Not sure if Olney has May Day Parades currently. But I do know they were unplugged in 1978 when I was an ERHS senior, meaning the 1977 May Day Parade was the end of the line...unless these annual celebrations have been restored.

And I hope Olney has restored them. No doubt about it: When I was a lad, those May Day celebrations were the highlight of my school year along with the school carnivals with their cake walks, dunking booth, and all.

I remember how I longed to carry my grade's banner in the parade. But since I was one of the shorter kids, I never got that big honor. Also, I remember after the parade down Main Street, we'd return to school and have Prairie Farm ice cream cups with those little wooden spoons, at least that's what we did at Central.

Oh my, I'll agree with you, what an exciting day May Day was in our town, I think for the town's people, the parents and grandparents and above all, the children that marched in these parades throughout all the years. I would like to know what year the Olney May Day Parades Started and ended? Wonder how we could find out? It was so

exciting to "march" so we called it in the parades when we were small, and prepare our room's theme for the parade each year....and the excitement of the hurrying of last minute details that needed attention! In a child's mind and eyes this was really a big event!! I do remember a few of the themes of my rooms at Central School, a very few I might add at that, one being Pets Day. I wrote about this in one of the past Olney Memories in detail. Each student could bring their pet to school that afternoon and take it with them in the parade. I'll condense this for the second round, but my dad made a crate to put on my wagon and I brought my little pet lamb Orphan Annie, and I pulled her in my little red wagon. You can bet I was the proudest person, "I thought so anyway" in the parade that year. I believe that was 4th or 5th grade. Not even sure of Later on I went on to march in the Jr. High Band under the direction of that anymore. Fred Norenberg. Two more years after that, I advanced to the High School Marching Band under Gus Sliva. We ALL Marched our Way through school on May 1st every Maybe this will jar some more special memories you folks have when you yourselves marched in the May Day Parades. ......This is in front of Central School.... JAnn




There is another one posted in another issue nearly like this but thought some of you might want to blow this up and see if you are in it! This one is a better view.

....... Notice the Illinois Central RR Tracks running north and south which are unused to this day, and if I'm correct that are totally removed now! When I was a kid and even in older times way before me, these were used on a daily basis and more.......I know my Grandma would come from Parkersburg to the big town of Olney on the Illinois Central Train for the Day and do shopping. Yes, they had passenger trains too back in those early days. I don't think Grandma came every week, I think my mother said it was more like a monthly trip, for this was a very big trip back then, and usually she shopped for groceries, and patronize many other stores along main street while she was there, it was what we might call an all day affair, when she would board the train again and return back to Parkersburg. Olney was a bombing town back in the early 1900's and I think we all have seen pictures of the solid store fronts up and down Main and I'm not sure but maybe the streets were still dirt, would have to research that to be sure.
