The Marauder hockey team said hello to many new faces after graduating twelve senior varsity players last year. Although the team lost much, Coach Goodrich did not back down and again put together one of the toughest schedules in the tri-state area.

Aside from playing in the Gordon Conference, the best high school hockey conference in New Jersey, the team faced off against the Portledge School (New York), the Lawrenceville School, and last year's Public A state champion, the Randolph Rams. The squad finished at 7-16-1 in many players' first career varsity season. Despite the youth, the team advanced to both the quarterfinals of the Gordon Cup and the second round of the Non-Public state tournament for the second straight year.

John Kelly, Jr. '04 Marauder Radio Network Director of Broadcasting; Play by Play; Network Founder Rocky Coviello '14 led the team in all scoring categories with 14 goals, 14 assists, and 28 points. Sean Crowley '15 was a close second netting 12 goals and collecting 10 assists, while /inny Addeo '13 registered 13 goals and five assists. 



St. Peter's Prep boys ice hockey erupts in first period on way to 7-2 victory over St. Augustine

NEWARK — After being knocked back on its heels in the opening stages of the first period, the St. Peter's Prep ice hockey team needed just a single minute to get back on track in its 7-2 victory over St. Augustine Prep today at the AmeriHealth Pavilion.

The Marauders struck for three goals in a 61-second span during the first period, propelling them to their third victory of the season. Senior forward Ryen Pezzola notched two goals, while sophomore Augie Burkhardt finished with a goal and three assists, helping Prep improve to 3-1 this season.

Forced to play a man down after a hooking penalty put St. Augustine (1-2) on the power play just five minutes into the game, the Marauders seemed to be in a tight spot. While the South Jersey team got several shots on net during the man advantage, the St. Peter's defense and senior goaltender Jon Labella (34 saves) held strong and killed off the penalty — a stand that sparked the Marauders on the other end of the ice.

"(St. Augustine) got some opportunities and we didn't do too well on some of our defensive shifts, but (Jon) Labella was there to save us a bunch," said junior forward Sean Crowley. "He really gave us a lift today."

With the power play at its end, the Marauders (3-1) surged forward on offense, slicing through the Hermits back end to set up a goal a mere 14 seconds later from Burkhardt. That tally was only the beginning, as St. Peter's scored two more times courtesy of senior Sam Burkhardt and Crowley in a span of 61 seconds.

Senior Mike Zawiskowski would also score later in the period to give the Marauders a 4-0 lead heading into the first intermission.

"We're playing as a team now," Crowley said of the Marauders' success in the opening period. "We were really focused before the game and came out hard and just got it done (in the first period)."The second period carried much of the same for the Marauders, who watched senior Rocky Coviello and Pezzola send shots into the back of the net. Meanwhile, the St. Peter's defense somehow managed to keep the Hermits off the board in spite of facing the task of killing three power plays — a feat accomplished thanks to stout performances in the defensive zone and in net.

"Jon played great today, but I don't think we really let up too many quality shots," said interim coach Chris Gannon, who has been filling in for head coach Mike Goodrich since the fourth-year head coach recently tore his Achilles tendon.


"We had a lot of bodies in front of the puck before it was able to make it to the net a lot of the time. There were a lot of shots, but they weren't just easy, single shots on net."

The shutout would come off the books in the game's final period as the Richland-based school lit up the scoreboard twice, but the final 15 minutes of play did not take away from the overall lesson of the game, which was won with a concerted effort.

The two Gordon Conference opponents will meet again Friday, as Prep travels to the Mt. Laurel Igloo for a 4:40 p.m. puck drop.

These three times are considered 2nd Team All American Elite by the National Website Milesplit. Sophomore Billy Fitzpatrick was 4th in 16:37.0, Senior David DeLeon was 5th in 16:45.0, Sophomores Will Delaney was 6th in 16:52.0 and Brandon Parrado was 7th in 16:58.0. All of these times are personal best times for these runners. This is a cross country shutout for a school to finish the top seven runners for the first time in Jersey City history. While it is not unusual for fencers to compete in all three events, they generally choose to develop their skills in one weapon. Foil and épée are point-thrusting weapons. Sabre is a point-thrusting as well as a cutting weapon. The target areas differ for the three weapons, though all three are scored electrically.
