

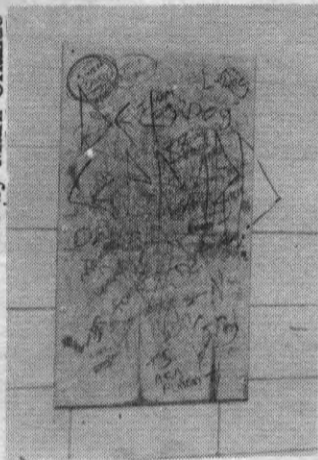
Graffiti Causes Concern

Students Awarded Grants

Matt Booty and Derek Lannuyer, both seniors in the John Adams research biology class, were selected to receive \$150 grants from the American Lung Association late last year, \$100 went to support their research, and \$50 was for their personal use.

Derek's project deals with how the body's immune system is affected by stress caused by sound, while Matt's concerns the effects of magnetic fields on molds that are found in human lungs.

Both Derek and Matt began their research work at the

beginning of their junior years, and used that work in their proposals for the Lung Association program. They have spent most of January doing the further studies and research needed for the Lung Association projects.

However, their work is hardly over. A detailed, finalized report of their projects must be sent to the Lung Association by March 10.

Furthermore, they both have to get ready for the American Lung Association convention to be held at the beginning of April. This convention includes a slide show and a formal speech describing

their research work and their findings. Also, Matt and Derek must put together exhibits which will be displayed at the convention.

The Lung Association convention is held in Indianapolis on April 11 and 12; the students will spend the night and will have the chance to discuss their work with scientists and other students.

All considered, the Lung Association grants are both an honor for the John Adams research program, and a chance for students like Matt and Derek to expand their research work even farther.

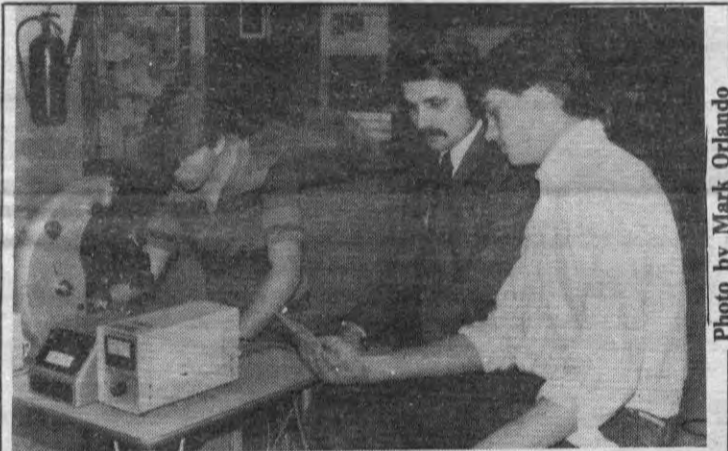

Adams Poms Dedicated

Some of the most dedicated people at Adams are not the athletes, but the girls on the 1983-84 Adams pompon squad. This season's squad consists of 16 members.

Work doesn't begin at the start of school for the pom pon squad. Tryouts take place in April of the previous school year.

The tryouts are a rigorous two weeks, commencing with the final selection of the team members. Each pom pon girl must perform two routines within their group of four people.

The selection, however, is based strictly on the individual. The person must show versatility with her dance, ability to work with others and can not be weak in any areas.

After the selection of the new squad members, they conduct their first practice in May. When school lets out, the pom pons practice four times a week in the

school parking lot, baking in the sun.

In the middle of July, the pom pon members go to camp at a regional college. The camp lasts three days, concentrating exclusively on pom pon routines.

During the three days, they must learn three new routines and then perform them in front of judges. For their routines they won the spirit award and the superstar trophy.

After a brief one-week vacation, the girls began pom pon practice again. This time around, they practiced with the marching band, while also preparing routines for pep assemblies.

It was difficult, performing to the totally different beats of a marching band and then a rock-n-roll tape, but the girls always looked sensational and in step at the football games and pep assemblies.

It takes three days to learn a new routine. The girls create the routines themselves to music, ranging from soul to rock to golden oldies.

The squad travelled to Munster in November to participate in a statewide competition. The Adams' group earned a third place in dance and second for a costume routine.

Since the beginning of basketball season, they have performed every halftime show at Adams.

In March, Adams will host a two-state competition. More than 20 schools from Indiana and Michigan have been invited to participate.

The pom pons are dedicated and deserve worthy appraisal from all.

"Contrary to ideas, we work really hard and rarely receive the recognition we deserve," said Jen Weamer.

Reforms Suggested

In order to improve the quality of today's schools, a return must be made to the basics of education.

Foremost among the necessary changes are firm and fair discipline codes. There comes a time when there is no longer anything available to make a child want to learn. A firm discipline code, however, will tell him that he has to learn. Too many students go through school never learning. There is no reason they should hinder students who are trying to get an education. If a student just slides through school, he will grow up believing he can slide through life, which is untrue. To be effective, the discipline code must be consistently applied.

Yet, if students would want to learn there would be no need for different discipline codes. Unlike their grandparents, they do not appreciate the value of an education. Starting in the elementary grades many things can be done to change attitudes about learning.

Too often students are scared away from learning by a bad experience with a teacher. Teaching is no longer the act of passing knowledge to those on the other side of the desk. It involves the whole teacher. Improving teacher preparation programs could show prospective teachers how to handle the public relations with their students. Maintaining their position of authority, teachers need to make school fun for the children, starting in the very beginning.

Improving textbooks would change many attitudes. Trying to read something written obscurely is frustrating to students. Textbooks should be written in simple language, using diagrams, maps and pictures to illustrate points.

I agree that the school year should be lengthened. The distance between school years is too long. Thus, a child forgets most of what he learned. By increasing the school year, a child's retention is increased.

I do, however, disagree with increasing the length of a school day. A young child's attention span is short. To demand an active child to sit still for that much longer would only frustrate him. The time would be spent watching the clock, daydreaming and fidgeting. Rather than increasing the length of a school day, the time should be more carefully budgeted.

Higher education requirements would do much to improve the quality of schools. There should be higher math and science requirements. All students should take a language. Although it may never be used, it will provide essential study habits. A

computer literacy course is a must. Computers are taking over today's society. They will dominate the world of tomorrow's generation. All students should take classes in the arts-either art, choir, drama, or music (performance or theory). There should be less electives. Students should not be permitted to take classes such as "Let's Have a Party" instead of a solid subject. Students are graduating without taking more than the required minimum of core subjects; and this needs to be remedied.

Teachers should not receive merit-based salaries. They should teach for the love of it and should always strive to do their best. Rather than telling a teacher what they will get if they teach well, they should be told what will happen if they don't teach their best.

Classes should be smaller. It is important, particularly in the elementary grades, for students to receive individualized attention. In a smaller setting learning problems can be more easily identified and dealt with.

Better facilities are needed for educating the handicapped. All children in America deserve the best education possible. If proper education is provided these children can become adults who are productive in our nation instead of dependant burdens.

Despite the dispute on what changes are necessary, it is agreed that the quality of our schools needs improvement. Changes must be made; for today's students are the leaders of tomorrow's generation.

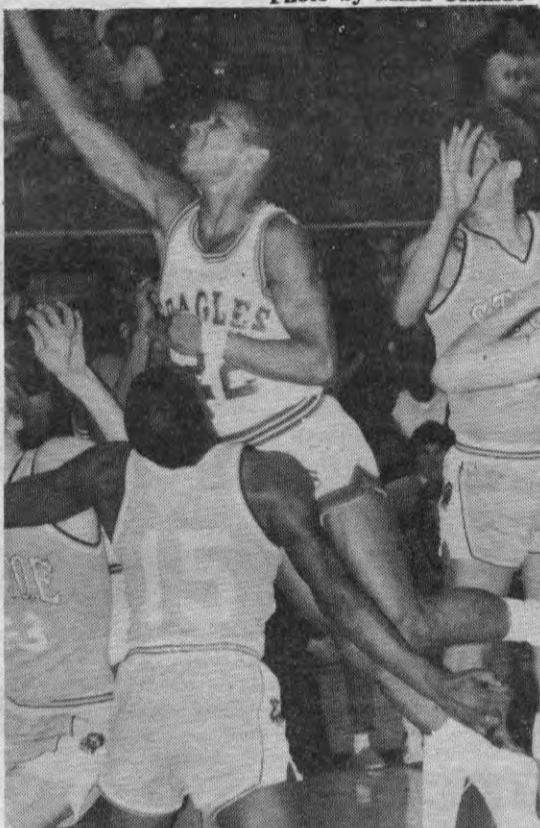
Laying it on the Line

a spirited rendition of "Happy Birthday," and next off she came on stage while Joel sang his big hit, "Uptown Girl." He concluded the show with "Big Shot."

The crowd was wild and waited ten minutes for an encore which they got in "Tell Her About It" after which he left. He came on for a second encore which included "You May Be Right." The third and final encore was "Only The Good Die Young" and a fitting end to a great concert, the likes of which haven't been seen in a while, and of which we hope to see more.

Silkwood Lacks Punch

"Silkwood" is supposedly one of those "main event" movies; it's the kind of movie that receives megatonnage of publicity, has people hailing it as the new trend in American movie-making, and draws large crowds of people all buzzing and talking on the opening night. The only problem with "Silkwood" is that quite frankly, it has no main event.

This is not to say that it lacks plot development. Actually, this is the movie's main problem; it tries to do too much in two hours.

Silkwood centers around the life of Karen Silkwood. Played by Merly Streep, she is an employee at a factory that makes radioactive pellets to be used in nuclear reactors. She shares the job with her live-in boyfriend, Kurt Russell, and her lesbian roommate, Cher. Together, the three of them begin to realize that the safety and concern for the workers at this plant is somewhat

under par.

This film starts out with a typical "let's-get-scared-about-a-nuclear-disaster" scenario, until Silkwood herself becomes exposed to "acceptable" levels of radiation. Then things really get rolling.

Karen Silkwood begins stealing photographs of defective materials at the nuclear facility to give to the union. The union won't help the workers there because it would upset the president of the facility. He practically owns the nearby town. Journalists also want the evidence for a juicy expose.

Meanwhile, Karen has to come to grips with the fact that she is slowly dying of cancer. Her boyfriend leaves her, her kids don't remember her and nobody at work likes her. As if that wasn't enough, her roommate decides to pick a live-in lesbian hairdresser roommate.

About half-way through this movie, there is a real temptation to say "Stop! What exactly is

going on here?" The movie lacks a central point. "Silkwood" can't decide if it should focus on Karen's personal problems, her attempts to bring the union into the plant, or the safety and social problems surrounding nuclear facilities. There's just too much going on to get earnestly interested in the whole affair. The overall effect is like reading twenty pages of a book and then being forced to start another one.

"Silkwood" is a cinematically glossy and technically well made movie. Meryl Streep, Cher, and especially Kurt Russell turn out rare-form performances, and "Silkwood" definitely has some touching moments; but it lacks a main event.
