held at the Emilio Zapata Jardín de Niños or kindergarten located at the corner of Lazaro Cardenas and Olas Altas in the Zona Romantica. A ribbon cutting ceremony was held and a plaque on the school wall was



presented to commemorate the improvements made to the playground.

The improvements were: building a cover for the protection of the children from the sun and rain, the installation of new playground equipment such as slides, seesaw and swings, still to come is the addition of artificial turf to be added to the area.

The funds for this project were provided by the



International Friendship Club (IFC). The celebration was held by the school and attended by the Principal, Maestra Conchita Bañuelos, teachers, students and parents. I n a d d i t i o n, t h e Superintendent of the

kindergarten section for Jalisco, Teresa Garcia Urena, and for Puerto Vallarta, Evangelina Gonzalez Cervantes, was in

attendance. The school installed a wall plaque thanking the IFC and Mel Bornstein, the Chairman of the Education Committee, was on site to accept their thanks and to cut the ribbon for the opening of the improved play facilities.



The IFC is also involved in funding two other school projects in the area recently. In Mismaloya, the IFC funded a project at the Manuel Lopez Cotilla Primary School to install



new window frames and screens to protect the children from mosquitoes as well as purchasing a new bookcase for the school. In Boca de Tomatlan, a new kitchen was installed in the Alicia Rodriguez Jardin de Niños so

that children can now enjoy a warm lunch at school.

The next cleft palate surgeries are scheduled for May 5 and 6. That is the Wednesday and Thursday immediately following the FESTIVAL DE ALTRUISMO. That is on Sunday at 6pm at the Marriott Hotel and is the best priced extravaganza of the year!

Please join us for an evening of fun and food. IFC has tickets for 300 pesos and they are 400 pesos at the door. All money goes to charity, many of the charities that we assist. The IFC is an integral part of the community. We will be receiving an equal portion of the monies to use during the dry summer months to come.

I would like to briefly speak about a situation that has occurred in one on our clients of many years. Joel Enrique has been a part of our program for many years. He had a severe burn to his face when he was very young. He has not had surgery for 8 or 9 years while we waited for his face to stop growing. He came only for an exam by Dr Fuentes. I have watched him grow into a fine young man. His family of 5 is poor and he has contributed to the family's income for several years now. I believe he is 19 years old. It was finally time this last program for a revision of his scar. He has had complications post-op and has had to make several trips to Guadalajara by bus for follow up. His has paid his trips. He needs surgery in Guadalajara soon and must wear a special collar to ease the pain and stretch the skin so it will be better for this next surgery. Dr Fuentes is in Guadalajara and has been seeing him. We wish the best for young Joel Enrique. I will let you know what becomes of him in future newsletters. We would like the surgeries to all come out well!

At times, the poor nutrition and lack of protein in the daily diet contributes to complications not usually seen in the places we come from. Please continue to help us help others. Plan now to be an active part of the next high season in the IFC. JUST DO IT!!!!!

So this is the last newsletter of the year and the season is winding down. We have a few thoughts to leave you with as you go north. I know there are some of you who don't go north so you all can just call me anytime with your input and good ideas.

Our last Cleft Palate surgery program was Feb 3-5. We had 6 patients for surgery including: 2 new babies for closing their lips; a boy 11 for repair of a fistula that had opened in his palate; a boy 11 who was having the 3rd surgery in the series to form his ear; Rosa, a cleft palate kid who has grown into a young lady now, had a graft in her nasal septum; and Joel Enrique, a burned kid had a skin graft on his chin and neck.

When you get in the mood for a terrific seafood lunch please try 8 Tostados in the marina...behind Collage. They have joined the small but growing group of Vallarta businesses who are supporting our cleft palate surgery program. 8 Tostados is donating the lunch on Wed. for the medical team after they arrive in Vallarta and before we go to the hospital to see 60 - 80 kids and their families. We also want to recognize and thank Daiquiri Dick's for their continued support for over 20 years donating dinner for the group every Wednesday night of the program, that's 4 times a year, folks, and they never fail to make us totally warm and welcome. Andale's restaurant sends us a beautiful and tasty breakfast to the hospital on Thursday mornings so the team can eat before going into surgery and coffee service is by Gringo's Books & Coffee of Bucerias.

Joel Enrique is the burned kid that we have sent to the Wisconsin Alliance for Fire Safety summer camp for burn kids for 4 years. He now attends as camp counselor. The WAFS, through Dan and Mary Gengler, has given a scholarship to Joel for English classes for the last 2 years. Joel's surgery for the skin graft in Feb. didn't turn out as well as we would have wanted so Dr Fuentes is doing it over again at the hospital in Guadalajara. Joel and his family are paying a greatly reduced rate to the hospital and, of course, Dr. Fuentes is donating his services. The club is helping with transportation to and from Guadalajara several times and a special collar he will need during the recuperation.

Another of our cleft palate kids is receiving national recognition as a cyclist. Emmanuel Sahagún is 16 yrs old and has won more medals that he can wear at one time. In the 9th Santorini State Cup race he took 2nd place in a field of 50 cyclists. He competed in the Fluvial Vallarta race this year in two categories and placed 1st and 2nd. Emmanuel is asking for some help. He would like to have a carbon bike, a uniform, and a pair of shoes. He has given me a website at which we can see his heart's desire. www.teknobike.com and says we can find it in the "checar en ofertas" page...that means on sale. The bike will cost between \$18,000 and \$25,000 pesos. The lycra suit will cost around \$700 pesos, helmet \$900 pesos and the shoes \$1,500 pesos. He is very conscious of the help the club has given him over the years

with his many surgeries. But he is twice blessed in having parents that have always been very conscientious in their care of him both medically and socially. They are very supportive of his participation in and passion for the sport but simply don't have the resources to take him to the next level. At this time, he uses a bike that is shared by the team members. Emmanuel has been invited to participate in the National Junior Olymics and hopes to wear a jersey sporting "El Club Internacional de la Amistad de Pto Vta" I understand the club can't commit to carry the entire load in this and I am fervently hoping that some of you out there see an opportunity to make a personal contribution to this young man's dream. He has compiled a list of the races he has participated in and the prizes he has won and it is impressive. I will translate it and have it ready for anyone that wants to know more about this outstanding young athlete.

Our next cleft palate surgery program will be May 5-7 so if you are in town you are welcome to come to the hospital with us and work with the kids. Call me at 329-298-1767 or our Volunteer Coordinator at 329-298-0380.

As you are collecting donations during the summer keep us in mind. The wish list in on the website...and all of that is still current.
