Chaney Registers 12-0 Triumph over Ursuline

Intercept Two Passes For TDs

Chaney High avenged last year's 6-0 loss to Ursuline by defeating the Irish, 12-0, last night at Rayen Stadium. An overflow crowd of 13,500 witnessed the City Series inaugural for both schools.

Leading 6-0, the West Side Cowboys added their final touchdown in the final four seconds. Herry Ferrando grabbed Dorris' aerial and traveled 28 yards for the TD.

Chaney scored both touchdowns on intercepted passes.

gard's attempted run for the bonus points failed.

Boardman Duels Memorial In Steel Valley Headliner


They start dropping the City Series bombs this week and with double-barreled action both tonight and tomorrow.



 A companion feature at South High Field pits "Sonny" Friend's Warriors against Cardinal Mooney, the 1962-63 champ with ambitions of returning to the pedestal this fall. This game will also have its followers, although in more modest figures, perhaps 5,000.
