Pastor and author, John Ed Mathison writes the following;

"I once read a story about a lady who went to work at a large mill where her job was to sew. On her first day, the foreman said, "the most important thing you need to know is this; If your threads get tangled, call me and I'll fix them." He then pointed to a sign on the wall. There, right in front of her was a reminder: "If your threads get tangled, call the foreman."

The lady sat down and began to sew. Eventually, her threads start to tangle. She thought, I won't bother the forman; he's too busy. I'll do it myslef. She tried to untangle the threads, but they just became more and more tangled. Before long, she really had a mess on her hands. The foreman came by and said, "You didn't do what your were told, did you?' She replied, "No, I wanted to do it myself." Then she added "I want you to know that I did the best that I could." The foremna responded, "No, you didn't. If you had done the best that you could, you would have called me."
