Not one of my children looked her in the eye or even said thank you...not to her...not to me. So I waited. I counted to ten in my head and the server just looked at me (probably because she thought I was hearing voices). I watched as my children strolled out the door. I followed them outside where I calmly collected their ice cream treats and my children watched in horror as I deposited them into the nearby trash can. I explained that one day, if they were lucky they would work a job like that young lady and I would hope that people would look at them and actually see them, I mean really see them, respect them and thank them. Even young children are not too young to learn that as we move throughout our days it is important to exercise our manners, exhibit basic human decency and express gratitude. So today, I am the meanest mom in the world."

Life lessons are tough...it's easy to take a complacent position when we see someone being mistreated. But Jesus calls us to take a more complicated route. Following Christ can turn our lives inside out and upside down. Through the Sermon on the Mount we are challenged to see that the way of the cross is a path we must travel as his followers despite life's many ironies, such as in order to gain our lives, we must lose ourselves...after all, it's really not about us anyway. 


