President's Message

As our busy season comes to an end, I'd like to pause to thank everyone who has made this great year possible, from the many volunteers - too many to mention them all by name - who offer countless hours of time and talent to our projects and activities, and to all members, whether first-time or long-term, for the financial and moral support that keeps this great organization growing and thriving. And thriving we are, with an active membership count well over 600 this year.

The many programs your efforts have supported this season include a successful new English Outreach Program offering basic English language skills to local residents who need it for work or school, as well as a new Dental Outreach Program being piloted with children who lack dental care in the Boca de Tomatlán and south shore area.

Our new Education Committee approved 7 grants to support educational initiatives underway in some of Vallarta's most economically challenged areas, partnering with a diverse group of established and respected educational and charitable organizations including the American School and British American School, Los Mangos Library and The Vallarta Youth Orchestra, The Volcanas Community Education Project and SETAC Community Center, and The Vallarta Botanical Gardens.

A revamped Patrocinio Program encourages all IFC members to step forward to sponsor, with IFC financial support, a local resident who has a specific medical problem requiring one-time financial assistance. Applications and guidance are available at the office.

In addition the IFC has expanded its Rice and Beans program aiding various community centers that provide daycare, meals, and remedial instruction in impoverished areas, as well as providing some emergency funds to families in extreme need. We also distribute school supplies each summer to a wide variety of organizations.

The IFC now more than ever serves as a "United Way" of Puerto Vallarta, offering monthly financial support to a growing list of local charities thanks to your continued financial contributions. After careful review of their programs and onsite visits, the following charities have been added to our list this year: orphanages Corazon de Niña and Casa Hogar Maximo Cornejo, and humanitarian and service organizations Dives in Miseracordia, Arroyos de Esperanza, CANICA, and SETAC, as well as Biblioteca Los Mangos. IFC aid also continues strong to the following charitable and service organizations we have long supported: Clinical Santa Barbara de Rehabilitación, Pasitos de Luz, Refugio Infantile Santa Esperanza (RISE), and The Salvation Army food kitchen.

As you know, in addition to funding charities the IFC continues to offer numerous social and recreational activities to its members and the general public, hosts fundraising events, and offers classes and lectures throughout the season. Attendance has never been better and your donations help cover overhead. Thanks to all who have made this great variety of activities and community-building possible.

I'm delighted to report the IFC has completed a very successful season of Home Tours, now in its 27th season, as well as a weekly Botanical Gardens and Zoo Tour added this year. Tours raise funds that not only help support all the activities mentioned above, they also are the main source of fundraising for our flagship program, the IFC Cleft Palate Surgery program, also in its 27th season. Our most recent clinic in March was a great success and plans are underway for more great clinics to come.

Our thanks go out to the fantastic medical team, the many IFC volunteers who organize and carry them out, local businesses and restaurants, and the CMQ Hospital and staff and the Villanueva family for their vital assistance in making this program an ongoing success.

I also thank all the hardworking residents and individuals and establishments of Puerto Vallarta that help keep the IFC functioning and make it possible for all of us to enjoy its many activities and benefits, beginning with our own hard working employee, office administrator Josué Santiago, along with our accountants, bankers, Notario, and others who help us take care of business.

I ask that you please extend your own personal thanks to the countless restaurants and other merchants who offer IFC members generous discounts on meals and merchandise, further enhancing the value of an IFC membership and thereby underwriting our many efforts to truly be international friends.

Medical Update

Our cleft lip and palate repair team cleared the hurdles we have come up against over the last two months to come together and successfully complete a round of surgeries. Our team of surgeons, nurses, anesthesiologist and volunteers gathered at Hospital CMQ Centro on March 12. CMQ hospital has allowed us to use their facilities free of charge for each of our surgical programs for the last 2 and one half years. Our team meets 4 times per year at CMQ to transform lives and make complete smiles where there were none.

We receive our patients soon after birth, sometimes while they are still in post-partum, and follow them through to adulthood. We guide the families through the passage of one or several surgeries. The IFC has a specially trained dentist who is often our first contact with newborns with cleft palates. These children are unable to suck. The dentist designs a special apparatus for each child that covers the difficulty, allowing the baby to nurse sufficiently to grow until they can have surgery.

For some kids, a major facial reconstruction during late teen years is provided when the face has reached adult size. There are many variables to clefts, as well as sequeli. Each child's challenge is different and requires individualized treatment from birth forward. Our IFC program meets the many challenges!

Consultations took place the day prior to the surgeries. Our team would like to thank the many volunteers that met early on that day and stayed for several hours, some more than that, working with the kids. We provided fun/diversion as well as therapeutic games for the kids while they were waiting the many hours to be seen.

There is always room for improvement. I would love to teach families health, nutrition and hygiene during this long period of free time. If any one would like to help with this missing piece or provide Spanish educational videos, please call or write the IFC with your ideas.
