

It's early in the morning on the first day of the week. The women who saw Jesus die had those spices in their possession since late Friday afternoon. For two nights and a whole day they had lived with the pungent aroma of those burial spices. Now finally they could complete their act of love cut short by sunset and Sabbath.

All of us follow down that trail to the tomb, their grief resonating in our hearts broken again and again with life's losses. We round the bend and hear the announcement, "He is not here! He is risen!"

So what happened to those spices? Costly as they were, the women certainly carried them away as they ran to tell the news or returned later to fetch them. And there no doubt would be need for those spices down the road. But never again would they use those spices without seeing beyond them a stone rolled away and a tomb empty.

That's where we live as well, between the spices and the empty tomb, between our losses and the promise of resurrection, between our crossroads and a journey's end secured in Jesus Christ.


