Alumni Profile - George Raad '69

In George Raad's life, every day is Christmas. He keeps a Christmas tree, a Green Bay Packers tree (his favorite NFL team), up in his home year round to remind him that today, like every day it's Christmas. He's lost some friends from the past, so that's why he lives each day like it's his last day.

George Raad is a man who is truly blessed. A loving wife, Linda, of 40 years, two successful sons, Chris and Greg, and just days before our interview, a second grandson, as well as a successful family business that is over 50 years old. One of the first things about George you will find out is his love for his Alma Mater and his former classmates at Dieruff High School...the Class of 1969

"I grew up in the 6th Ward", George begins, "around the Neuweiler Brewery and Egypt Star Bakery. The 6th Ward was the best place to live and the greatest experience for any young person to have. There were working class heroes there and we were taught to work hard and respect others," George continues, "We didn't have a lot of money, but that value of working hard taught us a lot and that stuck with all of us."

George's pipeline to Dieruff was through Sheridan Elementary and then Harrison-Morton Junior High. "I liked school and I liked all the teachers, but I didn't excel in the classroom. Gym was my favorite class. I should have hit the books harder, but I didn't...but I do take responsibility for what I didn't do."

But as underachieving as George may feel his academic side may have been, there were two places he excelled...on the sports field and in the social setting with his classmates. "I was voted class president for my junior year and then the next year, I didn't know I was nominated for senior class president. There were some sharp cookies running for president – real sharp cookies, but the day of the assembly came for the seniors and I was asked to give a speech. It was a quick one, about 40 seconds long and

believe it or not, I won. It's funny, but I always wondered what my classmates were thinking by not only electing me president once, but *twice!*"

George was on the football and baseball teams and got his varsity letter in baseball, where he played centerfield. He played as an outside linebacker and running back on the football team, and his dream was to play football at East Stroudsburg University for the great coach Charlie Reese. "I spoke with Charlie for three hours about wanting to play for him and I thought it was a 'done deal', but my grades were only ok at community college - a C+ average. I didn't apply myself in school, and then I received a letter that has stayed with me all my life. It was from the admissions office at East Stroudsburg. In essence, in one of the several paragraphs, was the line: We're sorry, but we are accepting those students we feel that would benefit from a college education. What prompted that letter were my grades from community college."

So in 1971, George Raad went to work. He was a knitting mill supervisor for Allison Manufacturing on Auburn Street for nine years, and on the side he worked with his father's business as a real estate agent. "My father worked for a top realtor, Earl Kester for five years. When my father became a broker, he opened our office in 1963". In 1972, George obtained his real estate license, "I didn't know anything about real estate, and I wasn't looking to get into real estate at all," George remembers with a big grin, "mainly because I saw how difficult it was. Sometimes you have to wait three months to get paid."

In 1979, George left Allison Manufacturing to go into real estate full time, "We plugged along and the business grew. I've been in real estate for 44 years and it's never been a job to me, it's been a passion. We strive for that personal service. We work very, very hard to make sure our name...my dad's name is *always* in lights". In the past, George has been the president of the Greater Lehigh Valley Association of Real-



tors, a position that his son Chris now occupies. "I get great joy selling a \$30,000 home as much as a \$300,000 one. The smile on someone's face when you've done your job right is priceless."

To this day, George is still the president of the DHS Class of 1969 and his classmates meet at a regular basis. "Diane Fritz and Karen Kocsis are my right arm, as is Peggy Yanger. I couldn't do things without them. When I call the ladies, they take it from there. They contact the chain and everyone is there for that next meeting. One thing is for sure, we have a good time when we're together", explains George, "I get the credit, but it is the whole group that pulls it together and they always do a great job. That's why after nearly 50 years of reunions, we still look forward seeing to each other".

In addition to working in real estate, George has been a coach and mentor to younger people for over 40 years, coaching at the Downtown Youth Center and later at the Mountainville Memorial. At one point he even coached current Dieruff head football coach Kyle Beller, "Through coaching you teach that no matter how many mistakes a player makes, they're going to rebound and what they do after that mistake is important. I tell kids, *life is all one big mistake and there are only solutions to it*".







Fire Safety Tips for the Fall and Winter Season

No matter what type of device you use to heat your home, making sure your heating devices and/or systems are in good working order is an important part of learning some fall fire safety tips.

Gas and Oil Heating System Safety Tips

- Get your oil furnace cleaned, inspected and serviced by a certified HVAC (heating, venting and air conditioning) contractor every year before using it.
- Gas heating units need to be cleaned, inspected and serviced by a certified HVAC contractor every two years.
- If you have any fossil fuel (oil/gas/wood/coal) burning furnace, make sure that you have a sufficient quantity of fully functioning carbon monoxide detectors installed in your home.

Space Heater Safety Tips

- Make sure that any space heaters are surrounded by at least three feet of empty space.
- Never place clothing or any other objects on a space heater to dry.
- Do not place space heaters near furniture or drapery.
- Turn space heaters off when you leave the house or go to bed.
- Avoid storing any combustible items near heaters.

Fireplace Safety Tips

- Get your chimney inspected each year to make sure that it is safe.
- Hire a chimney sweep to clean out your chimney every fall.
- Repair any cracks in fireplaces.
- Use fireplace screens to keep sparks and fire debris inside the fireplace.
- Never use gasoline to start a fire in the fireplace.
- Never leave a fire unattended.
- Make sure that combustible materials are not stored within three feet of your fireplace.
- For natural gas fireplaces, get all connections and lines inspected before use each season.
- Remember that outdoor fireplaces can be just as dangerous as indoor units; observe all safety precautions when using them.
