Greater Cincinnati/Dayton WVU Alumni Chapter Scholarship

For the past 21 years the Cincinnati/Dayton WVU Alumni Chapter has provided at least one \$1000 per year scholarship to a local student who attends WVU. The scholarship is one of the ways our chapter gives back to our alma mater and to the local community. To date our chapter has given out over \$22,000 to help support local students. Our endowment provides approximately \$2000 each year in perpetuity for a deserving student in our area to attend WVU. This year we gave out three scholarships (two from the endowment and one funded primarily from annual chapter membership dues). Our goal is to continue to build our endowment so that additional scholarships can be offered. The current value of our endowment is over \$50,000. The near term goal to grow our endowment to \$75,000 so that we can offer an additional scholarship.

A Mountaineer Memory By Tyler-Blair Sheppard

From the beginning, being a Mountaineer has been a family affair for me. I grew up going to WVU football games. Long before I became a student, I had seen a lengthy list of home games of both the memorable and soul crushing variety; Penn State, both 1984 and '88, Miami '93, whatever that last minute against Virginia Tech was in '99; all before I stepped foot in a classroom, and in the same seats my family has had since Mountaineer Field opened. I don't imagine that I am unique in this – there are plenty of WVU fans out there, each with their own stories. The aspect of mine that is likely rarer is that I grew up in Canada, and even there, there is a WVU connection.

It was on a student-teacher exchange to Montreal the summer after her senior year at WVU that my mother met my father. They settled in Canada and Morgantown became the place where I got to see my grandparents. Being a little more that halfway to southern WV, and my grandmother being a passionate football fan and alum herself, it was somewhat natural that football would become the driver for a schedule and excuse to make the trip. I was fortunate to see a lot of my American grandparents, but the frequency was notably higher in the fall.

So it is difficult to settle on a favorite moment or event – WVU has been ever present in my life. What stands out as a thread is the impact the school has had upon my life, the opportunities that it provided, and that shaped who I am today. From a being able to go on a 4-month research exchange to China during my junior year, to being on the microgravity research team and flying on a NASA sponsored microgravity flight from the Shuttle Landing Facility at Kennedy Space Center, to extending a never-going-anywhere-but-fun-while-it-lasted hockey career for just a few years more on the club team, WVU was a place where I was able to expand my horizons and where interesting opportunities were always around the corner. At many other schools, I suspect those opportunities would not have all been available for a single student, but for me they led to my first job out of school at Johnson Space Center, and to some lifelong friends.
