Alabama schools by three years of state education budget proration. This has made for tighter budgets and harder decisions on where money should go.

"The financial situation is the most daunting issue on the horizon," she said. "We've been fortunate to weather it as well as we have. Of course, that's been due to the financial management the system has had, and the fact that there's a consensus about cost issues. But it looks to be the dominant issue for years to come."

Menendez said she has

been very pleased with the direction of the system under Superintendent Dicky Barlow, who is entering his second year. Menendez was part of the board that chose Barlow.
