They must play very carefully.

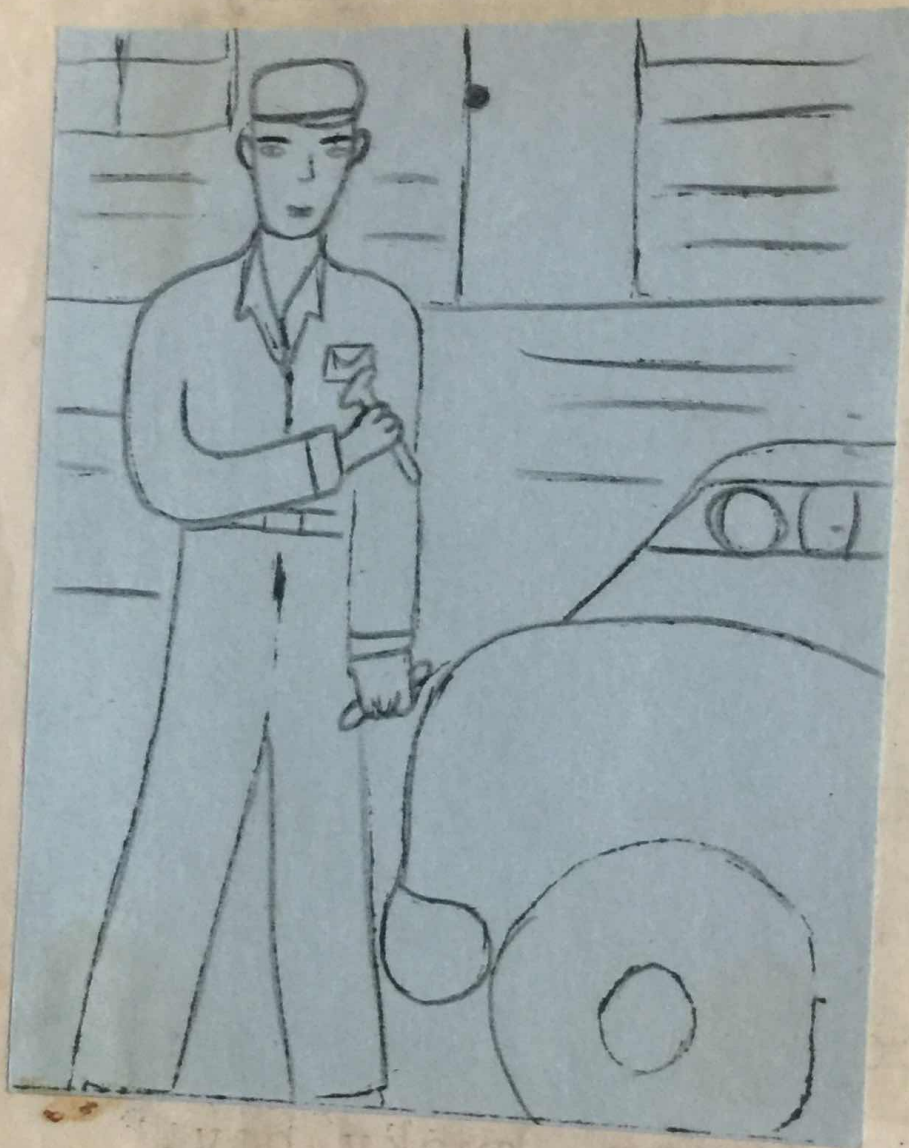
Jim has an older sister.

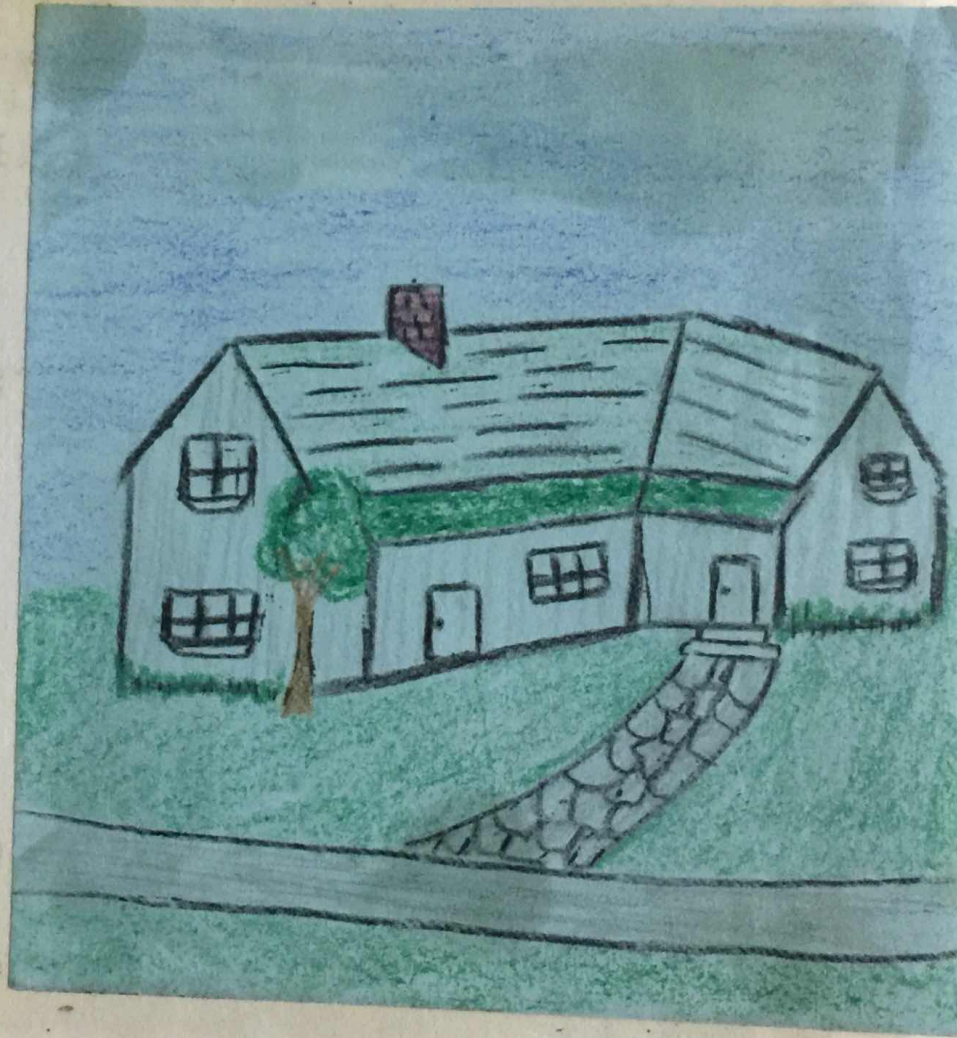

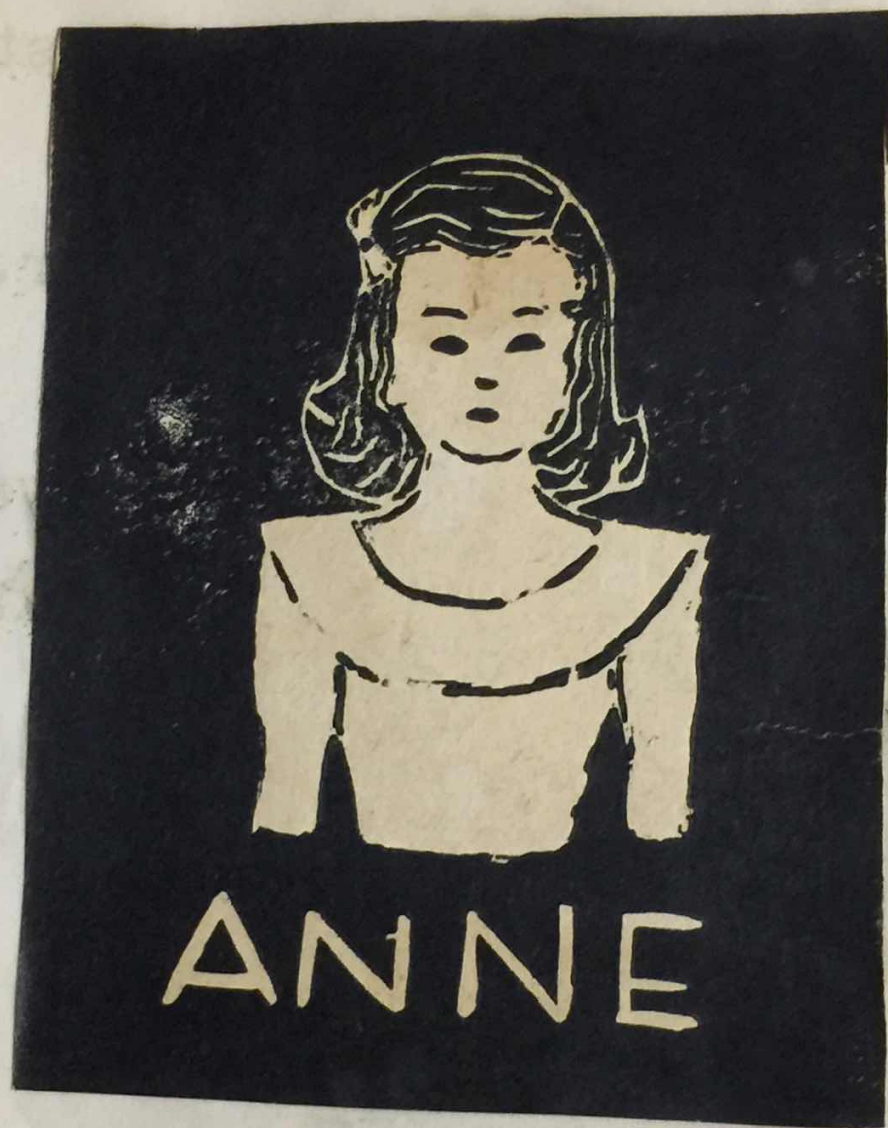

Two of them are Anne's age.

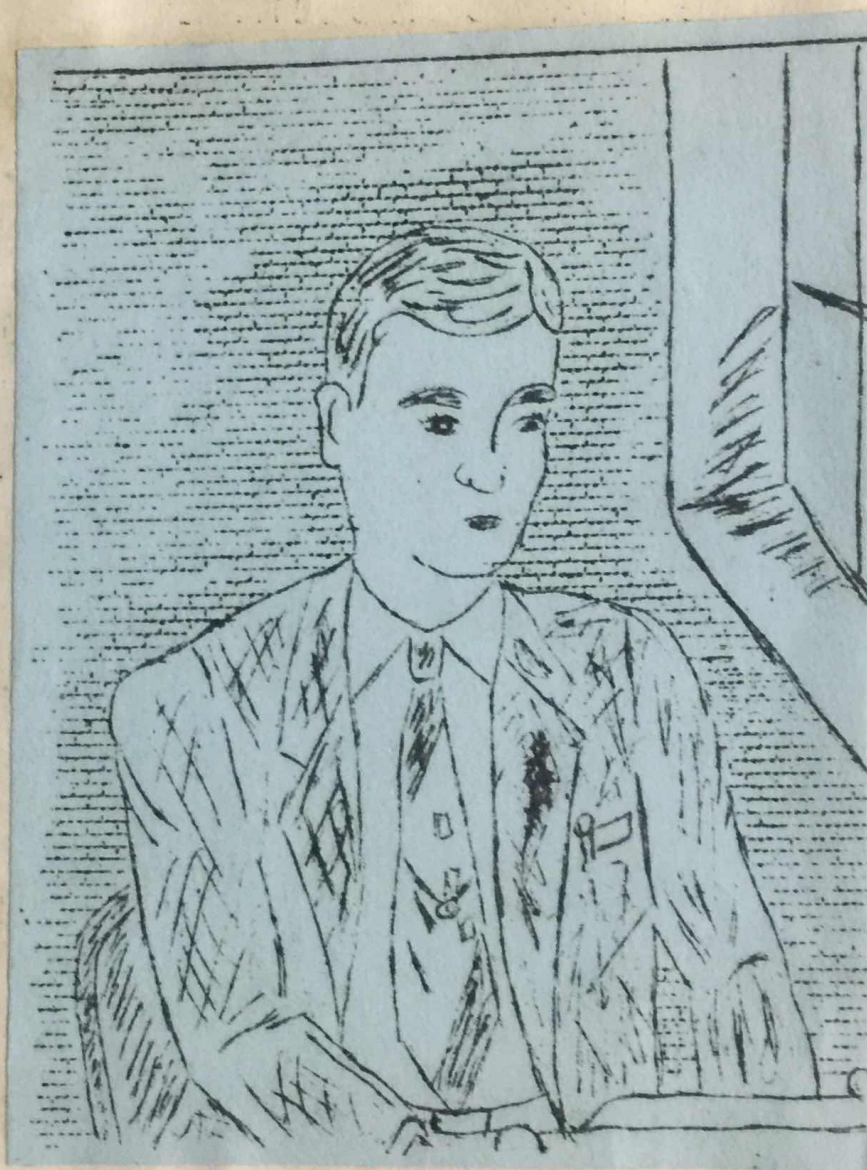

When Anne grows up

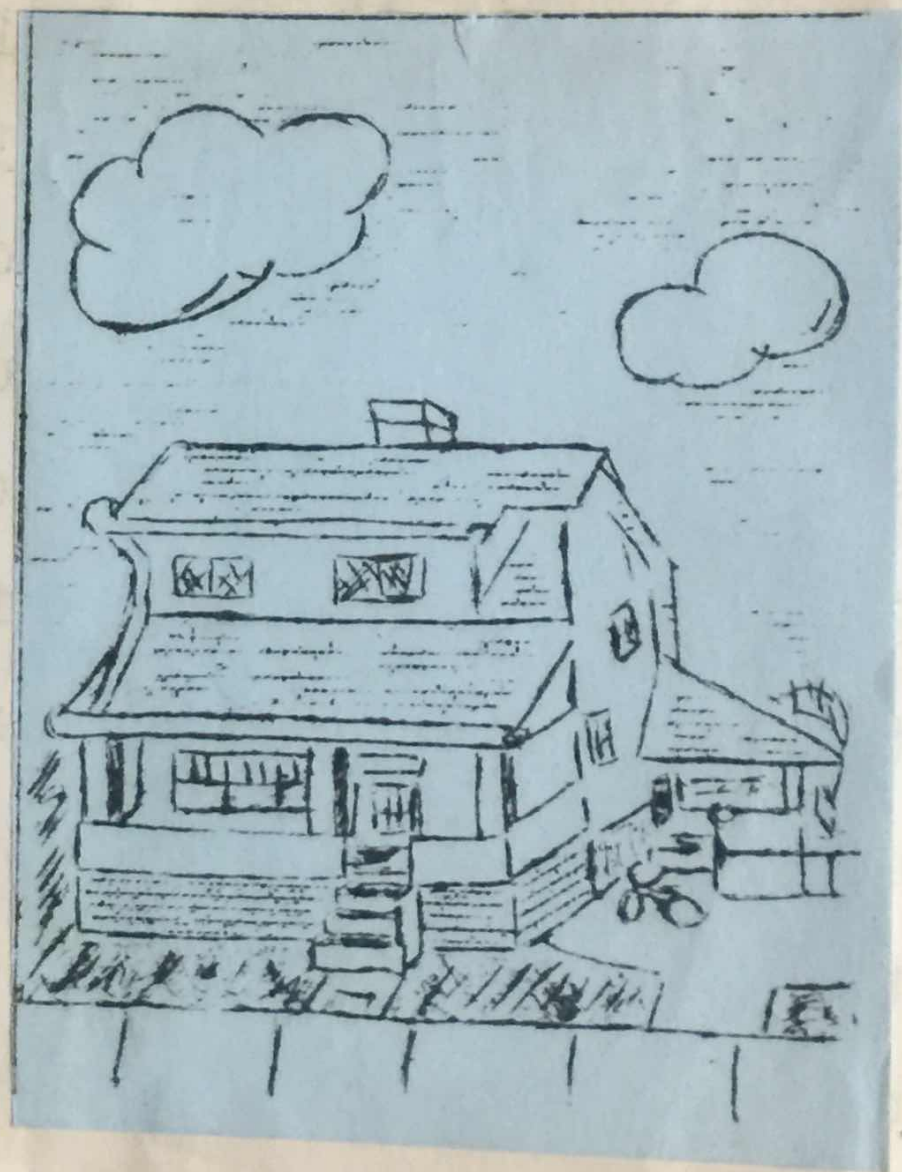

His hours are the same each day.

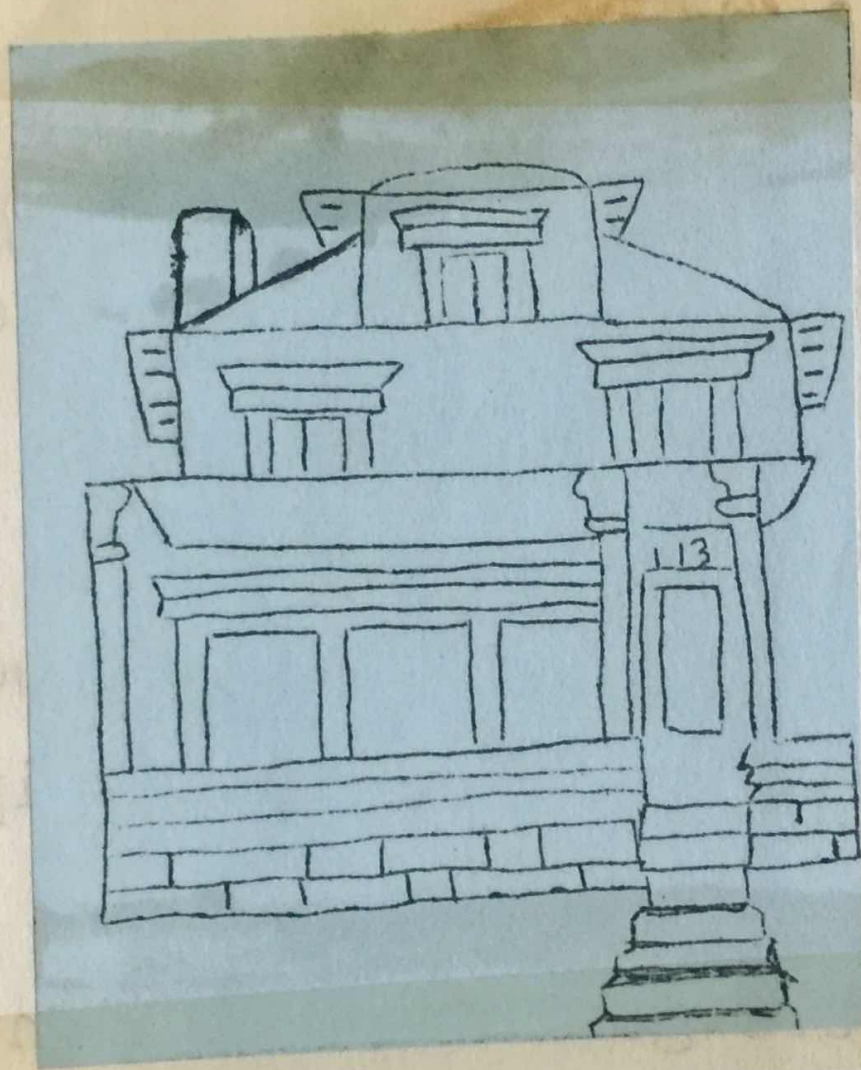

She skates on the sidewalk.

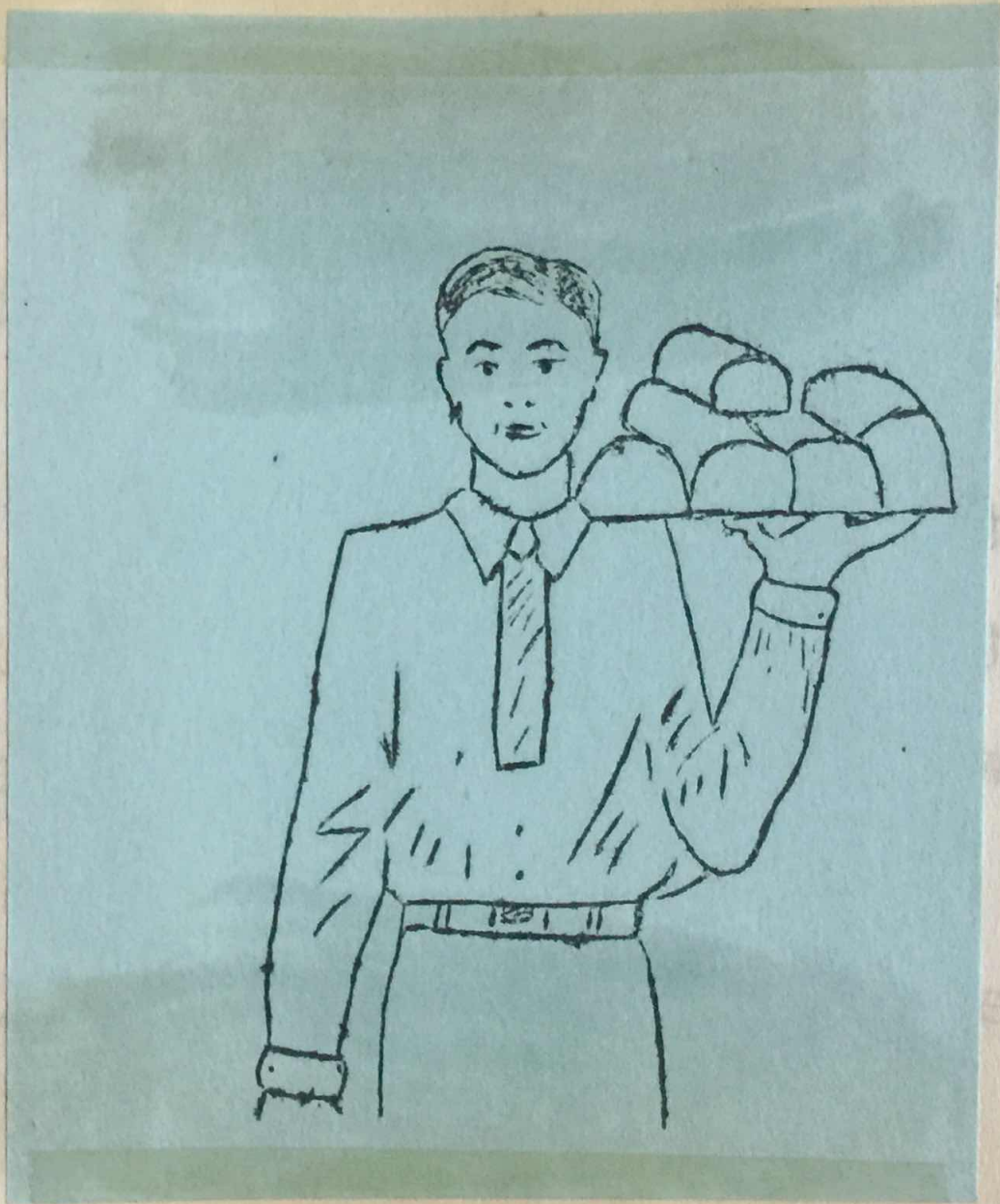
She skates on the school playground.

Margene's father drives a bakery truck out to the country.

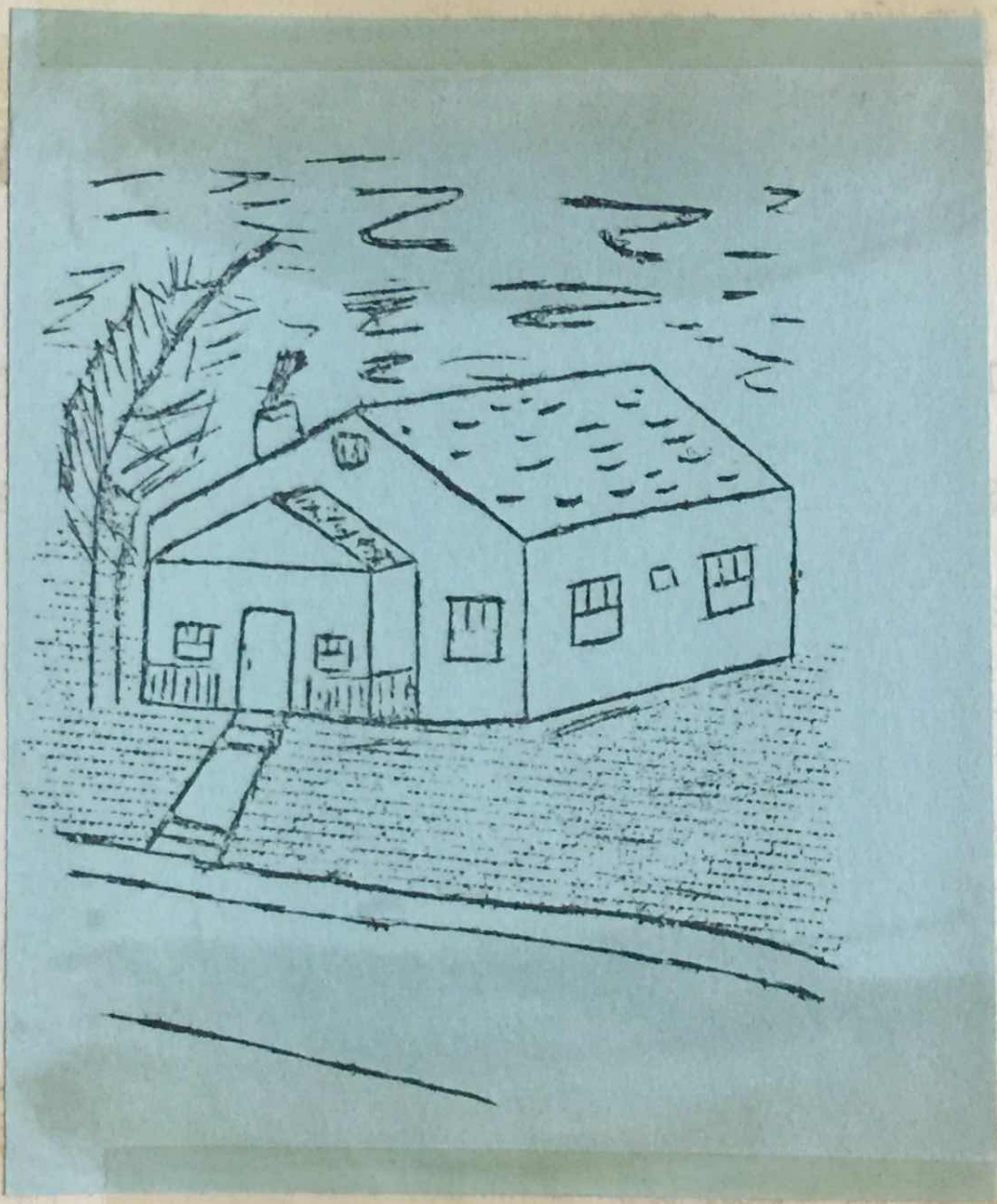
The truck carries good things to eat. Inside the truck are rolls, bread and cake.

She likes to run and skate.

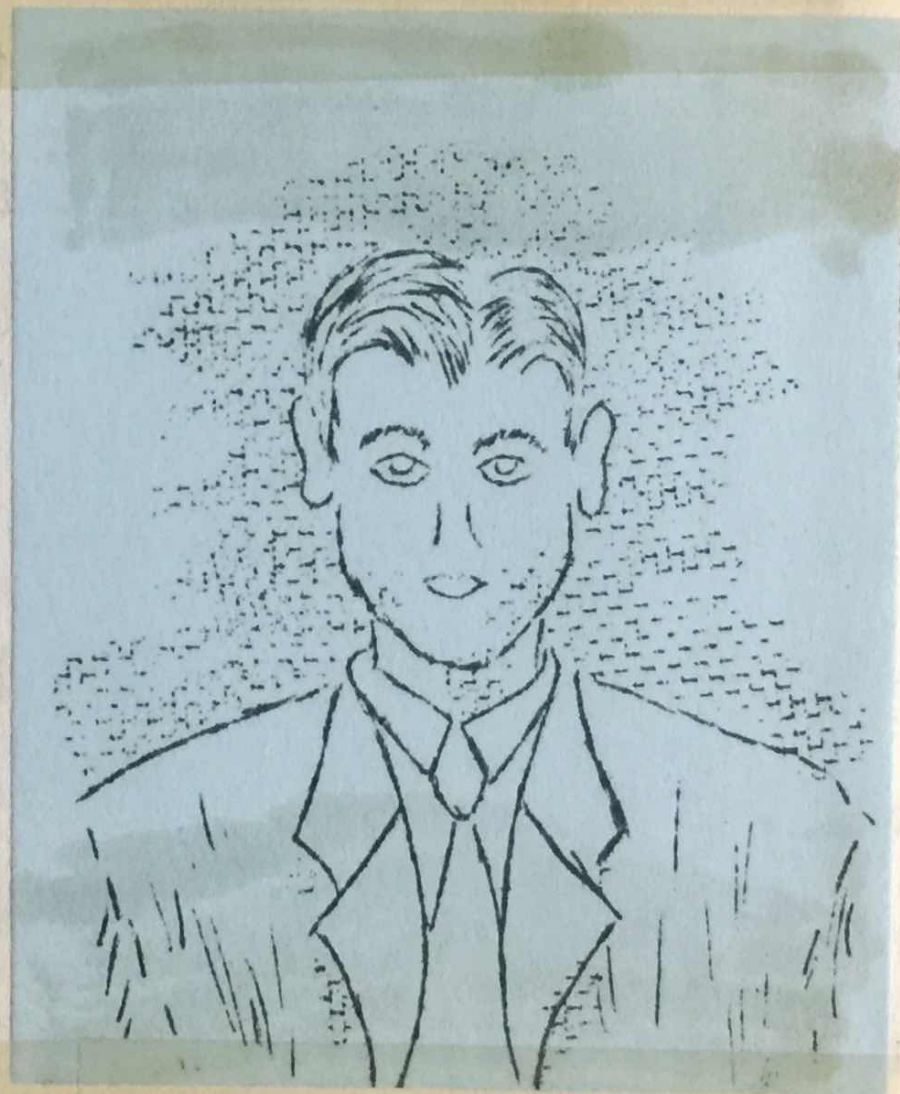
Sandra takes a lot of pictures.

He played football when he was in school.

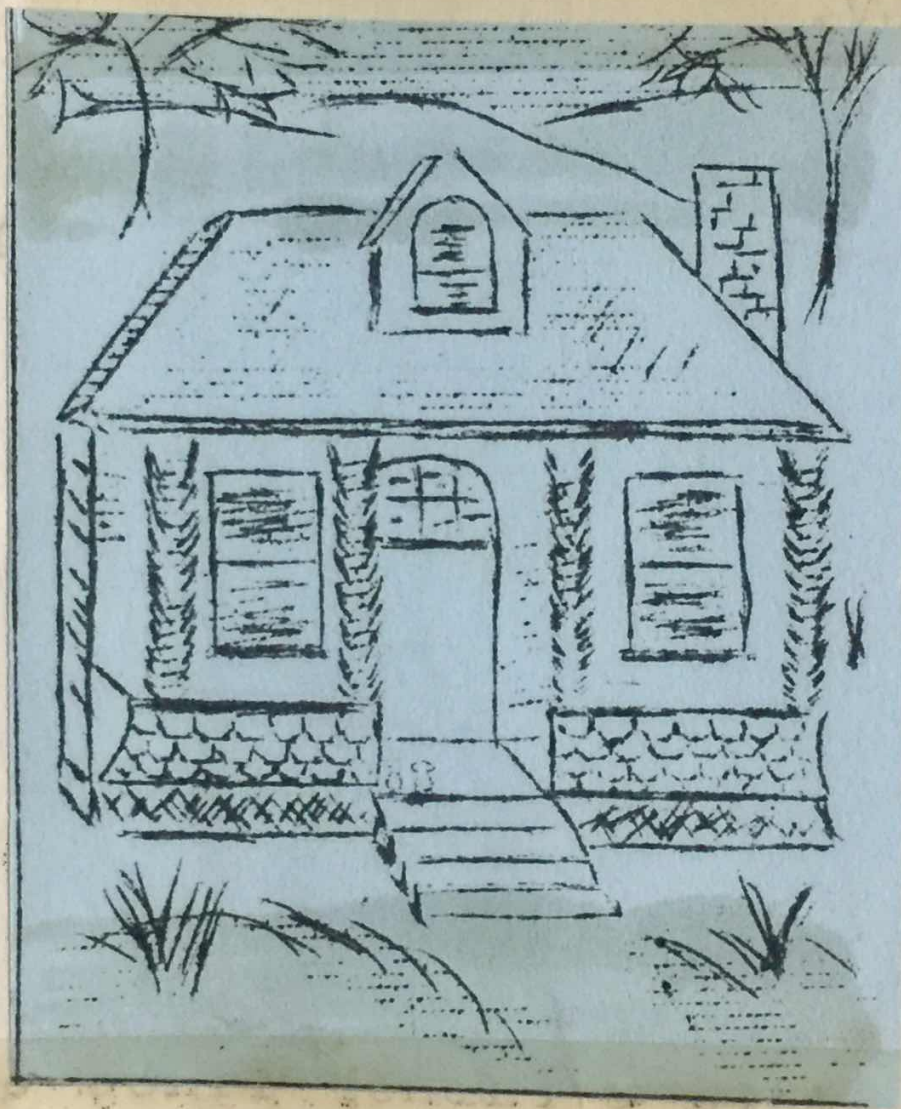

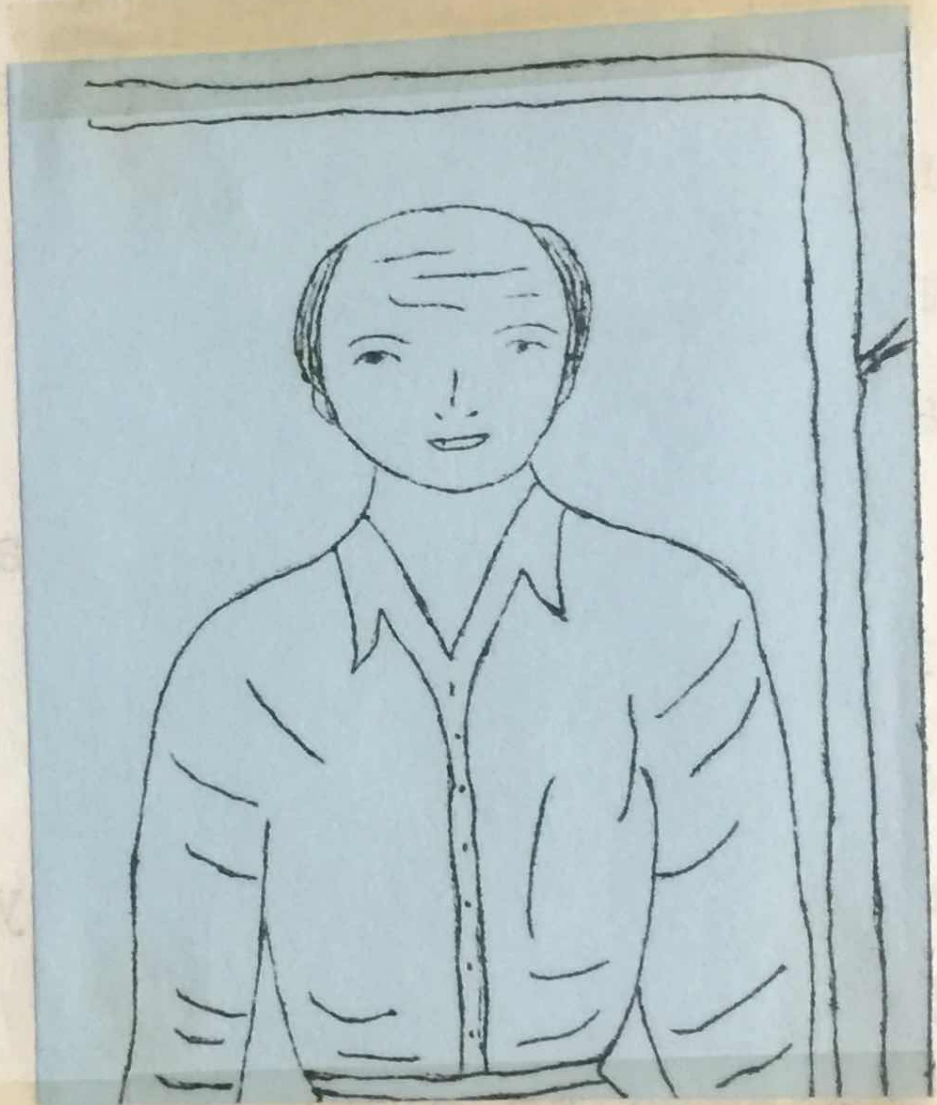

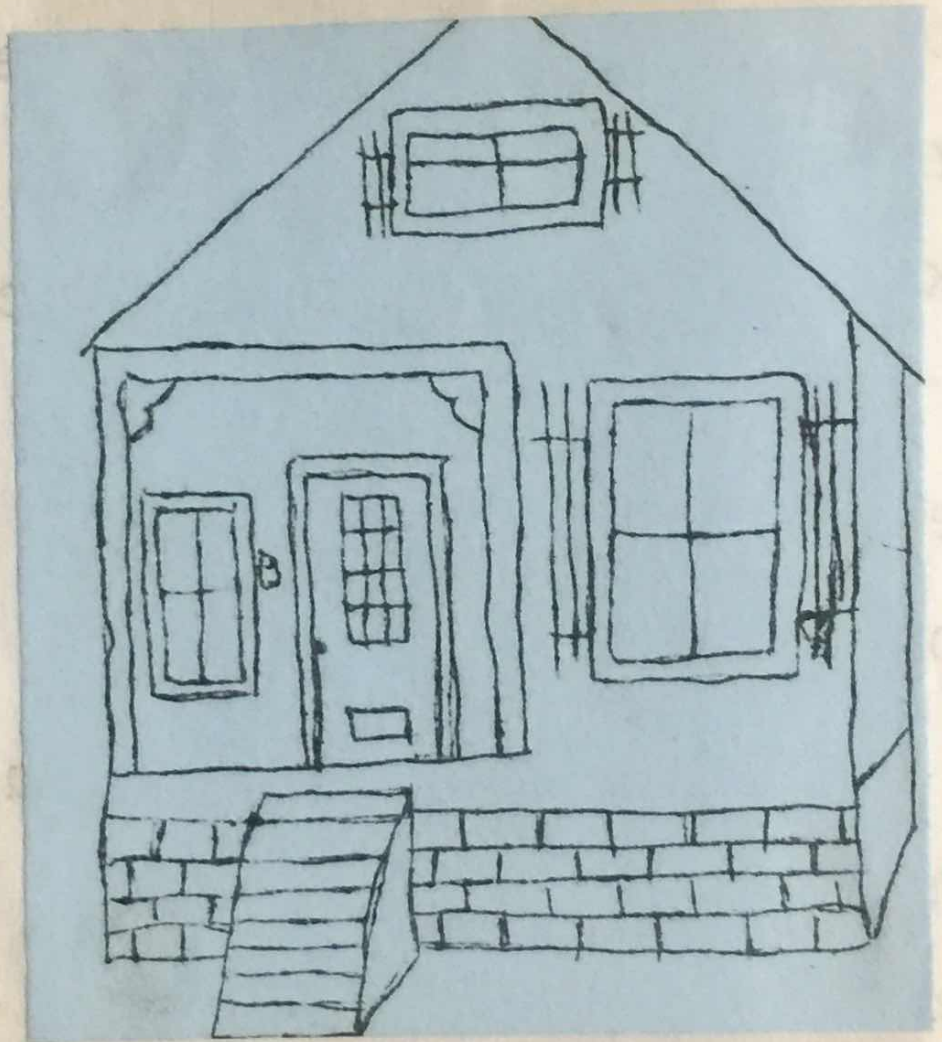

dishes.

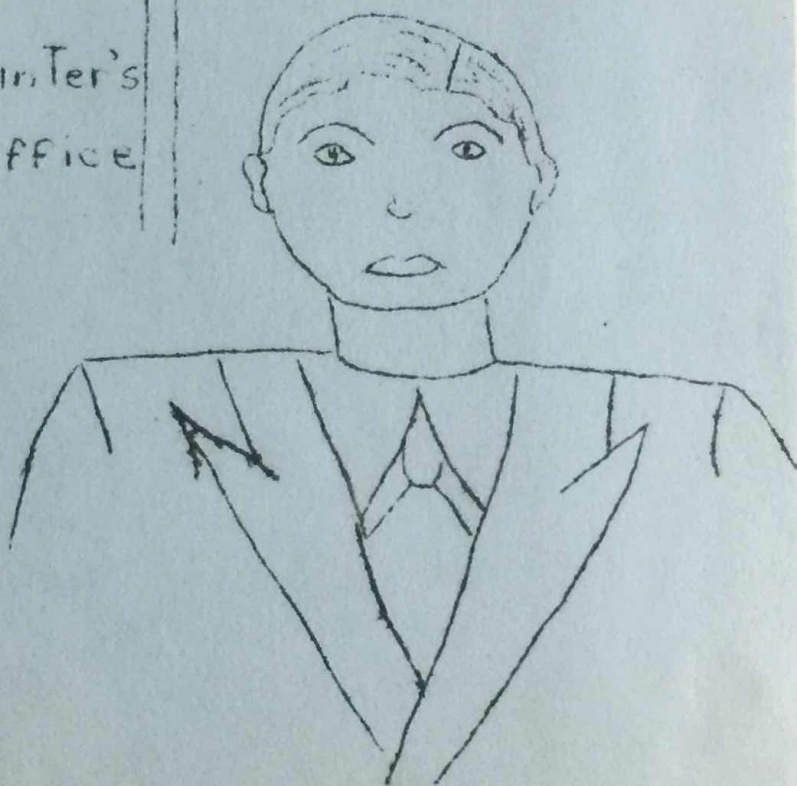
