Adams Loses to Elkhart and Roosevelt

In spite of our team's efforts last Friday night, we were unable to march home from Elkhart with a victory. Indeed, the outcome was quite different as the Blue Blazers trampled the Eagles, 66-45.

The beginning of the game was hopeful. After the first few minutes the Eagle defense proved to be ineffective. The score at the end of the quarter was 17-5.

The second quarter brought a slight revival from the Adams squad. They started to hit and get rebounds. They were at a loss as to what to do about the big boy on the Elkhart team, Likens, 6'8". By the end of the quarter they were still lagging badly behind, 43-18.

The third quarter looked for a few minutes like it might bring an Adams comeback. The Eagles began to press the efficient Blue Blazers and gained a little. They only gained to turn around and lose it again. Third quarter score was 52-31.

The fourth quarter was much a repeat of all the others. The Eagles were fighting as hard as they were able to. Final score, 66-45.

Don Oakes scored 22 points and Shennenberger scored 13 points.

ROOSEVELT 52; ADAMS 45

Last Tuesday night in East Chicago Roosevelt's auditorium the Eagles met a foe determined to send them home with a loss. The game was played before a very sparse crowd with as many Adams rooters there as East Chicago fans. From the start when Adams gained the tip-off, it looked like a conquest for the Eagles. Adams started playing rather conservative ball and were using a man-to-man defense like their opponents. The Rough Riders were picking the rebounds and started to edge the Eagles. In the second quarter Roosevelt picked up momentum and appeared to hit on most everything. The Eagle defense was a little tighter, but they weren't getting the rebounds yet and consequently they had fewer shots. The halftime score was 27-20.

The third quarter brought a considerable pickup in the Eagle ball handling and fight, but the Riders were deadly on under the basket lay-ins and long shots. The fourth quarter was about the same as the third with the Eagles trying, and scoring, but East Chicago just didn't miss much.

In points, Oakes was again high for the Eagles with 15 and Pfaff nosed in for a close second with 14 points.
