### Kidnaped from Stalled Car In Plainfield

PLAINFIELD (UPI)-The wives of a Mack Truck Co. vice presidept and a Wall Street bond broker were apparently murdered today a few hours after they were reported abducted from their auto by-two men, police

Police arrested one suspect within a few hours after the bodies were found, and said they expected to pick up a second man shortly. They refused to identify the suspect.

### **Bodies Found**

The bodies of Mrs. Elliott G. Ewell of Westfield, wife of the Mack executive, and Mrs. Robert Tyson, 50, of Plainfield were found on a small, deadend street here.

One apparently had been strangled and the other deliberately run over by a car, police said. Tyson said he had been to dinner with his wife, Mrs. Ewell and her son James, but that he had left early because he was not feeling well.

# Job Hinges On Win by Gangemi

Hudson County Register John M. Deegan already has been tabbed as the next county supervisor, if Supervisor Gangemi is elected mayor of Jersey City June 13.

After Gangemi disclosed that he would step down from the county post if elected mayor, former Mayor John V. Kenny said Deegan would make "a good successor" to Gangemi in the supervisor's post.

KENNY POINTED out that Deegan was Gangemi's predecessor in the job and said he has "experience and ability."

Under the law, the county freeholders can elect anyone supervisor to fill a vacancy caused by a resignation.

Gangemi's successor would serve until the expiration of his present term, at the end of 1963. Gangemi was reelected last November for a second term.

# FAA Head Backs Jets At Newark

NEW YORK (UPI)-The director of the Federal Aviation Agency sees no reason why jet aircraft cannot operate at Newark Airport.

FAA Director Najeeb E. Halaby expressed his opinion about jets at Newark in a letter to John R. Wiley, director of aviation for the Port of New York Authority which operates Newark Airport and other air terminals in the New York metropolitan area.

The letter, sent May 22, was made public Thursday.

### Jets Forbidden

Jet aircraft are forbidden to use Newark Airport except in cases of emergency. They may use the airfield if weather conditions prevent them from landing at New York's Idlewild Airport.

The FAA administrator said in his letter no "planning or operational reasons" exist why "turbo jet aircraft could not be operated at Newark Airport."

# 2 Cagemen Foul Out at Seton Hall

SCUTH ORANGE (UPI) — Two
Seton Hall University basketball
players named in the point-shaving scandals have been expelled.

Msgr. John J. Dougherty, university president, said the boys
were officially dropped from the
university rolls as of April 12.
They were identified as Art Hicks
of Chicago and Henry Gunter
of New York.

### Points Shaved

The boys were suspended from the school last March 17 after New York District Attorney Frank Hogan announced their alleged roles in the nationwide basket-ball bribe scandal.

The boys were said to have conspired to shave points in seven Seton Hall games. Hogan had said they received \$1,000 each for losing to Duke University Feb. 23 in Madison Square Garden and another \$1,000 apiece for shaving points in the school's loss to the University of Dayton Feb. 9.

Neither of the boys faces criminal charges. New York City authorities said both have cooperated fully with the district attorney's investigation.

Future of Sport Studied

Doughterty also announced Thursday that a special committe had been set up at the school to consider the future of basketball at the university.

The Rev. Edward R. Fleming, chairman of the committee, aid the group had been holding regular meetings since the middle of March.

A report was expected sometime this summer on whether the university would de emphasize basketball next winter.

# Laugh's on New York

One of the funniest publicity stunts in years was that race across Manhattan involving a motor scooter, a taxicab, a knousine, a horse-drawn carriage and a man on foot — the latter, Kyle Rote of the New York Football Giants.

The scooter won by mere seconds over the cab; the limousine was an unimpressive third; the horse and carriage a distant fourth; and the man, dead last. It was side-splitting fun as they struggled slowly through the impeding crush of cars, cabs and trucks.

It also proved once again that New York slowly is being strangled by its own traffic. Moreover, it repeated dramatically one of the most powerful arguments for the removal of industry to this side of the Hudson.

York en masse, we hope, will be the food industry. This now is expensively scattered about Manhattan and, therefore, the victim of most wasteful traffic congestion.

It is interesting to note that while New York was laughing over the bizarre race through traffic-choked streets the New Jersey Public Market Commission quietly was inviting engineering bids to speed construction of a vast metropolitan food distribution center whose first units are expected to be occupied by 1963.
