Liu Grabs Research Grant

Adams senior Ted Liu was awarded a \$150 grant from the American Lung Association of Indiana last month. Ted received this most prestigious grant after he sent a proposal of this year's proposed research to the Lung Association last October.

Only eight grants are awarded to high school students in the entire state. In order to be eligible for the award, the project must deal with respiratory health. Ted's research deals with

Last year Ted performed research with laboratory mice to study their responses to increasing levels of treadmill exercise endurance training. This year's research is a continuation of last year's research; it is a comparative study of the effects of treadmill exercise training with comparable caloric expenditures to swimming exercise training. Ted commented, "I want to know if all the hype about running and exercise in general is valid.

Previous research done by scientists has shown that exercise does in fact decrease heart rate and the occurrence of coronary artherosolerosis, and increase the HDL cholestral levels. Furthermore, it has been shown that exercise training causes an increase in the maximum capacity to consume O2. Another more widely known fact obtained through research is that exercised animals gain significantly less weight than animals that are not exercised.

directly or indirectly related to exercise. Among these are hemoglobin levels (the fraction of blood which carries O2 through the blood), percentage of body mass gains, cholesterol levels, and blood glucose levels.


It is known that swimming and running are two of the most physiologically beneficial exercises. Yet, because of the different natures of the exercises, questions arise as to whether they cause the physiological benefits in the same quantities. The primary purpose of Ted's research is to determine and mathematically compare the physiological responses of swimming and treadmill running.

Ted will obtain this mathematical comparison through the use of a computer. "From the date, I will receive a function (a curve with plotted information on two axes). From the function, I will know the minimum amount of

exercise needed to obtain significant results," Ted explained.

Ted is a student in Adams' research biology class. Since 1977, 12 students in the class have been awarded 16 grants, ranging in value from \$100 to \$500. Five different organizations have awarded grants to these students, including the American Heart and Lung Association, Dow Chemical Company, the Indiana Academy of Science, and the American Association for Advanced Sciences. The class is under the guidance and supervision of Adams biology teacher Nevin Longenecker.

In the United States, the A.C. Nielson Co. compiles a weekly count of the viewing audience of the network's television shows. If the ratings are high for the show it will usually remain on the air and if the ratings are low for the show it will usually be cancelled or given a chance to prove itself in a new time slot. While the nation has the Nielson ratings, I thought it would be interesting to see if the weekly Nielson ratings are the same with both students and the faculty members. I asked fifty students and twenty-five faculty members their five favorite television shows and some of the results are surprising.

Such series as Fame (NBC), Square Pegs (CBS), The Facts of Life (NBC), and Dynasty (ABCS) were popular with students but were not chosen at all by the faculty. The faculty members chose 60 Minutes as their favorite show (12 faculty members chose it as one of their five favorite shows, while only 2 students chose the CBS newsmagazine). M*A*S*H was popular with both students and the faculty. It was first with the students and in third place with the faculty. Prime time soap operas fared well with students but differed with the faculty. ABC's Dynasty and

CBS's Dallas and Knots Landing tied at thirteenth place with students while faculty members chose Dallas as their fifth favorite, Knots Landing tied at seventeenth place and Dynasty, with no faculty member behind it, tied with thirty-eight other series at thirty-seventh place.

Differences in the nation and John Adams students were obvious with many shows. Fame, the NBC drama about teenagers attending the New York High School for the Performing Arts, was in second place with students but in the weekly Nielson ratings, it is often in the bottom twenty out of the weekly shows that range anywhere from sixty to eighty shows per week depending on the amount of specials and movies. 9 to 5, the ABC spinoff of the 1980 hit movie starring Jane Fonda, Dolly Parton, and Lily Tomlin, is recently a regular to the Nielson Top Ten since it was shifted from its original Thursday night spot to Tuesdays following the popular comedy, Three's Company. 9 to 5 tied at forty-three with only one student behind it. Other series that are weekly hits on the Nielson ratings but flopped on this survey were The Fall Guy (ABC), Three's Company (ABCS), Falcon Crest (CBS), The Love Boat (ABC), The


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1-2 But Safe at Home


