food and Fellowship team has to deal with a lot of trash: packaging, tin cans, bottles, etc. Recently, we decided to update the trash and recycling system with new signs and methods of

sorting. We are sharing this information because a variety of groups use the kitchen, plus many in the congregation help with clean-up. High Country Disposal (HCD) has provided laminated signs which remind us of how to recycle. For instance, we thought plastic cookie, cake and produce containers could go into the blue recycling bin. Unfortunately, they cannot. In the kitchen we are now placing these into the large white trash can next to the blue bin. Read our signs or go to highcountrydisposal.com for details.

Behind the church, there are separate bins for cardboard, glass, commingled recycling and garbage. In the office and meeting rooms, there are receptacles for recyclables. There is a basket below the coat area in the narthex for used bulletins, and miscellaneous slips of paper. We can keep all recyclable paper out of trash baskets.

As our team leader, Sharon Lynch, says, "You know, we just like to help each other out around here." We are already trying to do our part for the environment, and improving our system will help our local community.
