Vermonters have strong ideas about the importance of their mountain topography. The story begins with the state's founders and moves forward through Vermont history to explain how

environmental understandings changed over time. This lecture by historian Jill Mudgett is timely and relevant and offers us tools to understand the origins and meaning of our own strongly-held attachments to the Vermont landscape. This talk is free, open to the public, and accessible to those with disabilities. "The Hills of Home" is a Vermont Humanities Council program hosted by SAHS.

Park Street School opened April 12, 1895.

Here is some information from books about the "new Park Street School building":

M. Eva Baker; Folklore of Springfield VT, 1922: p.114 The High School Building

There was "a pressing need of a new school building" and "a dramatic crisis finally occurred when the Parks mansion burned to the ground and the lot on which it stood was thus made available to the town for purchase." "The town voted in 1891 to have a new school building." The building was completed and occupied in the winter of 1895-6 and the class of 1896 was the first to graduate from it with Herman Dressel as principal and Frances Pierce as assistant. 18 members graduated.

"A dedication ceremony was held for the new school building on Jan. 3, 1896. The building had cost \$55,300, including \$5300 for the lots on which it was sited. At the dedication, Adna Brown said, in part, "Some of our townspeople think we have too much room. Let us bring up our town to our school building... (the building) should have been built 20 years ago. It is always wise to keep ahead of the times"
