
Dan Melanson has no update. No update at all. Even though I know for a fact he's probably got some new stuff going on that would be worthy of publication in this awesome newsletter.


I'm 50 but I still feel like I'm 30... until I hang out with 30 year olds... then I'm like, nope never mind, I'm 50.
