IC-CC Athletes Come Up With Best Performances

Circuit Teams Win Easily, 83-34, but Ingham Stars Shine Brightly

The Capital Circuit track squad carved the first notch in The State Journal I. C - C. C. trophy Monday evening at Michigan State college, but the Ingham County league entries were right in stride with the Circuit in providing top individual performances.

Faced by its league champion, Howell, the Circuit packed away 83 points to the County's 34 to win the first annual inter-league meet between the two Lansing area conferences.

Loren Willis, the Circuit's honorary coach, accepted the meet trophy for the winners from George S. Alderton, sports editor of The State Journal.

Although the Circuit's strength was in evidence from the first events, outstanding efforts by entries from both leagues marked the entire meet. Both squads produced double-winners. Eaton Rapids' lanky John Milbourne cleared the high jump bar at 6 feet ¾ inches, his best effort of his high school career, to cop one first-place, and

Cards Rise With Jones

Recalled from Minors, First Sacker Has Blazing Bat; Hitting .407

(By The Associated Press)

The comeback of Vernal (Nippy) Jones has injected new life into the St. Louis Cardinals.

The rise in the fortunes of the Cards dates from Jones' return to the varsity on May 15.

Jones, whose career appeared ended two years ago when he was floored with a spinal injury, looked great in the spring but big Steve Bilko was awarded the first base job. Jones was shunted to the Cards' Rochester farm in the International league.

Despite the demotion Jones didn't sulk. He banged the ball hard and often for the Wings. Bilko didn't live up to expectations and Jones was called back to the flu-ridden Cards who had lost seven out of eight starts.

The Nipper brought his blazing bat with him and since his return the Cards have won five out of seven starts and moved back into contention in the ding dong pennant race. Jones' lusty swinging directly accounted for two of the Cards' triumphs.

Batting .407 Clip

Jones has hit safely in seven straight games. He is flailing away at a .407 clip with 11 hits in 27 swings. Jones has driven in 10 runs and also has sparked afield.

Jones went to town Saturday, driving in five runs in the Cards' 6-4 triumph over Brooklyn. Monday he drove in three runs to lead the Red Birds to a 5-2 victory over the New York Giants in the National league's only scheduled game. The victory moved the third-place Cards to within a game and a half of the pace-setting Brooklyn team.

Meanwhile, the New York Yankees protected their two-game edge over the Chicago White Sox in the American league race. The Yanks defeated the St. Louis Browns, 2-0, while the White Sox downed the Washington Senators, 5-3. The Boston Red Sox outlasted the Detroit Tigers, 9-7, in the only other game.

Jones' clutch hitting broke up a pitcher's duel between Gerry Staley and the Giants' Larry Jansen. Jones doubled with two out and the bases loaded in the fifth inning to drive in three runs and break a 2-2 tie.

Pitching Power

Big Vic Raschi turned in his seventh victory against one loss in blanking the Browns under the lights at Yankee stadium. Raschi and Lefty Ed Lopat have accounted for 14 of the Yanks' 21 victories.

Little Stubby Overmire, who pitched for the Browns, deserved a better fate. The Yanks broke a scoreless tie with two out in the sixth on a scratch hit by Hank Bauer and singles by Joe DiMaggio and Yogi Berra.

Joe Dobson, Billy Pierce and Harry Dorish held the Senators to four hits as the White Sox extended their winning streak to five games in a night game at Washington.

Dobson allowed only one hit in five innings, but weakened in the sixth when he walked two and served a home run ball to Gil Coan.

The Sox, with the aid of shoddy fielding, nicked Julio Moreno for four runs in the first three innings. Ed Robinson drove in two runs with a fly ball and triple.

then came back to win the low hurdle event.

Milbourne also added a second place in the high hurdles to earn 13 points to be the meet's high scorer. The Eaton Rapids athlete may have even gone higher in the high jump, but stopped after topping the six-foot mark to save himself for the two hurdle races.

Ewing Double Winner

The County league matched the Circuit's double-winner with Dick Ewing, Okemos high sprinter, breaking the tape in both of the dashes. Ewing, who also won both sprints in the County meet last week, stepped off the 100-yard dash in :10.6 and the 220 in :23.1.

Everett's brilliant miler, Tommy Hoffmeyer, ran his fastest mile of the season to easily win the event. Hoffmeyer's time was 4:35.2. Ray Vandersteen of Grand Ledge clicked off the half-mile in 2:05.9, another best time of the season.

Gene Pearce of Holt and little Herbie Hagenbuch of Haslett won the shotput and broad jump to help counter the Circuit's power in the distance events. Pearce tossed the shot 49 feet 5 1/2 inches for a first, and Hagenbuch leaped 19 feet 8 1/2 inches to win the broad jump.

Kardel Paces Hurdles

The Circuit won the other five events as Hans Kardel of Charlotte paced the high hurdles, Howell's Ed Baller won the quarter-mile, and Carmen Kypke, also of Howell, copped first in the pole vault. Everett's medley relay team of Dwight Quinn, Glen Gray, Jim Diederichs and Ed Bloomquist carried home the baton first and Charlotte ran the 880-relay in 1:37.5 to take the honors.

Running on Charlotte's winning team were Dale Rolfe, Dean Carey, Wally Bruce and Harold Risenhoover.

Howell paced the individual team scoring with 24 points. Everett was second in Circuit with 21, followed by Charlotte 19, Eaton Rapids 13 and Grand Ledge 6.

Okemos, which placed third in the County meet, led the Ingham teams with 16 points, followed by Holt 12, Haslett 5, and Fowlerville 1. The Ingham County league champion, Williamston, did not score a point in the inter-league meet.

The Circuit slammed three events—the mile, the half-mile and the pole vault. The County's strongest event was the broad jump. Dee McDonald of Okemos was second to Hagenbuch to give the I. C. eight points. Harold Risenhoover of Charlotte was third.



12 Schools Ready Stars For IC-CC Journal Meet

Almost perfect track weather is helping the Ingham County and Capital Circuit league coaches tune up their athletes for the first annual State Journal I. C.-C. C. inter-league dual meet at Michigan State college next Monday evening.

The two league squads were named at the conference meets last week. Individuals on the teams, which represent 12 different schools in the Lansing area, have been working out all week preparing for the meet.

The four field events will open the meet at 5:15 p. m. The first races will be held at 6 o'clock. There will be no admission charge.

On the basis of comparative times, heights and distances in the two loop meets, the County squad turned in the best performances in 10 of the 13 events, but still will rate as the underdog Monday. Rain and a muddy track slowed down the Circuit's times in its conference test last Friday.

The County should hold its own in the field events and relays, but will probably fall behind the Circuit in the distance races, the hurdles and the dashes.

On paper the Circuit has the fastest set of high hurdlers with John Milbourne of Eaton Rapids, Hans Kardel and Wally Bruce of Charlotte giving the CC a chance to slam the event. Kardel and Milbourne have both run the event in :16.0 seconds this season, although Milbourne's winning time in the CC meet was :16.7.

Holt's Jim Verplanck, who won the County race with a :16.5 effort, is the IC's best bet to cut in for some points by taking one of the three places in the event. Dansville's Bob Thompson and Fowlerville's Norm Miller complete the County trio of high hurdlers. Thompson's and Miller's best times have been shaded by Verplanck's and the CC hurdlers' all season.

The County will be stronger in the lows, with either Miller or Verplanck capable of winning the event. Holt's Bob Hanes is the third IC entry in the low hurdles. Miller toured the 180-yard course in 23-flat to win the County title.

Milbourne, Jim Swank, also of Eaton Rapids, and Howell's Bill Hilton will carry the CC colors in the lows. Milbourne paced his conference field in :23.3, with Swank and Hilton finishing just a step behind. Top season performances of all six entries have been about the same, making this one of the closest races of the meet.

Dick Ewing of Okemos is the County's leading threat against the Circuit's four-man dash squad. The Chiefs' sprinter was a double-winner in the County meet, winning the century in :10.7 and the 220 in :23.8. Ewing will have Williamston's pair of speedsters, Lyle Burkley and Jim Harris, as running mates in the 100. Mel Morrison of Holt will team with Harris and Ewing in the 220.

The County boys will meet Charlotte's Dale Rolfe and Everett's Jim Diederichs in both sprints. Glen Gray of Everett will run the 220 for the CC, and Hilton of Howell will race in the 100. Rolfe won the short dash in the

for Williamston were Chuck Powell in the pole vault and Glen Lounsberry in the high jump. McElmurry was also fourth in the high jump. Mel Morrison paced Holt in its bid for the title with 11 points which was high for the meet. Morrison

was first in the vault, second in the 250 and fourth in the 100-yard dash, besides running a leg on the 880 relay team.

Jim VerPlanck of Holt and Norm Miller of Fowlerville traded first and second places in the hurdle races. VerPlanck won the highs. Gene Pearce missed a league record by $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch in winning the shotput for Holt. Pearce's winning toss was 48 feet 8 inches.

Okemos won four first places with Dick Ewing accounting for two of them in the dashes. Gerald Roosa won the 440 and a medley relay team of Leroy Webb, Keith Palmerston, Dick Stetler and Dick Hartsuff paced the field.

Holt's Dick Fluke was less than an inch from the high jump record with a winning leap of 5 feet 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. The record stands at 5-8.

Herbie Hagenbuch tallied all of Haslett's points with a first in the broad jump, fifth in the century, a tie for second in the pole vault and a tie for fifth in the high jump.
