Even though we were living in Ohio, West Virginia was still home. Living 300 miles from WVU and born in Ohio, Dylan surprisingly felt like WV was his "Home." Eventually he would have the chance to make that choice.

Flash forward to 2015, acceptance letter in hand, orientation completed, dorm selected and classes picked, Dylan was WVU bound. No other school was considered. As August rolled around, the car was packed and my wife Belinda and myself headed out to drop off Dylan in "a different" Sunnyside than we had left 20 years before. After moving him into the Honor's dorm and saying our goodbyes, my wife and I headed off to High Street for some "Remember When's." Gone now is Nehlen, Bucklew, "The Pit," Superette, Nick's Cantina, the Dungeon, Mario's Backdoor, Chaser's, Speedy's, BW3, Warner Theater, and Yahn's Hot Dogs. New to us is Huggins, Gee, Sheetz, Tailpipes, Taziki's, the REC Center, and Evansdale Crossing. My girlfriend throughout my time in Morgantown, who is now my wife of 23 years, talked about friends, classes, night outs, professors and how much we enjoyed our days at WVU. Reminiscing all evening long almost made us forget about the upcoming 300 mile journey west and that upon arrival home, our house would be a person short for the next 9 months.

Dylan was about to embark on the same adventure that we started in 1989 - He was about start his "Remember When's," make new friends, and have incredible experiences at this new and improved WVU. It was his time to carry on the "LET'S GO" in Morgantown. Two years from now I will watch by son accept his diploma that will end his time at WVU and start a new incredible adventure with a Computer Science degree. Ten years from now I envision watching the sparkle in the eyes of my grandchildren when they see the Mountaineer for the first time. Twenty years from now I envision the day when that acceptance letter arrives from WVU for my grandchildren to carry on this legacy that my wife and I started 28 years ago.
