

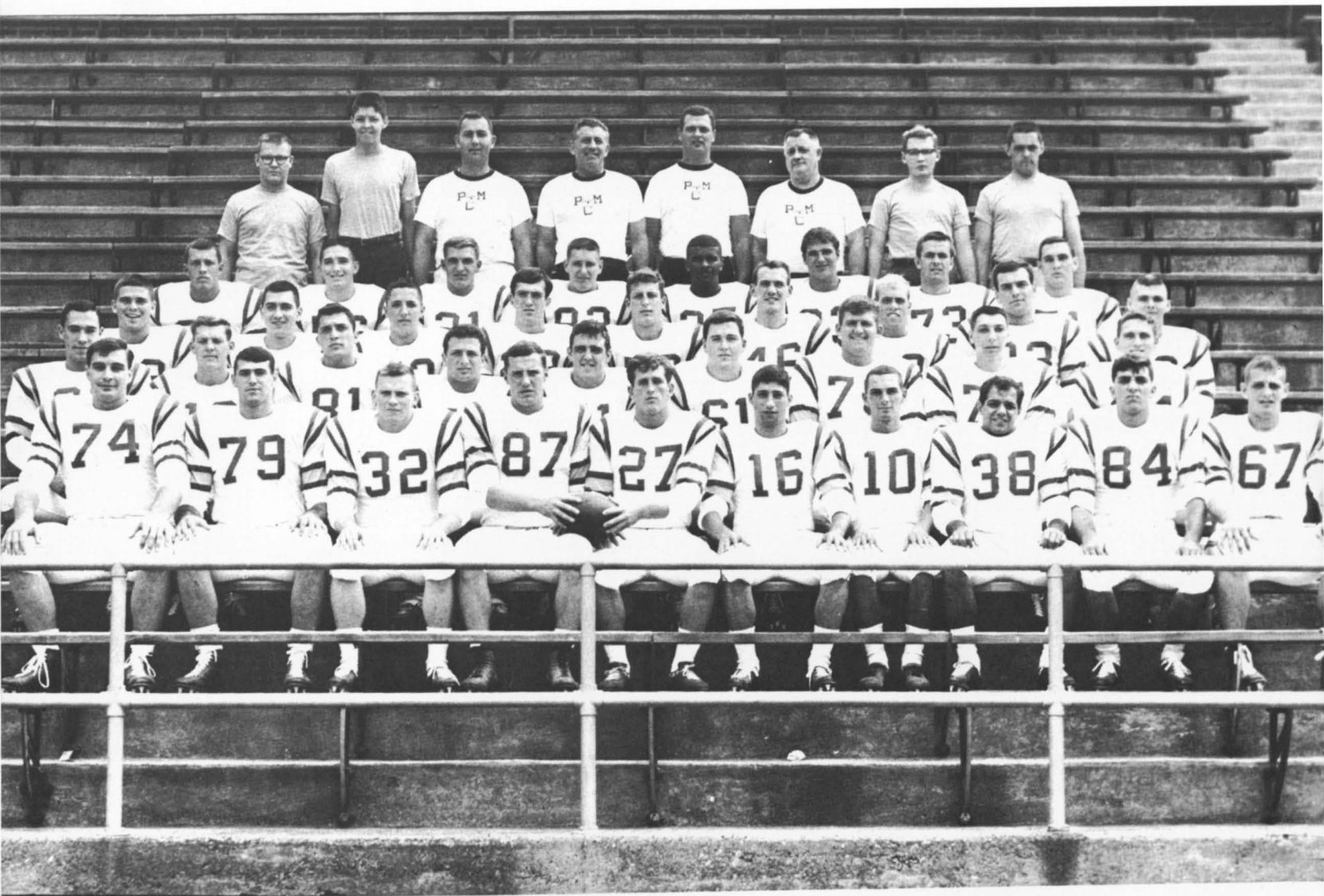

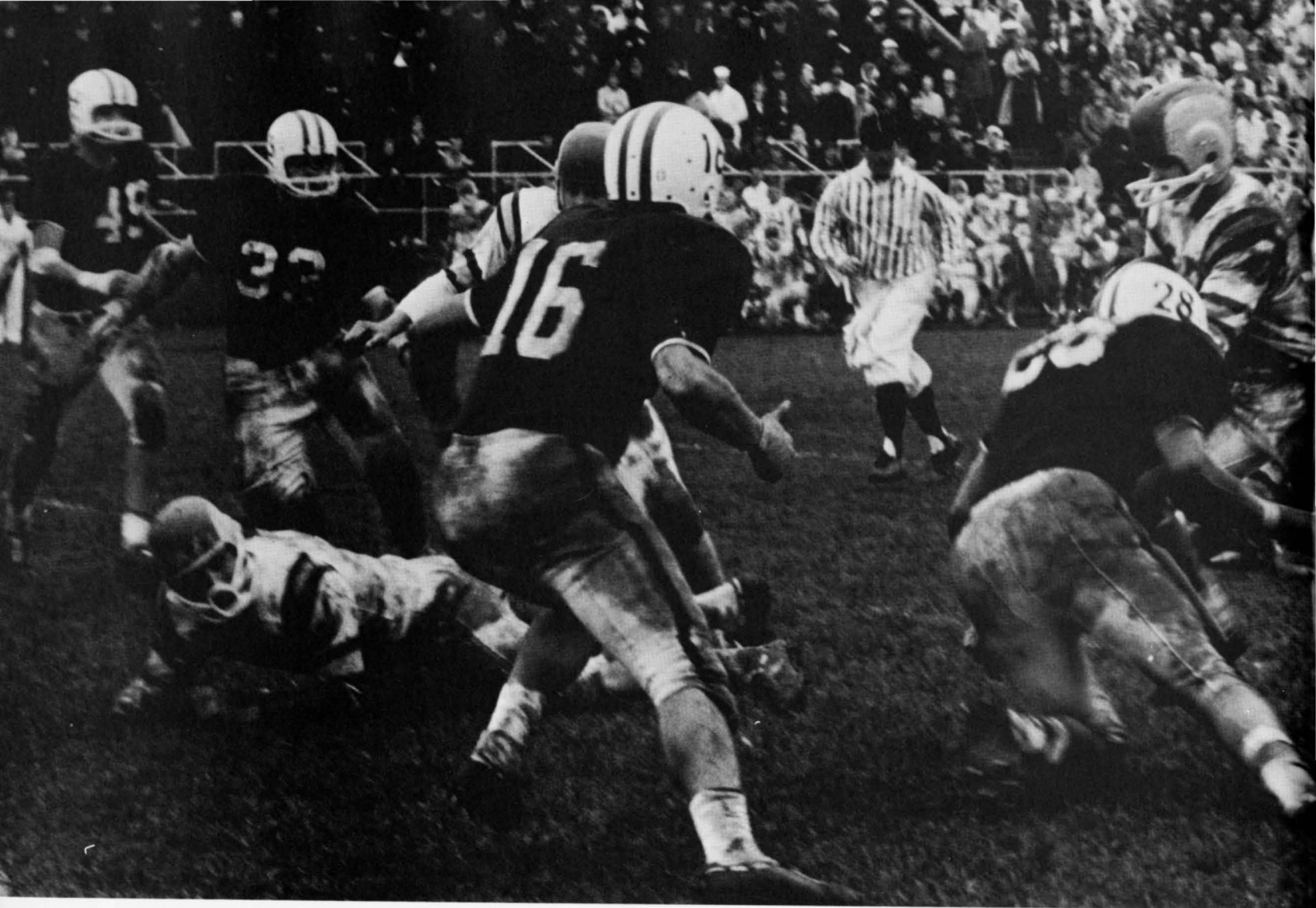

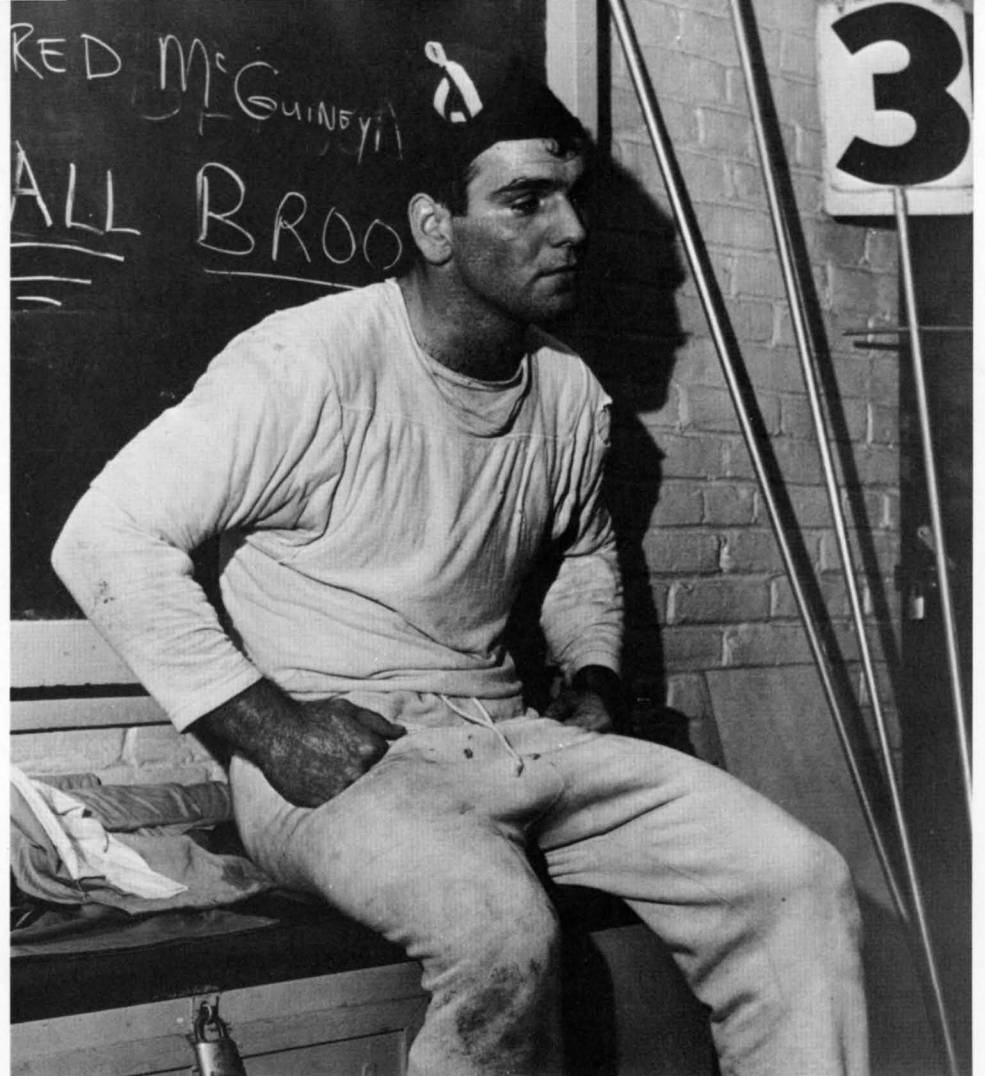

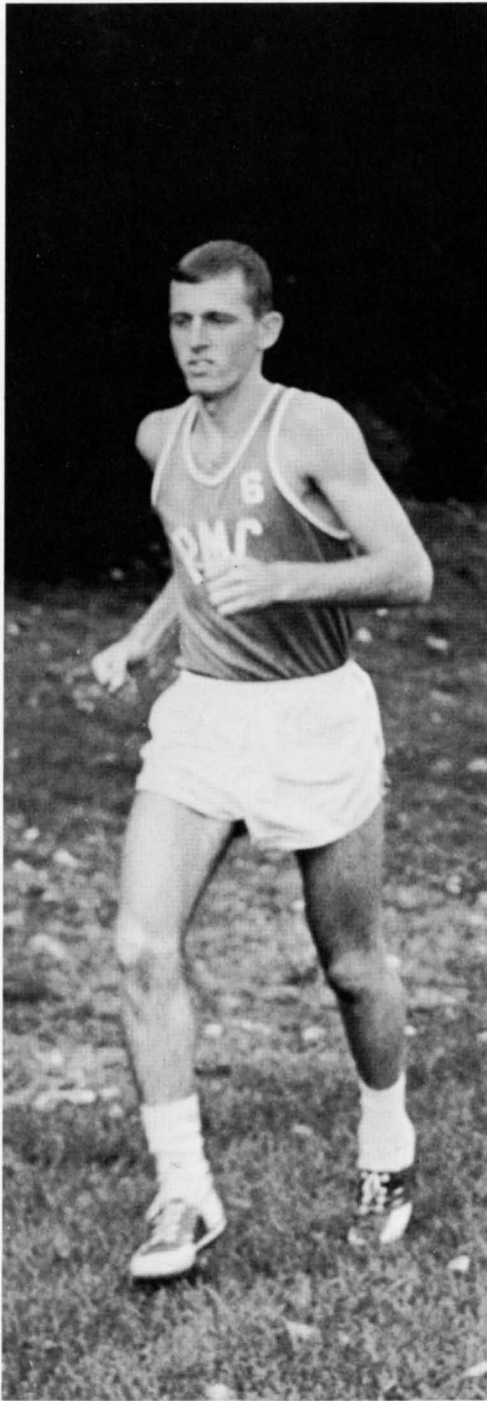

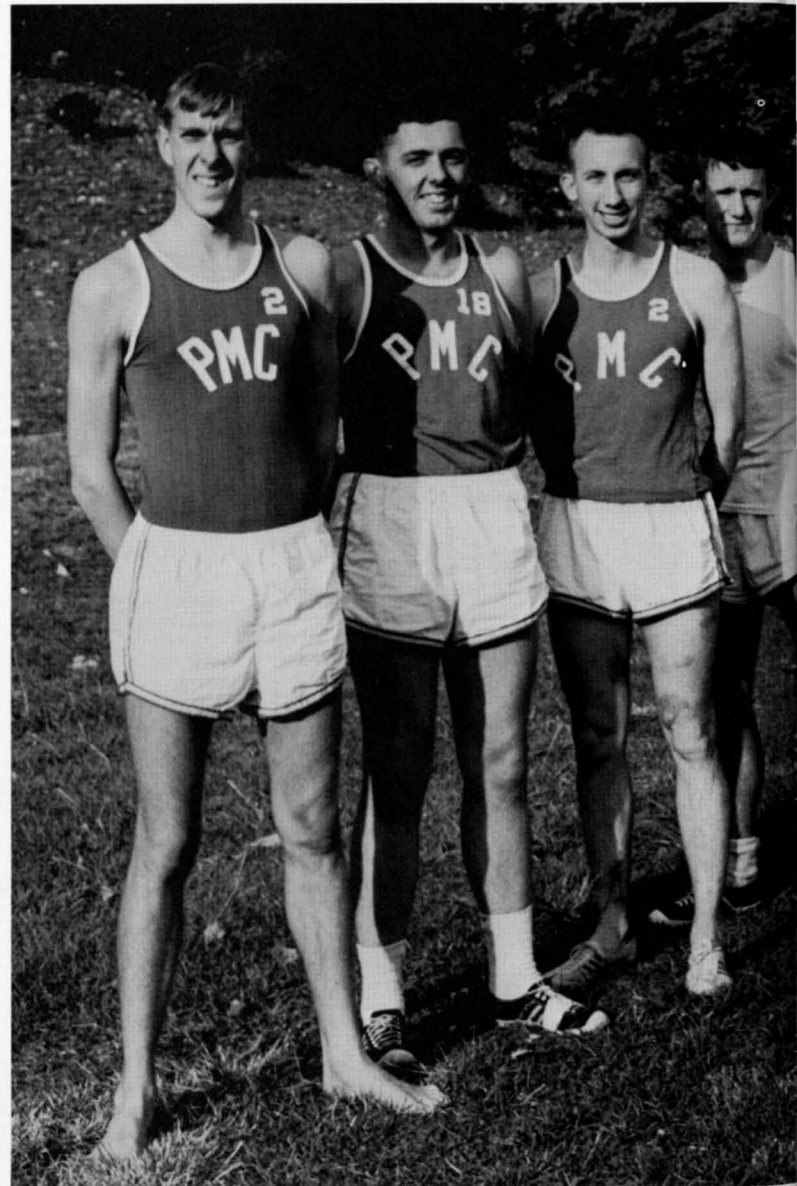

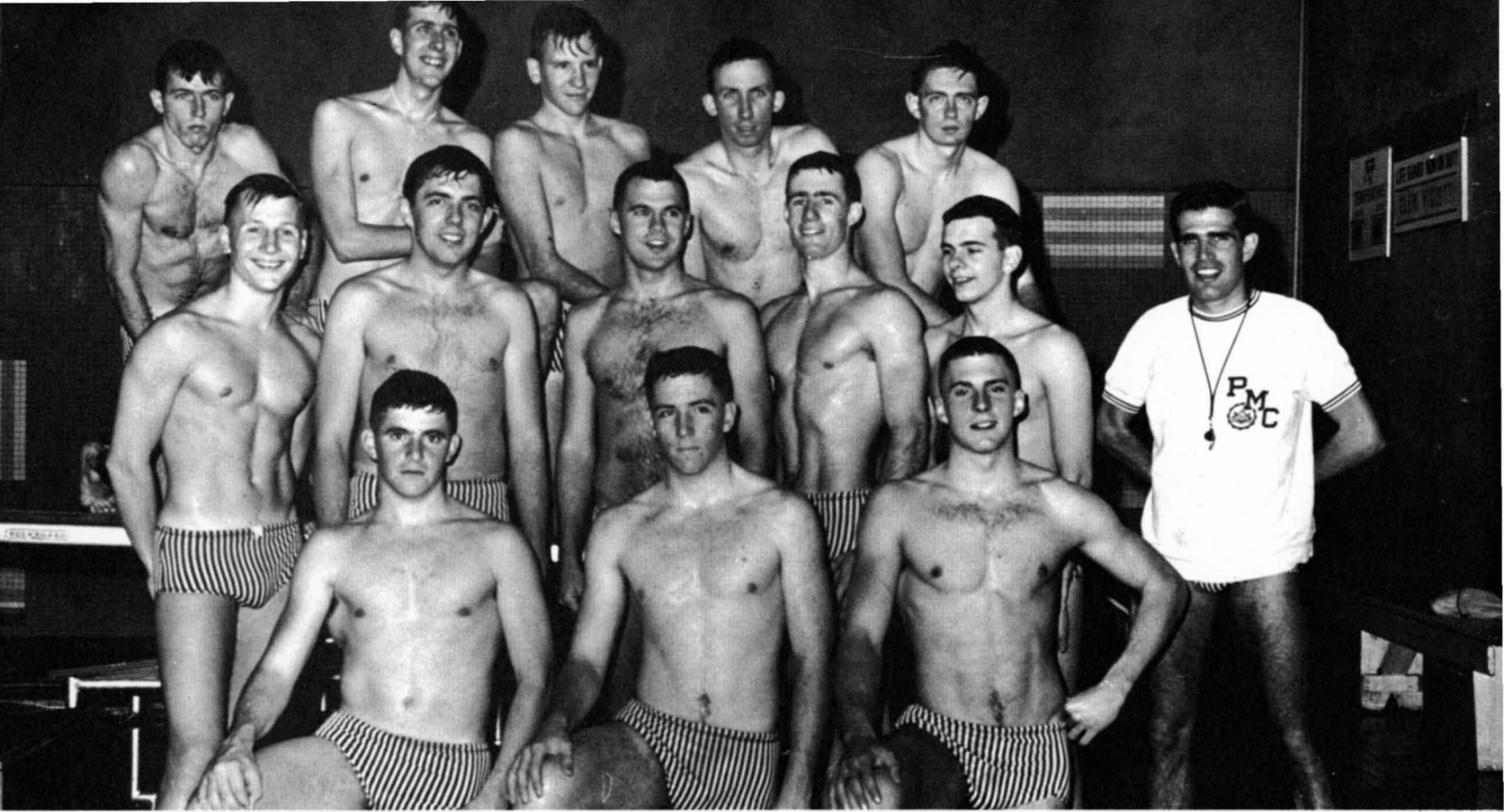




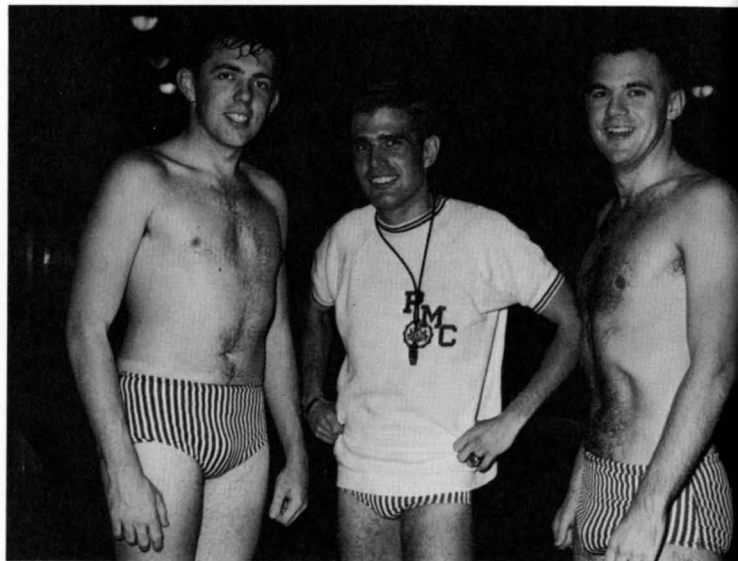






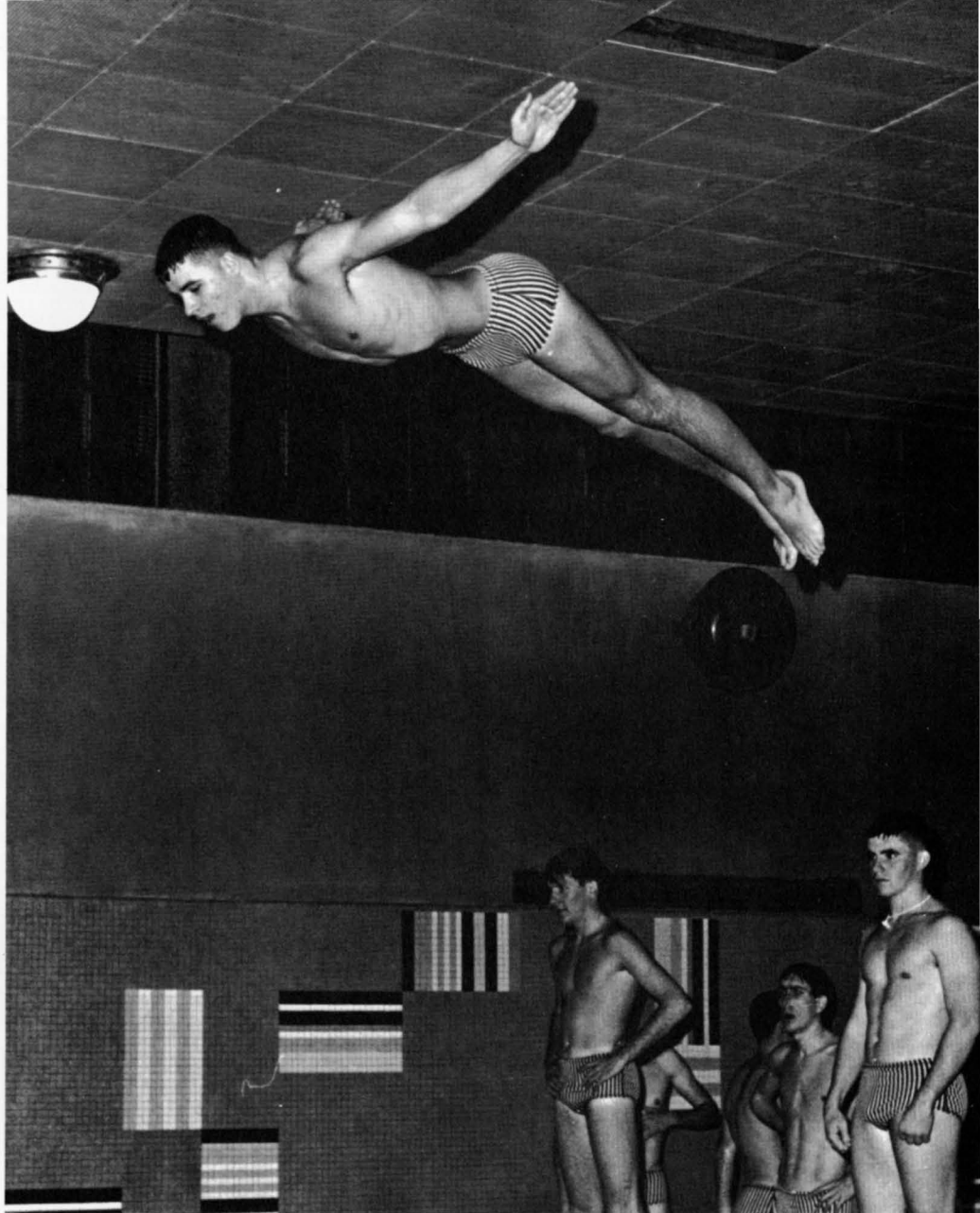


## SWIMMING TEAM

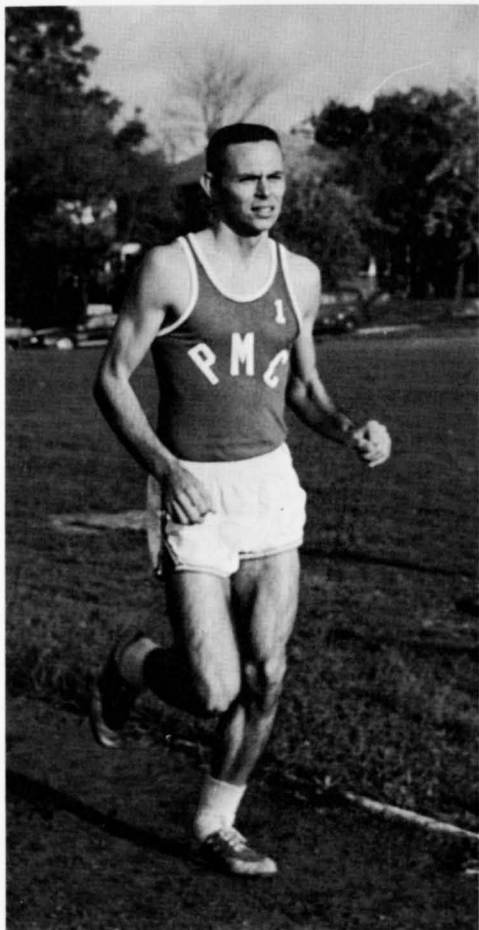


## THE 1964 TRACK TEAM

The team opened the season with three victories. In the Penn Relays, John McTaggart set a new college record for the javelin, 209 ft. 1½ in., to win a first place for PMC, the first that the College has ever recorded in the relays. Besides McTaggart's record in the javelin, Robert Schlosbon established a new standard in the 220 yard dash of 21.9. Also, the mile relay team of Joyce, Evans, Kormanicki and Schlosbon ran a 3:26.4 for a new record.

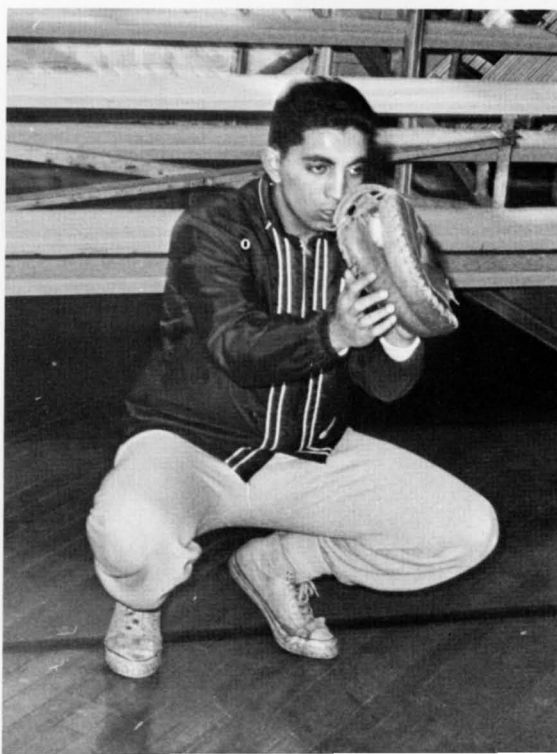
