I am truly humbled to be the recipient of the Point Grey Class of '75 Citizenship Award in Point Grey's graduating class of 2017. The five years I had at Point Grey Secondary have been nothing short of life changing, giving me multiple chances to flourish in areas that I am passionate about and fail in areas that I needed a wake up call. This award really means a lot to me.

One story that my mom shares about me to everyone is how when I was two years old, I trekked my way up to the top of our home's staircase without aid. Upon arrival at the top, I clapped in triumph as the feat was indeed difficult for my little frame. As I stood and clapped in celebration, my mother watched as I began tilting backwards. I tumbled down the steps all the way to the bottom, where I lay dazed and miraculously without any serious injury. I learned a very hard lesson that day, I should be more aware of my surroundings before claiming victory. However, I would only continue to learn by suffering loss first, and that sums up a majority of the events that made me who I am today.

The biggest event that made me who I am is one that not every 14 year old kid would ever think of having. The learning journey only seems to be getting better, but I do hope that it does not involve serious health implications anymore.

I am currently studying a combined major program in Business and Computer Science at UBC's Sauder School of Business. Having been in the program for only less than a year now, I am already in love with the material and the community it brings. I aspire to work for at least one of the "Big Four of Technology": Google, Facebook, Amazon, and Apple. This award only motivates me to achieve more in the opportunities that I am given and I will continue to achieve my goals, no matter the obstacles.
