1,000 McCluer Students to Graduate

The largest graduating class in St. Louis County and the largest in the history of the Ferguson-Florissant District, will be awarded diplomas by Board of Education President Norman E. Wolff on Friday evening, at Kiel Auditorium. The program will begin promptly at 8 p.m. as the McCluer High School Orchestra strikes up the music for the processional of over 1000 graduates into the auditorium.

Pastor of Christ the King Lutheran Church, will give the invocation, followed by the addresses of the valedictorian and salutatorian.

Randall Russell, president of the graduating class, will present the 1969 Senior gift to Superintendent of Schools Dr. Warren M. Brown. The senior choir, under the direction of B. C. Bundy, will sing, "You'll Never Walk Alone," and "Sound of Silence."

Dr. Merlin A. Ludwig, principal of McCluer High

School, will present the class to Mr. Wolff who will award the diplomas. The Reverend Paul Oye will give the benediction to be followed by the singing of the Alma Mater and the recessional from the auditorium.
