Summer Spirituality


Summer is here and I have loved every warm day we have had so far this year in Central Oregon. We are out hiking every weekend. I am riding my bike from home to the church and all over town for meetings. I am sharing coffee and lunches with you all while sitting outside. What could be better?!

As the days are at the longest and the warmest, I want to suggest to us as a church that we have an opportunity to step into a different season of spiritual rhythm. Often, I hear people say they wish life would actually slow down a bit in the summer months, but somehow this season just flies by everywhere. This year, I invite you to make a choice to step into a season of Summer Spirituality. Here a few ideas for what that could look like in your daily life:

- * The sun is out early and it is warm on your back porch. Take your coffee outside and set aside an extra 20 or 30 minutes in your morning to sit quietly with God. Start your day with a Psalm, some silent prayer, or journaling a conversation with God.
- * Many of us are taking vacation with family or friends. Don't pack every day of a vacation with activity. Allow for times that are totally unstructured to enjoy the people you are with. At the end of a relaxing day together, make sure to tell them how thankful you are for their place in your life. Family and friends are life's greatest gifts from God!
- * Whether you are traveling extensively or staying close to home, summer is a great time to read and learn something new. Take time to consider how God might be leading you to grow or learn and choose a book that strengthens your connection with God or equips you for a new area of service to the church or the community.
- * While the sun rises early in this season, it also sets late. Take time to go outside and just stare and enjoy the sunset in the evening, the orange and pink clouds over the Three Sisters. Review your day with God. Where did you experience God present and leading? What in your day felt like a turning to or a turning away from God. Finish each day with this old spiritual practice of *Examen*, with gratitude and confession as the day comes to a close. A beautiful sunset is a perfect reminder of God's constant grace in our lives.

My prayer for us as a church is that we would all be journeying each day together in communion with the living God revealed in Jesus Christ. This can happen in every season. This is an invitation to choose to take steps deeper into that life this summer.



Congregational meeting on July 15 for the purpose of:

I-Approving a change to our By-Laws Required Number of Elders;

Article IIThere shall be a Session consisting of the pastor(s) and eighteen elders a sufficient number of elders for the leadership needs of the church, divided into three equal representative classes. No elder shall be elected to the Session for a term of more than three years, nor shall an elder serve on the Session for consecutive terms, either full or partial, aggregating more than six years. An elder having been elected to the Session for consecutive terms aggregating six years shall be ineligible to serve thereon for a further term until at least one year has elapsed from the expiration of the last term for which that person was elected.
