


Terry Donavon Marzen

Obituary: March 14, 1941 ~ March 21, 2020 (age 79)

Terry Donavon Marzen, age 79, of Crestview, Florida sailed away March 21, 2020. He was born in Okemos, Michigan on March 16, 1941 to George and Mildred Marzen. He attended Okemos High School, West Palm Beach Junior College, Florida State Night School, and the University of Alabama in Huntsville. He served his country for four years in the United States Air Force, completing several electronics courses. On January 18, 1963, at the Eglin Air Force Base, Terry married Betty, the love of his life. To this union was born two beautiful daughters.



Terry lived in seven states in the south. One of his last jobs was with a large corporation out of Little Rock, Arkansas. His primary account was Entergy, located in New Orleans, Louisiana. He had the honor of representing 30 companies. On Terry's last big job (multi-million) he ordered and coordinated with a Japanese company that included trips to Japan to work engineering on those projects.

Terry was an Eagle Scout, played football, loved band, dancing, fishing and theatre, especially shows like Cats. His favorite pastime was sailing. Terry also enjoyed various genres of music including classical, country, jazz, and big band to name a few. Most of all he loved spending time with his family on vacations and traveling to other countries. Terry was a real talker and was quite good as a speaker. He enjoyed reading, especially sailing magazines like Wooden Boat, among others.

POWERS LAST YEAR. BUT

Okemos, Defending County League Champs, Haslett Lack Veterans

Two of the powers in the Ingham County league last season, Okemos and Haslett, are thinking about the "good old days." After several days to look over

men and veterans. Coach Ed Kiley of the Chiefs and Denny Stolz of Haslett will have no trouble remembering their names.

Okemos has just three regular backs, while the cap and gown routine sheared all but one of the Vikings' starters from this year's roster.

As Kiley tries to weld another squad together in Okemos' defense of its Ingham County grid title, he has two linemen, Tackle Bob Zuver and Guard Jerry Largent, and defense linebacker Case Hoonhout, around which to build.

There is a very good chance that the big, rangy Hoonhout

will be shifted to an offensive fullback spot.

Brightening Kiley's task in his fifth season as head coach at Okemos will be the return of five players who saw duty on last year's team.

Quarterback Chuck Clausen and Halfback Doug Nelson will lend experience in forming a backfield, while end John Haga, center Terry Marzen and Ron Whitmore will represent "know-how" in the line.

While many people are talking about the growth around Okemos, Kiley must feel that the shift is the other way. He has already lost center Dave Hines, whose family moved into the Haslett district, and might lose

two end prospects that are badly needed in Don and Jim Kiger, whose family is considering a move into the northern part of the state.

Bob Baker will again be in the role of assistant coach at

When asked "who are your returning starters," the genial Stolz said "the word is 'is' not 'are'."

Right halfback Bob Lerch is the only starter back from the Vikings' 1956 team.

Starting his first year as head coach at Haslett, Stolz has a major rebuilding job. He will have a pair of halfbacks in Eldon Tebo and Ronny Ferguson and a pair of tackles in Dennis Flood and Dick Imhoff, who saw some service last season. In addition to those he will have end Don Taber and guard Bob Morris who claim some varsity time.

Quarterback Duane Chambers and Allen Lang also have limited experience.

Key to the Vikings success will be the way that those players from last year's undefeated reserve team make the transition to the varsity.

As Stolz, an Alma college graduate of 1955, takes over at Haslett, he will have the help of an old hand around the conference in Oland Dunkel, who stepped down from the head coaching job at the end of last season.
