TREASURER'S REPORT

For the year ending May 30, 2011

The Club is in a very healthy financial position. It has cash on hand as of May 30, 2011 of \$1,089,530 pesos in which the checking account balance amounts to \$665,140 pesos, the savings account balance \$423,403 pesos and petty cash of 986 pesos. Since the year end a net amount of 100,000 pesos was transferred to the savings account to earn additional interest.

For the 2011 fiscal year ended May 30, 2011 total income exceeded plan by \$54, 189. Although Home Tours income was below plan by \$113,317 mainly due to fewer tourists and club house income was below plan by \$26,000. These shortfalls were more than offset by the unusually unexpected high donations received in this accounting period.

The administrative costs were well controlled at \$369,000 pesos or \$26,835 pesos below plan. Our expenses for the medical programs were below plan by \$128,000 pesos. (No expenses under the Patrocinio Program and no Cleft Palate program in the last quarter.) Overall the fiscal year ended May 31, 2011 produced an overall surplus of 208,488 pesos.


