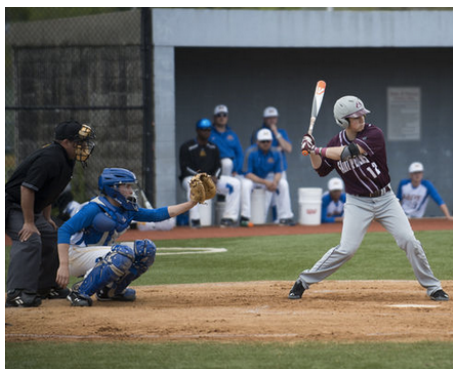

Baseball state championships: St. John Vianney beats St. Joseph (Mont.) for Non-Public A title

After St. John Vianney fell to rival Red Bank Catholic the day after its prom in the first round of the Shore Conference Tournament on May 17, coach Mike Morgan was not pleased with his team's lackadaisical mood after the game.

"I kind of yelled at them," Morgan recalled. "I told them to just get off the field and go home. They were just milling around and I said, 'Get out of here. I'll see you tomorrow.'"

With that, Morgan walked out of the dugout, leaving his team behind as an impromptu team meeting began.

"Our captains gathered us around and told us we were better than that," senior right-hander Justin Chin said. "We have so much talent. We just had to be able to put it together."

The Lancers undoubtedly did just that, finishing off one of the most improbable state tournament runs in recent memory with a 3-1 triumph over St. Joseph of Montvale, No. 5 in The Star-Ledger Top 20, in the NJSIAA/Star-Ledger Non-Public A final at Toms River East High.

"I'm speechless," said Chin, a NJIT signee who picked up his third victory in the state tournament and improved to 10-0 on the season with a masterful 6 1/3 inning performance, allowing a run on five hits with five strikeouts and no walks.

St. John Vianney, which opened the season No. 10 in The Star-Ledger Top 20 before falling out of the state poll for most of the spring, defeated three top 10 teams and Shore Conference and Monmouth County Tournament champion Christian Brothers en route to the championship, its first since 1981.

The Lancers (20-7) defeated No. 4 Bishop Eustace in the sectional quarterfinals, No. 7 Gloucester Catholic in the sectional semifinals and then St. Joseph (24-6-1) in the final.

"We're always the underdog," Chin said. "We wanted to show people what we can do."

Meet of Champions: Prep's Fitzpatrick talks impact of track on football

Junior Minkah Fitzpatrick is the top football recruit in the state. But today, he's competing on a completely different field, as the St. Peter's Prep athlete takes part in the NJSIAA Meet of Champions at South Plainfield.

Fitzpatrick finished 13th overall earlier in the 100 meter dash.

For Fitzgerald, track and field isn't just something fun to do - it's a tool he uses to improve his overall athletic ability. That will serve him well when he plays football with Division 1 powerhouse Alabama and head coach Nick Saban in the 2016 season.

"Track is a very competitive sport, and I'm a competitor," Fitzpatrick said. "It gets you a lot faster and a lot quicker with your breakaway speed for football and that's something you need as a corner, receiver and running back."

Last week at the Non-Public group meet, the Marauders had a strong showing. Jonathan Hilliman and Fitzpatrick ran under 11 seconds for the first time in the 100 meter dash.

"Today we're just trying to match what we did at groups of just make it a little bit better than that," coach Chris Caufield said. "They're peaking at the right time. I'm excited about it."

As a New Jersey native, the junior will travel far when he eventually makes his transition to the next level. But luckily for him, family is never far away

"I have a lot of family that's down there," he said. "My father's side of the family is from Alabama so its like a home away from home to be exact."

Fitzpatrick holds Saban and defensive coordinator Kirby Smart in high regard. Saban's focus on defensive back in particular has drawn his interest.

"It's definitely a blessing because there are so many kids that would like to be in my situation and you just have to take advantage of it, do your best and work hard."

Our Team was founded in the spring of 2010 out of the Passaic River Rowing Association (PRRA) Boathouse in Lyndhurst, NJ.

We compete against high school rowing programs from all over the tri-state area as well as teams from Maryland and Pennsylvania. The team currently consists of 40 members and is still growing.

Before a rower can participate, he must complete the following steps; must pass the swim test and watch a safety training video. Practice runs 5 days a week during the Fall and Spring seasons with indoor training during the winter on Prep's Rowing machines.

Program History:

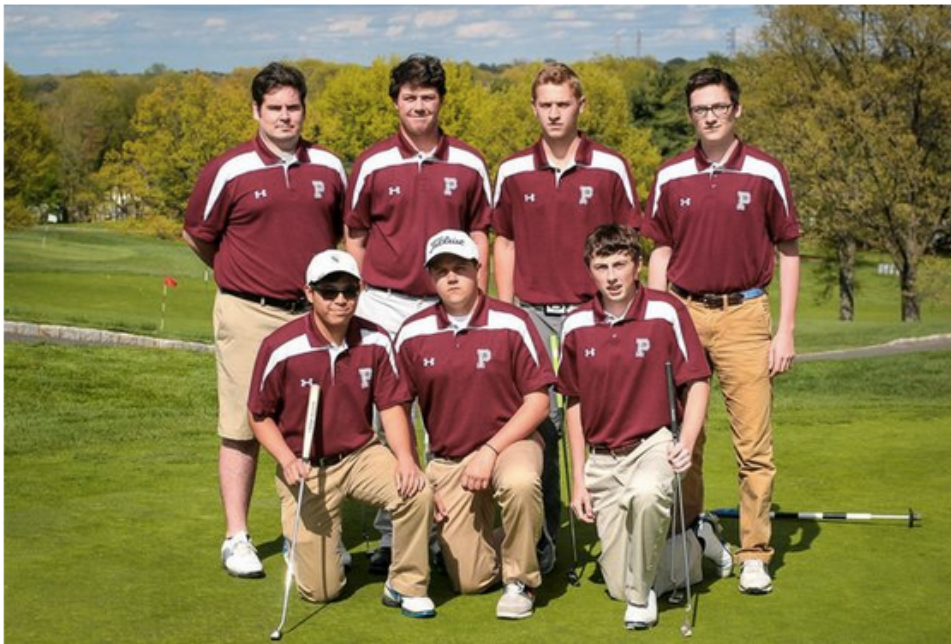

Kieran Purcell, Prep golf put together another stellar campaign in 2014:

Led by its prized football and basketball programs, St. Peter's Prep has become a long-established powerhouse on the New Jersey high school sports scene.

But another elite program has rapidly emerged at the school at Grand and Warren streets: golf.

Coming off an undefeated, 12-0 season in 2013, coach Ryan O'Flaherty's Marauders put together another great campaign this season, sitting at No. 9 on the most recent Star-Ledger Top 20. The Marauders finished 6-4 in a rugged dual meet slate, including a pair of impressive victories over fellow Top 20 members Don Bosco Prep (8) and Montclair Kimberley (20).

"I think I stepped in at exactly the right time. We have been loaded with talent each of the past two years," said O'Flaherty, who is in his second year directing Prep golf.

One such talent is Kieran Purcell, a senior who shot a section-best, one-under-par 70 in Monday's Non-Public A sectional tournament at Forest Hills Field Club in Bloomfield. Bergen Catholic won the overall tournament.

"He put it all together on Monday. The drives and especially the putts that he improved greatly on from last year all clicked for him," said O'Flaherty.

With his performance in the sectionals, Purcell, who signed a letter of intent to play golf for the University of Delaware, qualified for the Tournament of Champions slated for May 19 at the Hopewell Valley Golf Club. He also qualified for the tournament as a sophomore in 2012.

"I was in great form all year. I've been just having fun and playing with no pressure, and it paid off on Monday," Purcell said. "I expect to be right in (the mix) at the Tournament of Champions this coming Monday."

"Kieran has shot the lowest score in every single match and tournament since he was a freshman," said O'Flaherty. "Even when we don't have practice, he is totally committed and is golfing on his own. Every day, you can tell he is truly having fun and enjoying the game of golf."

St. Peter's participated in four different tournaments this year and finished no lower than third in all of them, including a first-place finish at the Fairleigh Dickinson Invitational on April 16. The Marauders also took third place in the Galloway National Challenge down in Atlantic County on April 22.

“In a match, you play nine holes. In a tournament, it’s a full 18. With the sectionals being an 18-hole play, we really like entering tournaments and want to add even more to the schedule next year. Plus, they all have great competition from all over the state,” explained O’Flahery.

But Prep is far from a one-man show. Paolo Matti, a junior, qualified for the Tournament of Champions a year ago, and he averaged a 36 in match play this season. He figures to be the top player in Prep's rotation next season.

Thomas Kaczan and Dan Harcourt, both juniors, also excelled for the Marauders this season. Harcourt, a standout for the Marauders hockey team, impressed O’Flaherty with his dedication to golf in the hockey offseason. Kaczan also turned heads by shooting a 79 at Monday’s sectionals.

“We have all of those guys coming back next year, along with some freshmen who impressed. The best part about it is that they all practice and get better on their own. I think we’ll be very good again,” added O’Flaherty.

Boys Volleyball State Final: Southern defends NJSIAA title with 25-27, 25-17, 25-14 win over St. Peter's

State championship or bust. That's the team motto at Southern Regional every season.

Southern, making its sixth consecutive appearance in the state final, packed a full house, pulled out a four-of-a-kind and came up aces in a 25-27, 25-17, 25-14 come-from-behind victory over St. Peter's Prep to win the championship of the NJSIAA/Star-Ledger tournament at South Brunswick High in Monmouth Junction.

Southern (39-2), No. 1 in The Star-Ledger Top 20 the entire season, won its fourth state title in the last six years and its second straight, holding off a fired-up St. Peter's, which took the first set.

"There was nothing I wanted more to do than send this team out on top," Southern's Mike Gesicki, a force inside with 15 kills and five blocks, said. "Going out on top with the winning kill, ending my high school sports career like that, going out as state champs -- it's a storybook ending."

"Amazing. It felt awesome last year, but as a senior this year -- wow," Harrison Lewis, with seven kills, said. "From Day 1 we set the goal -- back to the state finals. This is what we bleed -- black and yellow."

But it was No. 2 St. Peter's Prep (28-2) of Jersey City that seized the momentum from the opening serve. Tyler Lee, the All-State setter, found fellow senior captains Shayron Taylor and Spencer Shickora as St. Peter's established itself at the net and built a 17-11 lead. Even though Southern battled back to tie the score at 25-25, Shickora took matters into his own hands with back-to-back kills to give St. Peter's the first game, 27-25.

"I knew we still had some runs in us. I just kept telling the guys, 'keep working, stick together.' It was the best advice I could give them," Southern coach Eric Maxwell said. "We played awful in Game 1 and still we almost won."

The loss stung for Gesicki, Lewis and Chris Reed, the Manahawkin school's three seniors. Together, along with Liam Maxwell and Jake Logue, Southern came out fired up in the second set and quickly jumped to a 5-1 lead, which it extended to 10-3. St. Peter's fought back to 13-9 but it let it slip away. It was able to get within six several times at 17-11, 20-14 and 22-16, but two service errors coupled with Gesicki's presence inside proved too much to overcome as Southern won, 25-17, to force a crucial third set.

While Gesicki, an All-State middle blocker, continued to pound away, Southern adjusted in the third set by getting Maxwell and Lewis more involved, ultimately turning the tide for the Ocean County school.

"Once the momentum swung, I felt pretty good," Maxwell, the state's all-time winningest coach (425-83), said. "Liam came on with some great swings, then he went off-speed down the corner which I think broke their back. At 17-13 that shot that hit back corner -- shots like that can really deflate a defense."

"We were playing on our toes. We weren't coming up with any offense and they took advantage of us," St. Peter's Taylor, a senior middle who finished with 11 kills and four blocks, said. "We didn't execute. We tried to change up our defense the last second but it didn't work. They kept finding gaps."

After Maxwell's pinpoint shot, Southern took eight of the next nine points to capture the state title.

"All game that spot was open," Liam Maxwell, the coach's nephew, said. "I wasn't able to get it there, but when they started creeping in, a big corner opened up. It was perfect. We never lost faith in ourselves. We believed in each other."

"St. Peter's was just riding on emotion," Gesicki said. "They got tired in the third game, but we were just getting started."

St. Peter's motto all season has been, 'No Regrets, No Excuses' and the proud Jersey City school had neither after pushing Southern to the limit in three.

"I'm real proud of my teammates, I have no regrets, " Taylor said. "It was a great season with the boys."

"We didn't serve-receive well and we didn't pass," St. Peter's coach Maurice Washington said. "But there are no regrets. My guys had a phenomenal season. I'm not upset or sour with them. They left everything out on the court and that's all I can ask."

St. Peter's fell to 0-5 in state finals.

"We just didn't bring our A-game," St. Peter's senior outside Spencer Shickora said. "But I'm proud. We left it all out on the court. I'm walking out with my head held high."

Football recruiting: Presenting the NJ.com Top 50, June 2 update

NJ.com presents the June 2 update to the NJ.com Top 50, a ranking of the top 50 high school football recruits in New Jersey. The list is independent of class and encompasses the state's highest projected recruits, not necessarily its most valuable players.

The NJ.com Top 50 rankings take into consideration collegiate potential as reflected in FBS (formerly known as Division 1A) scholarship offers, the number and caliber of interested schools and overall potential.

Many in-state recruits utilized the spring evaluation period – which spans from April 15 to May 31 – to improve their stock while others saw their recruitment slow down.

During the evaluation period, colleges are allowed by the NCAA to send coaches to schools twice, once to evaluate athletics and another to evaluate academics. If the college coach does both evaluations on the same day, the school the coach represents is granted another athletic evaluation of the athletes at the school.

During this time, football recruits receive the majority of their athletic scholarship offers as coaches visit their high schools and consult with their coaches. However, coaches are not allowed to actually talk to recruits during these in-school evaluations (visits).

Players who competed often and attained positive results at off-season camps and combines were given the benefit of the doubt over players who have not been as active.

Minkah Fitzpatrick, St. Peter's Prep (Jersey City, N.J.) running back/cornerback and Alabama commit, remains the state's top recruit. He could have selected any school in the country to play for but chose the Crimson Tide – the most successful program in the country over the past decade (maybe, ever) – after building a significant relationship with head coach Nick Saban and the rest of his coaching staff.

Fitzpatrick was one of the top performers at Rivals Camp Series- New Jersey (RCS-NJ) and Nike Football Training Camp- New Jersey (NFTC-NJ) and earned his second ticket to the Opening, an elite event that brings the top football players from around the country together to the Nike campus in Beaverton, Ore., to take part in a litany of competitions.

Additional recruits who raised their stock since the last update include St. Peter's Prep junior quarterback Brandon Wimbush, St. Joseph Regional (Montvale, N.J.) junior offensive guard Tommy Hatton and DePaul Catholic (Wayne, N.J.) sophomore running back Kareem Walker, who all had productive springs.

Wimbush, who committed to Penn State in May, won quarterback MVP at RCS- NJ, top quarterback at NFTC-NJ, was a top performer at the Elite 11 Northeast regional and also attained a ticket to the Opening.

With Wimbush moving into the third spot, the Marauders claim two of the top three players in the state, and have four players on the list, overall – more than any other high school.
