## St. Peter's Prep shows grit as it rallies to defeat Gill St. Bernard's, 55-50 at the Newark Invitational.

With a lineup full of potential Division 1 players and an up-tempo offense, St. Peter's Prep might not sport the profile of a gritty squad.

The Jersey City school faced a 13-point deficit early in the third quarter when it showed it has the toughness to go with the talent.

A pressure defense and some clutch late baskets helped the No. 11 team in The Star-Ledger Top 20 rally to defeat No. 17 Gill St. Bernard's, 55-50, yesterday at the Newark National Invitational at Newark's Essex County College.

It was the 10th straight victory for St. Peter's Prep (15-2), which entered averaging 71.8 points per game. Gill St. Bernard's (12-4) was without star sophomore Tyus Battle due to a wrist injury. The Gladstone school is 3-2 without Battle, who is averaging 23.1 points per game.

"We've always prided ourselves as a gritty team and we're not ones to give up," St. Peter's Prep senior Austin White said. "We knew late in the second half that this was our game and we just had to take it from them. We definitely did that."

St. Peter's Prep trailed, 30-17, early in the third quarter but came back to take its first lead since the opening minutes when back-to-back 3-pointers from White and Nathaniel Pierre-Louis made it 40-37 with 4:33 left in the game.

Gill St. Bernard's answered with a 3-pointer by Harrison DeMaira and a John Michael Mea jumper to regain the lead. St. Peter's Prep went back in front for good with 3:30 left when Veer Singh, who missed the first 13 minutes due to the flu, hit a 3-pointer to make it 43-42. White, who was named Most Valuable Player for St. Peter's Prep, scored six of the game's next eight points to pull away.

"Things have been easy for us and we've been playing well, sharing the ball well. So, to take it as a positive, it was nice to see us come back from some adversity and with our backs against the wall," said St. Peter's Prep coach Todd Decker. "It showed that we have some soul."


St. Peter's comeback started with eight points from sophomore Najja Hunter in a span of less than 90 seconds, to cut the deficit to 33-26. Hunter finished with 10 points, while Singh scored all seven of his points in the second half. White scored 16 of his game-high 24 points after halftime, which began with St. Peter's Prep down, 25-15.

"It was (Najja's) energy in the second half that got us going," White said. "His play on the floor, got us a couple of quick buckets, his defense was incredible. I think without his energy, we wouldn't have won this game."


## More than a game, Chatham edges St. Peter's Prep, 3-2, in Yankee Stadium finale

It was far from just another game.

Anything less would diminish a contest nearly six months in the making, a collaboration of efforts by the Devils, Yankees and two high school hockey teams whose dream of skating on a bigger stage would not be denied. It will go down on record as a victory or a loss, but for Chatham and St. Peter's Prep, the experience will last a lifetime.

Ryan Barnett's second goal of the season, assisted by Austin Pierce with 11:20 remaining in the third period, put Chatham up by two and the reigning NJSIAA Public B champion, No. 7 in The Star-Ledger Top 20, received a standout 29-save effort from C.J. Albanese to hold on for a 3-2 victory over No. 13 St. Peter's Prep on the ice of Yankee Stadium yesterday in the Bronx.



On a grander stage, it was words left unspoken from an unlikely hero that defined the final of a three-game set featuring teams from New Jersey in the Bronx.


"I'm just speechless," Barnett mustered. "Just my second goal of the year -- and to do it on this stage ... I couldn't ask for a better place to score.

"We got a chip out, Austin carried it deep and got a shot off his pad. I was able to get to the rebound and put it home far side."

With the sun beaming down from blue skies overhead, the conditions proved favorable as both teams came out flying when adrenaline quickly took over.

Pierce put Chatham on the board first just 5:04 into the contest when the sophomore banged home the rebound off of a play begun by Teddy Simson and Robert Graziano, giving the Morris County school a 1-0 lead at 9:56 of the first period. The advantage was short-lived, however, as its Jersey City rival tied the score just 58 seconds later on a fabulous give-and-go between Augie Burkhardt and Sean Crowley.

"Growing up a Yankees fan, it was a dream come true to come and play here," said Burkhardt, who lifted Crowley's pass and deposited it top corner at 8:58 to tie the score, 1-1. "We knew we had a challenge in front of us and we didn't lay down. We played our hearts out out there."



Overall, Chatham's Albanese was pleased with the condition of the ice. The glare from the sun mirroring off the rink, he said, proved more difficult to navigate.

"In the beginning it was hard to see, but I coated up with eye black to counter the glare," Albanese said. "It was hard going side to side tracking the puck, but once we got it going, it got easier. We have a real solid 'D,' they moved guys out in front allowing me to see the shots and cleared rebounds."

Brett Montgomery picked up his junior goalie when he connected 2:58 into the second period for his team-leading 12th goal of the season on a two-on-one break with Pierce, as Chatham took the lead back. Barnett extended the lead 3:40 into the third period, making it 3-1 for the 2013 state champions with 11:20 remaining in regulation.



**St. Peter's never stopped battling** and the Jersey City school cut the deficit in half with 4:21 to go when senior captain Rocky Coviello crashed the net and converted with assists from Crowley and Burkhardt to make it 3-2. Afforded a power-play with 3:37 left, the only penalty called in the game, St. Peter's couldn't cash in and with 42 seconds remaining, pulled its goalie looking for the equalizer.

Coviello's marker, his 13th of the season, would be the last time it would solve Albanese, however

"Everyone came out pumped up, we just didn't adjust and get the job done today," Coviello said. "When we were coming out of the tunnel for warm-ups, walked up those steps and heard the crowd cheering, I got butterflies. As a Yankee fan, seeing the dugout, stepping on that ice, it was the coolest thing ever."

"A great experience and a great game and we're happy we came out on the winning side of it," Chatham coach Frank Gilberti said. "This created memories that will last a lifetime."





## Late rally dooms No. 4 St. Peter's Prep wrestling in 33-30 loss to No. 2 Bound Brook

With his team on the ropes against Bound Brook this afternoon, junior Christian Colucci staggered out onto the mat for St. Peter's Prep realizing that he needed a win to keep the Marauders in contention.

Riddled by injuries over the past week, Colucci knew his match wasn't going to be easy, but the junior also understood that his team needed a victory to stop a string of losses. It was a determination that paid off in Colucci's bout, but the winning result was ultimately just a brief moment of alleviation during a 33-30 loss.

"My team really brought me up today," Colucci said. "I've been having some tough times with injuries, but they kept me together with their support and that just pushed me to want the win even more."

Down 1-0 going into the third period of his match, Colucci chose to start on the bottom – a position he quickly escaped from to even the score. The tie would linger throughout the period, but just as the bout seemed to be headed for overtime, Colucci sprawled and unleashed a go-behind to clinch a 3-1 victory.

It was a moment that energized the Marauders (17-6) as well as coach Anthony Verdi, who had just watched a 21-9 lead slip away as his team surrendered two pins and a forfeit to the Crusaders (14-3), ranked No. 2 in the Star-Ledger Top 20.

"I talked to (Colucci) before the match about the strength being in his heart with his body banged up and he pulled it out with his heart today," said Verdi. "Even though he wasn't at full strength, he somehow found it inside of himself toward the end to get on top and get the two.

"It showed tremendous heart on his part."

Following Colucci's victory, the Marauders, ranked No. 4 in the Star-Ledger Top 20, came up inches short in two consecutive bouts as 220-pounder Jordan Fox wound up on the wrong side of a 6-4 sudden victory while senior Armond Cox fell 3-2 to Bound Brook's 285-pounder Stephen Johnson (11-1).

After the losses at the heavy weights, sophomore Alec Kelly, ranked No. 3 by the Star-Ledger at 106, recorded a pin in the match's final bout, but the six points came a little too late for the Marauders.

"It's tough to swallow because we were in the driver's seat after Colucci pulled out a big win," Verdi said. "If we win one of those two matches, we're in great shape to win, but we just didn't wrestle smart matches.

"Give (Bound Brook) credit though, their kids had a plan against our kids and they executed it and did a great job."

In the opening stages of the match, the Marauders seemed destined to repeat a 35-28 victory over Bound Brook from earlier this year, especially after freshman Nicholas Santos avenged a loss to Bound Brook's Gonzalo Limenza with a 7-4 win.

"Santos is better today than he was on January 4," said Verdi, referencing the last time the two squads met. "I had a good feeling about that matchup today and I wanted Santos to wrestle (Limenza) again because I thought he could beat him.

"It was a lot of pressure on Santos to come out and win the first match of the day, but he's a tough kid and he stepped up to the challenge today."

Senior Michael Russo and junior Ryan Burkert complemented Santos' victory with pins at 126 and 145, while Connor Burkert and Manny Ramirez claimed decisions at 138 and 152.





"Kings of Jersey City": St. Peter's Prep races past competition in Jersey City Indoor Track & Field Championships

In an outcome that has been the norm in Jersey City in recent years, the St. Peter's Prep boys team continued their dominance at the Jersey City Indoor Track & Field Championships today.

For the third straight season at the Jersey City Armory, the Marauders brought home the city title — a result that comes just days after their 4x800 relay team broke a Non-Public A record at the NJSIAA Indoor Track Relays. It was a win that earned St. Peter's Prep another year of bragging rights within the city's limits.

"It was nice to have success at the state level, but it's really nice to come to the Armory and do well and compete against great competition in such a great meet," said St. Peter's Prep coach Chris Caulfield.

The Marauders were led in the victory by four individuals who claimed first-place finishes for their school, including Jimmy Sause, Corey Caddle, Billy Fitzpatrick and Barrington Bennett — a victor in the 55-meter hurdles as well as the high jump.

What separated St. Peter's Prep though was a wealth of talent that allowed the team to place in every individual event during the meet.

"We had a lot of guys come out this year and that creates a lot of depth, which is nice in meets like this to have depth because there are a lot of teams in the city that are talented at different things," Caulfield said. "We just have to put up points where we can get them and our distance guys stepped up and we had some guys step up in different places to give us a full team effort."
