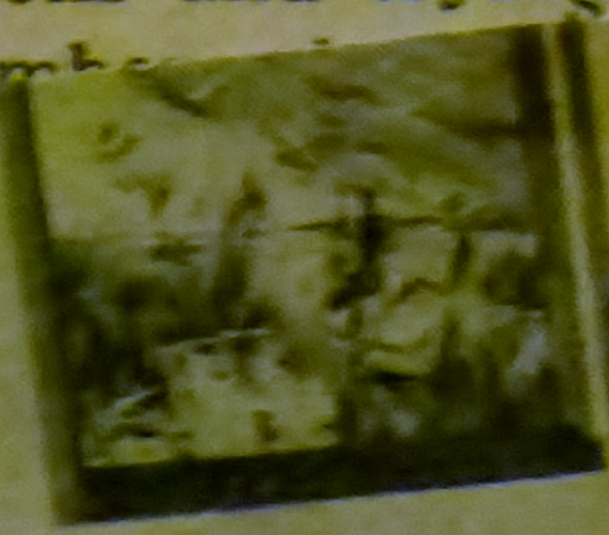
Aside from their main job of answering questions and trying to out-guess the number on the bonus questions, the Kwiz Kids find time to cheer themselves up.
