Budget cuts affect aid

If you're a college-bound senior needing financial aid, you should be filing your Financial Aid Form (FAF) now. (You know, the form that asks such pertinent questions as "How much did your great-grandmother make on February 29, 1932?") The FAF is used to apply for aid from your college and various government programs.

Unfortunately, Reaganomics is cutting back on student aid. Cutbacks may lower the expected amount of financial assistance. Specifically, these cutbacks affect

"Guaranteed Student Loans." The government has established that your parent's income must not exceed thirty thousand dollars to be eligible for these low-interest loans. Also, social security beneficiaries may not receive aid if they are not currently in college. But, these may not be the only cutbacks. There already is a fear that the government may reduce Pell Grants (Basic Grants) and/or college work-study programs. If you're applying for aid, don't expect too much.

The John Adams Wrestling team finished its regular season high in the N.I.C. race with a respectable 5-4 record.

After a well deserved, food-filled Christmas break, the Eagles picked up one of their N.I.C. wins by defeating a strong Elkhart Central team with a flurry of pins. The final score showing a 37-31 Eagle victory.

The grapplers, excited by the triumph over Central, came out looking for blood against Washington and slaughtered their squad by a score of 59-11. Eagle freshmen pinned 3 out of 4 opponents in the 4 lower weights. Jerome Sherman started it off with a pin at 3:33. Paul McNarney followed Sherman's lead with a lightning-quick pin in :35. Bill Weaver pinned his man in 3:53 at 121 pounds. Co-captains Dave McNarney needed less than a minute to finish off his opponent. Todd Lentz battled to a 9-9 draw at 134 pounds.

Vince Nino, Tim Wiese and Tim Long pinned their men at 147, 157 and 169. Nino in 3:04, Wiese a mere :37 and Long in 1:21. Sean Lennon and co-captain Lamar Taylor received wins by forfeit and co-captain Steve Quimby defeated his man for a 7-6 decision.

The Eagles then traveled to

Elkhart Memorial for the last dual meet of the season. The grapplers came out on top posting a decisive 41-22 victory. Moe Fonacier and Jerome started things off by each pinning their adversaries in 2:51 and 2:00. Dave McNarney extended his winning streak by putting his man to the canvas in 3:08. Todd Lentz wrestled to a 5-5 draw.

Vince Nino added to Memorial's woes by pinning his man in 1:38. Sean Lennon assured the Eagles of a victory by beating his man 10-5. At 187 Steve Quimby received a forfeit and then Lamar Taylor clinched the victory for the Eagles with a pin in 1:16.

With a 6-6 overall record the Eagles entered the tough Mishawaka sectional and came out with two sectional champions, Dave McNarney at 128 pounds and Todd Lentz at 134 pounds.

As a team the Eagles finished fourth behind strong Penn, Mishawaka and Marian teams.

Where's our spirit?



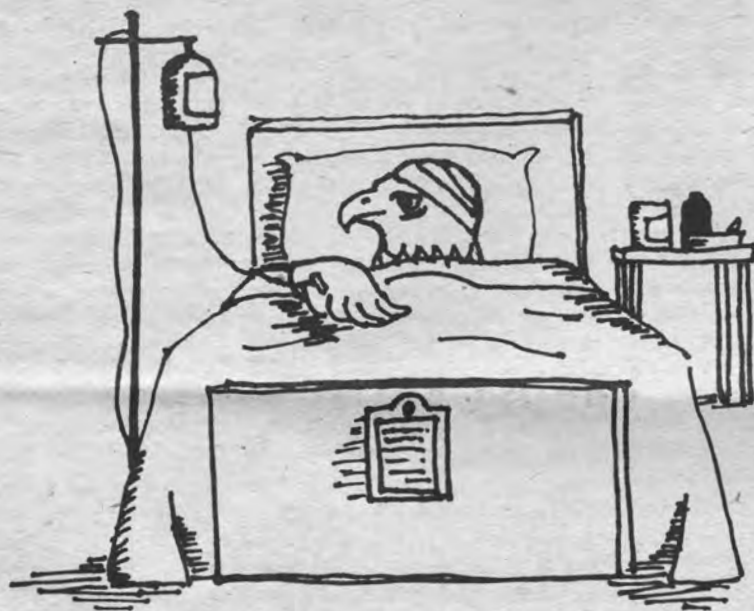
