## For a century, Manual HS's mascot has been a Native American slur. That could soon change

Will the Washington Redskins change their name?

Officials at Emmerich Manual High School are revisiting the name of the school's longtime mascot, the Redskins, school leadership told IndyStar.

The south-side high school, which was recently returned to Indianapolis Public Schools after a state takeover in 2012 and will be operated as a charter by Christel House Indianapolis, has had the Redskins mascot since the 1890s.

The decision comes as communities across the country are reckoning with representation of BIPOC (Black, indigenous and people of color) in American culture, and as the NFL and the Washington Redskins are undergoing <u>a "thorough review"</u> of the team's name.

Christel House assumed management of the school on July 1. Executive Director Sarah Weimer told IndyStar via email Wednesday that the organization's educators are "dedicated to changing the conversation in the classroom around the representation of BIPOC."

"In light of the national dialogue that has prompted a reflection on the representation of BIPOC in daily life, it was important to us to begin the process of addressing the mascot in partnership with the community," she wrote.

Weimer said school leaders hope to work with Manual Alumni Association, south side residents, Indianapolis Public Schools and representatives from the local Native American community when discussing the new mascot.

"We are honored to play a part in the 125-year rich history of Manual High School and aim to respect the numerous traditions over the past decades while looking to a vibrant future for upcoming generations for the Southside and wider Indianapolis community," Weimer wrote.

In a statement shared with IndyStar Wednesday night, IPS said it supports Christel House's decision to review the current mascot: "As outlined in the district's recently approved racial equity policy, IPS is committed to respecting the dignity

and protecting the equality of all of the students we serve. This is an important step in that direction."
