# **St. Peter's Prep football will head to Ireland next fall, first N.J. team to play overseas**

For the first time in state history, a New Jersey football team will play overseas.

On Thursday, St. Peter's Prep coach Rich Hansen informed NJ.com that he and his Marauders will pack their bags in early September and travel to Europe.

On Sept. 2, 2016, St. Peter's Prep, the defending Non-Public, Group 4 sectional champions, will hit the gridiron in Dublin, Ireland, versus an opponent to be determined. Prep's opponent is expected to be announced in the coming weeks.



The Marauders will be traveling overseas to participate in a game that is an official event of the Aer Lingus College Football Classic, which will be played at Aviva Stadium in Dublin on Sept. 3. Georgia Tech and Boston College will face off in that main event.

"Honestly, I think it's a reward for the success we've had," Hansen said. "In events like this, they look for programs of a certain criteria. They want players who work hard and coaches who work hard."

"This is going to be a great opportunity for our kids to represent our school, New Jersey and the rest of the country. This is also a great opportunity for some of our alumni. There are a lot of programs over there for them to enjoy. We're excited for this."

The feeling is mutual from the Irish side.

"We are excited to have some of America's top high school teams go over to Ireland for one of the most memorable experiences of their lives," said John Anthony, CEO of Anthony Travel and a Director of Irish American Events Ltd, in a press release. "This is a game they will be telling their grandchildren about someday. We look forward to thousands of American football fans traveling across the Atlantic to join local fans and share this amazing educational, cultural and sports experience."

St. Peter's Prep is one of six high school teams from the United States and Mexico who have committed to head to Ireland in early September. More teams are expected to be added to the list. Currently, the Marauders are joined by Belen Jesuit (Florida), Marist High (Georgia), Blessed Trinity (Georgia), Buford High (Georgia) and Prepa Tec of Mexico City, Mexico.



"As far as my understanding, they are the first school to ever play outside the continental United States," NJSIAA Assistant Director Jack DuBois said. "No New Jersey school has ever gone and played overseas."

"I think it's an outstanding and exciting opportunity for those student athletes. They will be able to benefit from this both athletically and educationally."

With the Sept. 2 date, It's currently unclear whether the game in Ireland would count toward the Marauders' regular season record, Hansen said.

"The date would technically fall under week zero, which has to be approved by the state," Hansen said. "The body will be voting on everything in December. If week zero is voted down, I've already spoken to the state about this and we'll be ready to file an appeal. I highly doubt it will get voted down, though."

So how did the Marauders end up getting themselves involved here? It was a long process, Hansen said with a laugh.



“Basically, the company that puts it all on reached out to marquee schools on their list,” Hansen said. “The possibility of being one of the schools considered was presented to us at the end of April and we’ve been moving forward since then. We committed and moved forward with the contracts.

“There’s a large cost to it, but it’s a great opportunity for us. There will be plenty of community service opportunities for us over

there, which will be good for our team and program.”

Per Hansen, the cost for a school to participate in this tournament is broken down into different brackets. For the Marauders, the total cost for each player is right around \$1,700. It’s a large chunk of change, but a plan has been set to get everyone to Ireland, Hansen said.

“Part of it will be fundraising and part of it will come from our budget,” Hansen said. “We’re going to have around 65 players traveling with us. We expect to receive plenty of alumni contributions as well.

“This is a big endeavor for us. We’ve been all over the place to play some of the top teams in the country, but we’ve never been to Dublin (laugh). This is a chance for us to go out and do something really cool and unique together.”
