Schools Established

From the first, people were interested in schools and in August, 1912, what is now knoown as the Jenkins Independent School System was organized at Jenkins. At the same time, one was organized in McRoberts.

Thhee Jenkins Independent School District was first organized as Jenkins Graded School District on August 15, 1212. At that time there were 490 children in the district, and the district was coomposed of three subdivisions; Burdine, Jenkins, and Dunham. McRoberts did not become a part of Jenkinns District until April 26, 1915.

In 1936, the McRoberts lower school had four new rooms added to accommodate the population growth. The building boom ended by the company in 1935.

ORAL INTERVIEW WITH ELIZABETH ALLEN-LONG CARDWELL


Mrs. Long-Cardwell is the oldest eye witness student/ educator from Letcher County Kentucky colored school system.

The school was organized approximately in 1934 in Dunham. The school was held in the company church. Mrs. Long attended school in McRoberts from grades 1-7. The school system did not offer high school to the colored students, therefore she could not obtain a higher education in the McRoberts – Jenkins area.

Her father sent her to Kentucky State Industrial College to attend high school. After completing high school at Kentucky State, Mrs. Long-Cardwell attended college there and graduated as an Elementary School teacher. She came back to Jenkins and began to teach.


Dunham High was established in Jenkins No. 4 Hollow. There was an elementary school existing. Mr. Parks, was instrumental in getting the elementary school enlarged and two rooms added up and down to establish what was known as Dunham High School.





Edward Osley of the Blue Devils receives the ball while No. 24 on the Benham team tries to block it. The Blue Devils beat Benham by a score of 63-59.





No. 3, Curtis Crenshaw, and No. 8, Edward Oden, score for the Blue Devils.

He says he is anxious to serve the college as the President of the Student Council. When asked how he felt after the election he said, "A dream come true."



LaVerta Davis To Speak At State Speech Festival


