No. 1 Bergen Catholic sends another statement in victory over No. 5 St. Peter's

For the second consecutive week, a statement was made in Oradell.

Last Saturday, No. 1 Bergen Catholic destroyed American Heritage (Fla.) by a score of 37-7 and this week, the Crusaders had another dominant showing, knocking off No. 5 St. Peter's Prep 47-14.

Similar to the victory last week, Bergen Catholic controlled things from the opening whistle and controlled the pace of the game throughout.

Both the offense and defense looked much more physical than St. Peter's Prep, with it all starting up front on the lines.

Bergen Catholic opened the scoring at 6-0 with 4:51 remaining in the first quarter following a one-yard touchdown run by quarterback Jarrett Guarantano. Then, late in the first, star defensemen Frankie Feaster intercepted a Johnathan Lewis pass attempt and took it back 25 yards for a touchdown.

Running back Melvin Covin then made it 20-0 with 9:25 to go in the second quarter on a one-yard rush. Fellow running back Ryan McCarthy made it 26-0 on a 10-yard run less than two minutes later. Covin added another rushing touchdown with less than four minutes to go in the half to make it 33-0 Bergen Catholic.

St. Peter's Prep got on the board right before halftime when quarterback Maasai Maynor hit Kolton Huber for an eight-yard touchdown. Maynor took over in the second quarter for Lewis, who was benched by St. Peter's Prep head coach Rich Hansen.

In the second half, Guarantano and McCarthy both added touchdown runs, while Maynor threw a touchdown to Jorge Portoreal to close the scoring a 47-14. McCarthy was the workhorse at running back for the Crusaders, finishing with 116 yards and the two scores.

Guarantano, who Bergen Catholic head coach Nunzio Campanile said had his best game of his career, finished Saturday's contest with 155 passing yards and 75 rushing yards, with the two touchdowns.


Player of the Game: It's hard to pick one from this contest, but I'm going to go with Jarrett Guarantano once again this week. The Tennessee commit has the Crusaders' offense clicking right now and it's going to be tough for any defense to stop this team in 2015. Guarantano finished with 230 total yards and two touchdowns on Saturday. This included 75 rushing yards, which really wore down the Maruaders' defense. Prior to today's contest, I said that if Guarantano could make plays with his legs, it would hurt St. Peter's Prep. Guarantano did, and it did.

Play of the game: With the score 6-0 in favor of Bergen Catholic in the first quarter, St. Peter's Prep had the rock and was looking to even things up. However, Frankie Feaster had other ideas. Feaster read a pass attempt by quarterback Johnathan Lewis perfectly and jumped in front of the ball for an interception. Then, Feaster broke free from a would-be tackler and took the ball to the house for six. The score gave Bergen Catholic an early 13-0 lead.

Back to the drawing board for Prep: Last week, St. Peter's Prep came out sluggish against The Avalon School (Md.) and the same thing was the case vs. Bergen Catholic. The offense couldn't get into a rhythm and the defense allowed far too many big plays. Lewis had a rough outing, which included an interception and a fumble. Both plays led to Crusader points. Lewis was benched for Maasai Maynor late in the first half. Following the contest, head coach Rich Hansen said there will be an open competition for the starting job next week, but he's confident Lewis will be able to bounce back.



So with Saturday rapidly approaching, here's a look at five players in the game to keep an eye on.


