Red Wings Clip Generals

In Rookie League Action

Behind the brilliant pitching of Pete Sack and the timely hitting of Joe Parkes and Tim Hawkes, the Red Wings unveiled a major upset in the Jersey City Recreation Rookie League yesterday with an 8-2 triumph over the second-place Generals.

Sack limited the Generals to four hits and fanned eight batters while Parkes, an All-County outfielder, chipped in with three hits including a pair of doubles. Hawkes also had a triple and two singles. Jim Rooney starred defensively for the victors.

THE FRONT-running Cas' Comets remained at the top of the heap with a nerve-tingling 3-1 win over Terminal Laundry while St. Bridget's moved into second place with a 9-3 decision over Terminal Laundry and a come-from-behind 9-8 verdict over the Rams. In another game, the Vikings registered their first win with a 8-7 victory over the Dukers.

Jack O'Dea of the Comets hurled a no-hitter for six and a third innings before Bob Tarencz broke up his bid for a hitless performance with a single. A walk brought Joe Sack to the mound for the Comets. Sack gave up a walk and single and left the sacks bulging before O'Dea came back into the game to strike out losing pitcher Frank Nicodemo.

O'Dea, in winning his fourth game for the Comets, struck out 17 of 21 batters. A two-run single by Mike Kosc and a run scoring bingle by Dennis Barrett accounted for the Comet runs. The Comets meet the Rams tonight at 8:15 at Pershing Field.

ST. BRIDGET'S seemed headed for defeat against the Rams who

held a 8-3 lead after five innings. But three run rallies in the final two frames changed the complexion of the game. Ed Pierce, Dennis Richardson and Jack Cullen belted doubles in the final frame for the winning margin. Mike Cappa was the loser with Julie Rothstein belting two triples and a pair of single for the losers. Homers by Pedro Burgos and Ed Pierce and the pitching of Dennis Richardson paced St. Bridget's over Terminal.
