Prep Football Honors the Class of '63

St. Peter's Prep (63) at Ferris (6)

Brandon Wimush threw for four first-quarter touchdowns and ran for another score as St. Peter's Prep, No. 3 in the NJ.com Top 20, defeated Ferris, 63-6, at Caven Point in Jersey City.

Wimush, a Notre Dame commit, completed 9-of-11 passes for 207 yards and opened the scoring with touchdowns of 20 and 16 yards to Fordham commit Corey Caddle. Dennis James also had two first quarter touchdown catches, the later, a 60-yard strike, gave St. Peter's Prep a 42-0 lead. Wimush also ran for a 30-yard touchdown.

St. Peter's Prep got rushing touchdowns from Alabama commit Minkah Fitzpatrick as well as Tyler Martino, Michael Kennedy and Jonathan Lewis.

Brandon Wimbush decommits from Penn State, commits to Notre Dame

Brandon Wimbush has decommitted from Penn State and announced his commitment to Notre Dame, according to 247Sports.

The 6-foot-2, 200-pound senior quarterback from St. Peter's Prep (Jersey City, N.J.) visited South Bend over the weekend. He originally committed to Penn State in May.



Wimbush is a huge addition to a Notre Dame recruiting class that lacked a quarterback following the decommitment of California signal caller Blake Barnett.

Wimbush has enjoyed a superb senior campaign thus far, throwing 1,112 yards and 12 touchdowns in just four games. He's rushed for an additional three scores.

According to the 247Composite, Wimbush is the nation's No. 4 dual-threat quarterback and the No. 70 recruit overall.

Rich Hansen discusses Brandon Wimbush flip from Penn State to Notre Dame

Tuesday, **Brandon Wimbush**, the No. 1 player in **the NJ.com Top 50**, flipped **his commitment from Penn State to Notre Dame**, sending shock waves through the national recruiting landscape. NJ Advance Media caught up with St. Peter's Prep (Jersey City, N.J.) head coach Rich Hansen to discuss his star player's decision.

"I think he just felt there was a level of discomfort with Penn State, which made him want to visit. Notre Dame was his other choice, really, and he visited and just loved it," said Hansen of his 6-2, 215-pound senior quarterback. "He felt really comfortable, felt like it was a good fit."

According to Hansen, Notre Dame runs an offense similar to what he runs at St. Peter's, and they are also renowned for the strength of their business program.

"The (Notre Dame) offense is a version of what we do," said Hansen. "I actually got a lot of it from Kelly. So he just feels really comfortable there. And he wants to major in finance and Notre Dame is an unbelievable school for finance."

What made Wimbush, **who initially committed to Penn State in May**, uncomfortable about his future with Penn State?






























"I don't know if it was any one thing. I think that the quarterback picture (was an issue). And they (Penn State) were very up front. They weren't really sure that they were gonna offer a quarterback in this class. But when they watched him and he had interest, they decided that he was too good to pass up. So I think there is a logjam there and I think they just red-shirted the other two guys."




Hansen added: "He's a competitor and he'll battle anybody for a job, but I think his understanding of it and what he later on saw it to be were two different things. And I think he felt a little uncomfortable with that. And I just think from a big picture standpoint, he feels that Notre Dame is the right place for him. It's not anything wrong with Penn State. It's a great place, obviously. But I just feel like he got a different kind of feeling when he went to Notre Dame and just felt like it was more suited for him."

Wimbush, a four-star recruit and Under Armour All-American, also holds offers from LSU, Ohio State, Stanford, Miami (Fla.), South Carolina, Tennessee, Michigan State, Nebraska, Virginia Tech, Virginia, Boston College, Syracuse, Maryland, UConn and Temple, to name a few.
