St. Peter's Prep baseball to lean on returning core for leadership in 2014

Amid the names and numbers that filled his scorebook a year ago, St. Peter's Prep coach Pat Laguerre has used this preseason to focus on the ones of who will lead the next class of Marauders.

Pushing past a talented senior class that carried Prep to the Non-Public, North A semifinals last season, the fourth-year coach is now eyeing the likes of seniors T.J. Ward, Mike Cirilo and Vinny Sita, as well as juniors Corey Caddle, Kyle Bowes, Mike Marino and Dan Cooney, to take the torch and carry a young Marauder squad in 2014.

"Losing (13 guys) can make you a little nervous, but this is where you rely on the kids who played last year – the Wards, the Bowes, the Cooneys, the Caddles," said Laguerre, who guided Prep to a county title last year. "I think those guys will be challenged this year, but I think they'll respond well."

Ward will be the headliner of that bunch after a 2013 campaign which saw him selected to the First Team All-Hudson and Second Team All-Non-Public squads. The senior shortstop is headed to the University of Hartford to play baseball next year.

"We know what T.J. is going to be on the field and I think he understands now that he needs to take a more active role and more ownership of the team," said Laguerre. "He's going to be the one to set the table for us and he's embraced that role."

For Ward, the biggest aspect as the go-to guy for the Marauders this preseason has been to acclimate some of Prep's younger players to the nuances of the varsity level, including the pace of play and the thinking that goes into certain situations.

"I've been lucky to have strong senior leadership in the past, so it's been fun to take over that role and show the younger guys some things," said Ward, who went 2-for-3 in last year's county title game. "They come up to me with questions after every game and every practice and I think they'll pick things up as we go along and we'll have a good season."

However, Ward isn't alone in bringing the new guys into the fold, as the Marauders' junior class also brings back a wealth of experience and talent.

Caddle, who will play center field and pitch this year, was honored as a Third Team All-Hudson selection in 2013, while Bowes (left field), Marino (second base) and Cooney (closer) all provided valuable innings for a Prep team that went 26-4 and finished No. 6 in the state.

"I'm going to take a lot of the responsibility as the shortstop and returning guy, but I don't feel much added pressure at all coming into this year," said Ward. "Guys like Caddle, Bowes, Marino and Cooney are going to be a big part of our team, play every day and produce even more than they did last year.

"Their play is going to be pretty important this year and I know they're ready for it."

On the mound, Prep will be tasked with replacing Ryan O'Connor (Second Team All-State), Anthony Pacillo (Second Team All-Non-Public) and Ryan Finn (Second Team All-Hudson). In addition to Caddle, Laguerre hopes to use juniors Joe Kopacz, Antonio Velardi, Anthony Colegrove and Stephen Kellner as well as sophomore Nick Cerbone to fill those voids.

St. Joseph (Mont.) transfer Nick Camilleri will manage that staff, taking over behind the dish for the Marauders.

While a lot of those names lack the fanfare of the ones they are replacing, Laguerre still believes that Prep can expect to have a strong year in 2014, starting with a contest against Marist on Tuesday, April 1.

"Even though the cast of characters is different, this team isn't depleted in terms of talent, so I haven't preached anything different this year and the expectations are going to be the same," said Laguerre. "It's going to take a little bit of time to get experience and there will be some tough periods and some adjustments, but I expect us to hit the ground running.

"I'm just hoping to stay healthy, stay together and let our talent dictate where the season is going to take us."

The Claws have played in Lakewood since 2001 and, in that time, 57 Lakewood players have made it to The Show. In baseball, the big leap in talent is to the Bigs; the talent levels in the minor leagues, from A to AAA, are closer than you would think. I have seen many of them, but my favorite is **Josh Outman**. Is that a great name for a pitcher, or what? He, Matt Maloney and Carlos Carasco were the mainstays of the rotation in 2006 and, behind them, the Claws waltzed to the SAL title.

When I saw Jason Donald play a few games, I thought he would eventually be the successor to former MVP Jimmy Rollins at SS for the big club, but he went to Cleveland in one of the Cliff Lee deals (there were two). But Donald does have a claim to fame: he was the batter incorrectly called safe to spoil Detroit Tiger pitcher Armando Gallaraga's perfect game with 2 out in the 9th.

With Lakewood, Ryan Howard only hit 19 dingers in a 140 game season, then hit 58 in his MVP year with the Philz and almost 200 in 4 seasons. First Energy Park is actually a tougher place to hit one out than Citizens Bank Park, but still. Go figure. After seeing him a few times in Lakewood, we (Biff, Jeff and I -- my Monmouth Park crew) all thought he ***might*** make it.

We saw 2008 World Series MVP Cole Hamels and Gavin Floyd once each -- we had no doubt about them. Then there was Eugenio Velez. He was in for a playoff game with a Giant affiliate in the fall of 2006. When we watched him, we thought ***WOW !!!***. Velez was the 2006 SAL MVP and by May of the following year, he was playing LF for the San Francisco Giants.

I was at a game against a team in the Astros organization and their third baseman was Roger Clemens's son. Clemens had pitched for the Yankees a day or two earlier and he got permission not to dress for the Evil Empire. Instead, he humped out to Lakewood to see sonny. So Rog was in the house. Young Clemens reminded me a lot of myself as a ballplayer-- he couldn't field and he certainly couldn't hit. I think he was on the roster only in deference to his dad.

It's been fun for me to watch the Claws and play scout and try to guess who among them was a future Major Leaguer.

So why should you care about any of this drivels ?

You'll find out soon enough.....

NEW YORK – In 1911, the Giants reestablished themselves as the preeminent baseball club in the National League. Manager ‘Mugsy’ McGraw’s youngsters were coming of age, and beginning to prosper. Finally, it seemed that the shades of Fred Merkle’s mental error that fans thought cost the Giants the pennant in 1908 were beginning to dissipate. Though the years since had proven to be an uphill battle to supplant either Chicago or Pittsburgh at the top of the standings, in 1911, with a new style of play, the Jints found themselves in serious World Series contention for the first time in almost three years.

Unlike the New York teams of the prior decade, these men of Coogan’s Bluff terrorized their foes along the base paths, stealing a record 347 bases. Josh Devore led the Giants in that category, with 61 swipes. Fred Snodgrass contributed 51, with Merkle close behind at 49. Tied for fourth place were John Joseph ‘Red’ Murray and Charles ‘Buck’ Herzog, with 48 each.

However, had it not been for stellar pitching, none of these players would have ever seen postseason play that year. Richard ‘Rube’ Marquard, now in his third full season, began to fulfill his supposed potential – perhaps squelching the throats of the naysayers who felt his \$11,000 purchase price in 1908 was a ludicrous figure. Rightly so, as Rube had posted a 9-18 win loss record for his career up to that point. Now, mastering his control as well as a forkball changeup, Marquard finished the 1911 season winning 24 games, and losing 7, topping the league with a .774 winning percentage, in addition to a robust 237 strikeouts. But it was Marquard’s teammate, Christopher Mathewson, who would be remembered as the dominant pitcher of the staff, as well as the dominate pitcher of the era.

St. Peter's Prep track coach bids farewell at Meet of Champions

Since 1983, plenty has changed within the St. Peter's Prep athletic program, but one of the things that has become commonplace, however, is the presence of track coach Mike Burgess. Today, Burgess coached in his final outdoor track meet at the NJSIAA Meet of Champions.

While Burgess will remain the coach of the St. Peter's cross country team, he will retire from his duties with the indoor and outdoor track teams.

"It's been a good run," Burgess said. "I've been fortunate enough to coach some great kids, witness some great success stories, and make some great memories."

Senior runner Randall Wall, who took seventh place in the 110-meter hurdles, said he owes much of his success to his coach.

"Coach Burgess discovered me and it's ironic that he's coaching in his final meet with me running," said Wall. "I'm so grateful for having the chance to run for him."

Burgess will hand over the reins of the Prep indoor and outdoor track program to one of his current assistants, **Chris Caulfield, Prep '03**.

It is a bitter sweet ending for Burgess, who has no regrets about how he ran one of the top programs in Hudson County for the past thirty years.

"If I had to do it all over again, I wouldn't change a thing," Burgess said. "It wasn't about the wins and losses, it's about the great kids that I've coached and the great establishment that is St. Peter's Prep."

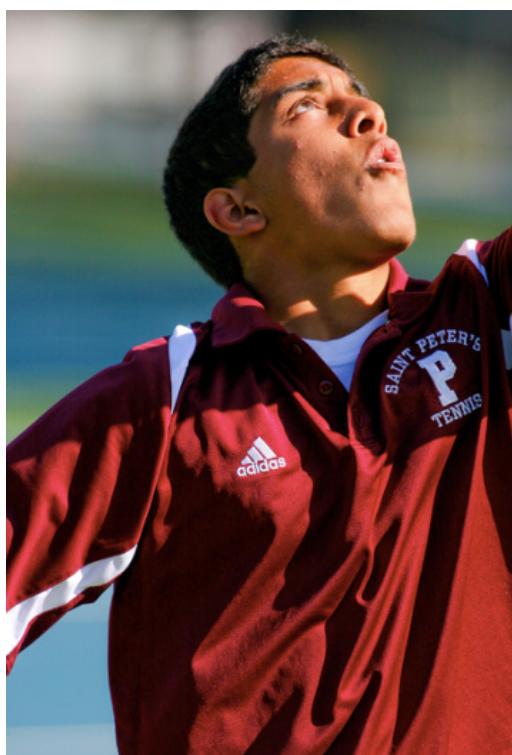
