# Prep Wins All Five County Tennis Finals!!

It was not always easy, but on Cinco de Mayo, St. Peter's Prep's tennis team was a perfect five for five.

The Marauders swept the HCLAL Individual Tennis Championships yesterday at Lincoln Park, claiming victory in each of the tournament's five categories.

However, despite a total effort from the entire team, freshman Rohan Singh stole the show during his singles match against North Bergen senior and defending county champion, Jonathan Paredes.

After a hard-fought marathon, with the two stars trading points back and forth, finally it was Singh who claimed victory, 6-4, 4-6, 7-6, 8-6, in a match that went to a tie break.

"I've been thinking about this day, but I never thought it would actually happen," Singh said. "It was a very grueling match and I'm glad I was able to come through at the end, despite how tiring it was.

"It was great having my team behind me — they really helped me get through there at the end."

Fighting against the daylight, and with a crowd cheering on its feet for the last several points of the game, the relief on Singh's face was apparent after he finally clinched what he described as being a "frustrating" match. In the end, the freshman showed nothing but admiration for Paredes, who battled through a blister and two broken rackets.

"I don't think I have ever played in a match that long before," Singh said. "Jonathan is such a great player and he had some bad luck, but fortunately for me it worked in my favor."

In the second singles match, it was Prep senior Conor Golway defeating Mark German of Secaucus, 6-1, 6-1. A defending county champion himself, Golway was not only thrilled to defend his own title, but to see his fellow teammates perform at a high level after a disappointing finish in last year's county championships.

"It's been a great run these past two years, but this year definitely feels much better," Golway said. "Last year winning was great, but it was tough to see some of the other guys lose their matches, so it felt a lot better to see everyone win today."

To close out the third and final singles match of the tournament, junior Gabe Russotto of St. Peter's knocked off North Bergen's Jason Pumpa, 6-2, 6-1. Following a loss to Bayonne in doubles last season, Russotto was able to overcome some early jitters and avenge last year's defeat.

"In the beginning I was a little nervous, but as we went along I began hitting the ball like I usually do and placing my shots better," Russotto said. "After losing to Bayonne in three sets last year, I knew that I never wanted to feel like that again, so I just made sure that it wouldn't happen."



In the first doubles category, the duo of Prep senior Andrew Capobianco and freshman Zachary Joskowicz defeated North Bergen's Juan Alcalde and Carlos Quintero, 6-4, 6-1. Despite the large gap in age, the two have developed a connection that few others can rival.

"It was crazy at first, but we've really connected," Capobianco said. "Today, we just didn't want to go to a third set, so we knew we needed to finish and just keep our momentum up to pull through."

"We're different in years, but we definitely have the same personalities and it makes for great chemistry," Joskowicz added.

Finally, Prep senior and defending county champion Matthew Jasko, along with junior Quinn Williamson, overcame an early deficit to knock off North Bergen's Luis Rojas and Brandon Cancio, 3-6, 6-1, 6-3, in the second doubles category.

"When you lose the first set you get down on yourself," Williamson said. "But we talked it over with each other and we knew we could come back strong and win."

"Having been here four years, I think this is the best team that I've been on," added Jasko, who became the Marauders' all-time winningest doubles player yesterday. "I'm really excited about what we can do not only in the county, but also in the state."

## Brandon Wimbush, the top QB in New Jersey, commits to Penn State

Brandon Wimbush, the top quarterback in New Jersey, has committed to Penn State. The 6-2, 215-pound St. Peter's Prep (Jersey City, N.J.) standout, made his announcement Tuesday evening at a commitment ceremony held at a restaurant in Teaneck, N.J., while surrounded by close friends and family.

Wimbush, whose mother also attended Penn State, selected the Nittany Lions out of a final five list of schools including Ohio State, Miami (Fla.), Virginia Tech and Boston College. He also held offers from Rutgers, Alabama, LSU, Michigan State, Tennessee, South Carolina, Nebraska, Maryland and others.

"It came down to my relationship with the staff and how I felt up there on campus and around the guys," said Wimbush, the No. 7 recruit in the NJ.com Top 50. "Just meeting with them, I felt very comfortable. And I feel like everything surrounding the program has a positive feel, so I wanted to be a part of that and help get the ball rolling."

The Penn State roster is already deep at the quarterback position, but Wimbush has been assured he'll get an opportunity to compete from day one.

"My expectations are to come in freshman year and compete as much as I can," he said. "Coach (James) Franklin told me, 'Whatever happens, happens. If you beat out (Christian) Hackenberg, you beat out Hackenberg. If you beat out (Michael) O'Connor, you beat out O'Connor.' But I'm not gonna sit here and say I'm gonna beat out Hackenberg because he's a heck of a quarterback."



"I would like to go behind him, learn, take a year and just keep competing. They've got (Trace) McSorley and the other guys behind him, so it's a whole bunch of guys up there. But wherever I go, I know I'm gonna have to compete."

As a junior, Wimbush connected on 93 of 156 passes for 1,472 yards and 14 touchdowns, while rushing for 578 yards and seven touchdowns on the ground.

His efforts helped lead his team to an NJSIAA Non-public, Group 4 finals appearance, which the Marauders ultimately lost to Paramus Catholic, 13-6.

Following the 2013 season, Wimbush was selected Second Team All-State, First Team All-Non-public and First Team All-Hudson County by the Star-Ledger.

He also won Quarterback MVP at Rivals Camp New Jersey and a ticket to the Elite 11 finals in Beaverton, Ore. following another standout display at an eastern regional Elite 11 camp in Washington, D.C., in April.

Wimbush is a consensus four-star recruit, according to the multiple recruiting networks and is ranked as high as the No. 107 player in the country by ESPN.

His physical gifts include an athletic build, a live arm, mobile pocket presence and the athletic ability to tuck and run or extend the play to pass.



"I see myself as a pro-style quarterback, so I fit their style of offense, definitely," said Wimbush. "Being able to run and break down a play, it's needed. They feel like I can come in there and use my abilities to our advantage and cause headaches for the defense."

Wimbush is happy to finally put the recruiting process to rest.

"It's a feeling of relief," he said. "I'm just very excited and I can't wait to be a lion."

Wimbush is the second player to commit to Penn State Tuesday following Baldwin (Pittsburgh, Pa.) offensive tackle Sterling Jenkins, also a four-star recruit and the top ranked player in Pennsylvania, according to 247Sports.com. The Nittany Lions now have 15 players committed to the recruiting class of 2015, and arguably, the top class in the country.
