


Alumni Profile: Mr. Roy Arlotto, Dieruff Faculty Emeritus

Official Husky Scorekeeper, Unofficial LED Historian Joanne Ogrydziak '76

Dick Schmidt. Linda Repp Cruttenden. Skip Kintz. Ross Moore. Foo Belfield. Patti Sikorski Heffner. Anthony Ross. The names of these LED legends have echoed through decades of Dieruff's rich basketball legacy. Another name, however, stands out above all others as the one Husky who has been on the scene for more years than the others combined. Roy Arlotto, whose loval presence alongside the Husky hardwood is as familiar to fans as the "Cheer, Cheer, Cheer" of our beloved Fight Song, marked his impressive 50th consecutive year this season as the official scorekeeper and statistician for Dieruff Boys Basketball.

Eager to learn more about his experiences within the hallowed halls of Husky High, I recently had the opportunity to sit down with Mr. Arlotto in a local diner. Prepared with my list of questions over a warm Panini and several refills of hot coffee, hours went by like minutes as I anxiously listened to his stories like a kid on Christmas morning. I soon set aside my blue and gray notebook and simply paid attention with wide-eyed awe; his tales of the early days at Dieruff were like nuggets of pure gold and I was tapping into Fort Knox.

Student sit-ins in the Commons, backwashing from the pool which caused a flood onto the gymnasium floor, a fire



in the auditorium which damaged the stage one week before the District Band Competition, the homeroom lottery which allowed lucky students to obtain tickets for the sold-out, standing room-only Dieruff-Allen basketball games. Mr. Arlotto's stories, recalled through his good-natured sense of humor, captivated my fascination. Although some of the characters were only names to me found in old LED vearbooks, the events came alive as Mr. Arlotto shared some of his favorite memories of our cherished school.

Hailing from the blue-collar, mining community of Hazleton, Mr. Arlotto attended Lehigh University after graduating from Freeland MMI in 1958. He arrived at Dieruff in the Fall of 1961 instructing in the afternoons to fulfill his senior year student-teacher requirements. Subsequently, an unexpected vacancy in the LED Chemistry Department opened the door for his 44 -year career as a full-time educator. Hired by Principal Henry Weidner, who had hand-picked his young faculty members, Mr. Arlotto began at the start of the 1962-1963 school term and remained in the classroom until 2006. He received national recognition during his outstanding tenure, and his analytical writings were published in the "Journal of Chemical Education."

Back in the '60s and '70s, it was not uncommon for teachers to supplement their starting salaries with income from part-time work. An avid basketball fan, Mr. Arlotto took on the role of Dieruff's PA Announcer for all home games and was consequently offered the job of scorekeeper at the start of the 1968-1969 season. The rest is history. Half of a century and eleven different head coaches later, Mr. Arlotto, wearing his trademark darkrimmed glasses, can still be seen at all Varsity and JV games recording stats for our Huskies. Teaming up with Mr. (Bernie) Schimmel and Mr. (Peter) Carpenter for the presentations of the Spring Musicals, he also served as the (CONTINUED ON PAGE: 5) advisor for the stage crew, lighting, and set design. Interestingly, it was



his responsibilities to the musical production which kept him from attending the famous "Stall Game," the 1969 PIAA play-off meeting at the Penn Palestra during which Coach Schmidt slowed down the pace to stop Penncrest High's towering offense. The Huskies successfully held the ball and shut out their opponents during the entire first period. I had listened to the play-by-play of that memorable game on the radio and was looking forward to hearing from Mr. Arlotto what it was like to have seen all the action from courtside in that historic Philadelphia arena. To my disappointment, that was the ONE game he had missed that season because of his commitment to the '69 production of "The Music Man." "Back then," he joked, "we weren't concerned about the Freddys. We had to worry about the Bernies," referring to Dieruff's nononsense theatre director Bernie Schimmel.

Today, outside of basketball season, Mr. Arlotto's interests still involve music and chemistry. He enjoys his collection of opera vinyl records which he transfers to CDs, and has acquired an assortment of old chemistry sets and glass apothecary bottles. A familiar face at many of our alumni activities, he and Mr. Carpenter have remained close and continue to see each other every week for Sunday Dinner. Mr. Carpenter heartwarmingly commented about his good friend, "We are like brothers."




"Mr. Arlotto made chemistry class very fun even though it was hard."

An article in last month's Alumni Newsletter announced that Dieruff Swimmer Phillip Rishel had his name posted six times on the record board in the Dennis McGinley Natatorium. Well, get out the ladder once again for a major update.

On February 15th, in the last swim meet of the season (at William Allen), Phillip Rishel was a member of the relay team that captured a new Dieruff record in the 200 Yard Medley Relay. The old record was established in 1964 by Morrow, Fischl, Long and Constantine. Now, the names of Ulianna, Santiago, Rishel, and Lugo will appear on the record board. For Ryan Ulianna, that represents his third school record. For Rishel, that's his seventh!

But hold on! There's more! On Sunday, March 4th, Phillip Rishel struck gold in the District XI 3A Championships held at Emmaus High School. He earned first place in the grueling 500 Yard Freestyle event with an incredible time of 4:45.98! That eclipses the Dieruff High School record established by Mike Seip in 1975. Rishel lowered that record by nearly 14 seconds. That makes a total of **EIGHT** Dieruff swim records currently owned by Phil Rishel. Phil is truly a scholar-athlete, holding a GPA of 4.713 (on a 4.0 grade level - advanced courses account


