Boys Basketball: Austin White of St. Peter's Prep scores his 1,000th point.

St. Peter's Prep guard Austin White joined some exclusive company on Thursday night when he became just the ninth player in history to score 1,000 points at the Jersey City school.

White, a High Point commit and McDonald's All-American Game Nominee, reached the milestone with a 3-pointer at the end of the third quarter of St. Peter's 56-44 victory over Union City. White scored 14 of his game-high 19 pointers in the third.

In nine games this season, White, a three-year varsity player, is averaging 19.0 points per game to lead St. Peter's Prep to a 7-2 record and a No. 11 ranking in The Star-Ledger Top 20.

Last season, White was selected Second Team, All-Hudson and Third Team, All-Junior as he averaged 15.9 points per game for a St. Peter's Prep team which went 23-7 and won the North Jersey, Non-Public A title.

As a sophomore, White was selected Second Team, All-Hudson and Third Team, All-Freshman/Sophomore, averaging 16.2 points per game in a 19-7 season.





Wrestling: Bergen Catholic makes statement with 34-21 victory over St. Peter's Prep in final of Garden State Duals at Rutgers

It was a busy weekend for Bergen Catholic, the top-ranked team in The Star-Ledger Top 20.

Less than 24 hours after defeating No. 13 DePaul at home, the Oradell school downed No. 3 St. Peter's, 34-21, in the finals of the inaugural Garden State Duals on Saturday at Rutgers University.

"Our guys really stepped up to the challenge and really wrestled well," Bergen Catholic coach Dave Bell said. "I think they saved their best for last. St. Peter's is a tremendous program and we have a great amount of respect for them and we'll be competing with them all year. I know at the end of the year we're going to be butting heads with them."

Some of the team's starters skipped Friday night's match against DePaul. Among them were Johnny Sebastian, the No. 1 182-pounder in the state, and 2013 state-tournament qualifiers Laurien Anghelina (138) and Tyler Casamenti (120).

But against its North Jersey, Non-Public A rival, all three were in the lineup.

Wrapped in tape and sporting a brace just one week after dislocating his shoulder at The Clash national duals in Minnesota, Sebastian claimed an 8-0 major decision over Danny Sblendorio to push Bergen Catholic's lead to 34-6 with just four bouts remaining.

"I wanted to wrestle," Sebastian said. "It was kind of important for us to make a statement. I felt good, I warmed up well. I had my brace on and I was feeling comfortable with the moves I was trying to hit. Worst case scenario I knew I could injury default out or something. This was a big match for us as a team, going against the No. 3 team in the state. This kind of let us find out what we were made of. I was just glad to be a part of it."

Casamenti and Anghelina both fell in their bouts to ranked wrestlers, but Bergen Catholic would win eight of the 14 bouts.

"Those were some courageous performances," Bell said.

Nick Suriano (113), Pete Lipari (126), Zack Spira (145), Jordan Pagano (160), and Kevin Mulligan (170) all picked up bonus point for Bergen Catholic. For Mulligan, ranked No. 6 in the state at 170, it was his fourth win at the Duals. His previous wins included one against No. 8 Kenny Long of Holy Cross. For his efforts, he was named the tournament's Most Valuable Wrestler for the upper weights. D.J. Tirelli (138) of River Dell won the award for the lower weights.

To reach the final, St. Peter's downed No. 5 Delbarton, 32-29, with a fall from James Fox (220) in the final bout. Delbarton's Travis Vasquez, ranked No. 7 at 138, picked up a 3-1 victory over top-ranked Connor Burkert while St. Peter's Sonny Simonetti defeated No. 3 Christian Inarella, 3-1 in overtime.

Delbarton went on to finish third.

TASTY TIDBITS Prep's Dwyer jumps to top of the state

When Eamonn Dwyer was just a young boy, he would spend a lot of his time as a ball boy for the Marist High School girls' basketball team. His father, Rich, was always at the Marist gym, doing the public address announcing for the Lady Knights, coached by Rich's long-time friend, the late Bill DeFazio.

It gave Eamonn an introduction to athletics that he hasn't soon forgotten, as he has now developed himself, through a lot of dedication and hard work, as one of the premier high jumpers in New Jersey.

Last Monday night, Dwyer cemented his place as one of the very best, by clearing 6-feet, 8-inches at the Hudson County Relays Championships at the Jersey City Armory.

The performance, combined with that of teammate Barrington Bennett, enabled the Marauders to capture the high jump relay gold medal and helped the Marauders gain a share of the team title with Memorial at the relays championships.

By clearing 6-8, Dwyer has the best high jump currently in the state and No. 3 nationally.

"I was very happy when I cleared it, but I was really focused on clearing 6-10," Dwyer said. "I want to hit 6-10, then seven feet. I think I can go that high. I had one good attempt at 6-10 and almost got it. I was tired, but that's no excuse. I have to go for 6-10 now, then seven feet. That's the goal."

Dwyer has been very diligent in his approach to high jumping. He trains six days a week, almost five hours per day. Some days, he spends lifting weights. Others, he's in the pool in Bayonne working on his strength.

Dwyer has been training with former Olympian Milton Goode, who participated in the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles.

"He took a personal interest in me after seeing me at the [NJSIAA] Meet of Champions two years ago," Dwyer said. "He noticed that he thought I could go higher than 6-2 and that he could develop me."

Last May, Dwyer started working with Goode, who resides in Tinton Falls.

"He comes all the way up to train with me," Dwyer said. "He's helped me a tremendous amount. He has tremendous knowledge in the sport. I was always a good student of the sport, but he made me more of an educated student."

So Dwyer is hard at work until 10-10:30 every night to get to the next level.

"I never miss a workout," Dwyer said. "If I do, it's always in my mind that I have to work harder than the next person. I have to make sure that no one works harder than me. I have to dig deep down and find it within me to get it done. I'm very dedicated in my craft. I want to be the best."

Goode eventually jumped 7-3 during his high school days at Monmouth Regional in the 1980s. That's another goal of Dwyer, to reach what his coach reached before the spring season is over.

"I have a very strict workout plan," said Dwyer, who has yet to commit to a college, but is considering Rutgers, Penn State and the University of Miami. He wants to major in physical therapy in school.

"I've contacted some schools and they told me that if I cleared 6-10, then they would be interested," Dwyer said. "I don't think it's amazing that I've cleared 6-8, because I've trained so hard. To get the results I want, I have to work so hard. I expect so much of myself. That's why when I cleared 6-8, I had to shut everyone out, because I wasn't done yet. I had to go for 6-10."

Sounds like a very driven young man...

Boys swimming: Strong finish propels St. Peter's Prep past Pingry

Trailing through five of the meet's 11 events, St. Peter's Prep needed a quality result in the sixth event, the 100-meter freestyle. With the top three finishers of the race finishing within 0.12 seconds of each other, St. Peter's Prep captured a meet-turning 1-2 finish.

St. Peter's Prep, No. 14 in The Star-Ledger Top 20, didn't lose another event the rest of the meet en route to a 102-68 victory over No. 10 Pingry yesterday in Martinsville.

"The 100 was definitely the turning point in the meet," St. Peter's Prep coach Ryan Heffernan said. "That set the momentum. The kids were down, we gave up a few things earlier in the meet, so that 100 free was definitely the deciding factor that turned the meet for us."

With the Jersey City school trailing, 42-36, Matthew Giardiello won the 100 free in a time of 57.60 and Thomas Calloni placed second (57.70), thereby tying the score at 47-47. St. Peter's Prep never trailed again.

"I try to attack every race," Giardiello said. "But knowing that we were down, going into it I knew it was crucial to get a win. It felt really good to actually pull it out."

St. Peter's Prep continued to swim well following the 100 free, collecting 12 out of a potential 16 points in the 400 free to take a 59-51 lead. Johannes Calloni won the event in 4:15.85.

"Everyone was upset that we were behind," Johannes Calloni said. "So I just thought it would be nice to get a win and get the energy up a little bit. Everyone tried hard, pushed the limit, and it was a big win."

Pingry's Jamie Finnegan (2:01.08 in 200 free), Sebastian Lutz (2:17.31 in 200 IM) and Kamau Holston (26.11 in 50 free) followed up their team's victory in the 200 medley relay as the Martinsville squad seized a 26-20 lead through four events.

Lutz recorded his second individual victory in the 100 fly (1:01.36) as Pingry took its largest lead of the day, 35-27. But after Calloni's victory in the 400 free, St. Peter's Prep was victorious in the 200 free relay (1:46.20) and Calloni recorded his second individual victory in the 100 back (1:03.15).

Matthew Chu registered a first-place finish in the 100 breast (1:09.91), pushing St. Peter's lead to 92-64 heading into the final event.

"From freshman year I've watched this team grow and grow," said Giardiello, a senior. "My freshman year we never thought we'd come close to Pingry, so to come here and beat them by a large margin was unlike anything I've ever experienced. I have really high hopes for this team."
