#### ALUMS CONQUER BOOK WORLD

Recently published are:

 "Falkland Road: PROSTITUTES OF BOMBAY" by Mary Ellen Mark '58 Alfred A. Knopf

"'Falkland Road' is a book of color photos — probably the first — of the poorest prostitutes in Bombay. In order to get such photos — some of which are stunning in their capturing of a moment — Mark lived with them,"

"The pictures record the colorful, but economically desperate lives of Indian women aged 13-61."

"These photos succeed in bringing us closer, without intrusion or stereotyping, to the special, pulsing beauty of their world."

Mary Ellen Mark is an internationally known Photo-journalist and this is her tenth book to be published. In 1980 she was the recipient of a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.

"Pathway to Ecstasy"
Patricia Goff Garfield, '52, Ph.D.

Pat is a San Francisco based clinical psychologist. She has written books on Dreaming. Her first book "Creative Dreaming" was on the Southern California Best Seller list in 1975. Her recent book, "Pathway to Ecstasy The Way of The Dream Mandala" was reviewed as being engrossing, provocative and revolutionary. She writes in alternating chapters of dream interpretation and startlingly candid autobiography.

From the concepts of Tibetan sacred art she has devised a Dream Mandala, a way to organize one's dream symbolism.

Dr. Garfield travels widely, lecturing and giving special seminars on dreams. She does research in dream consciousness and control and publishes in professional journals.

 "Stay Tuned" by Richard Levinson & William Link '52 St. Martin's Press, C.H.S. Hall of Fame Winners.

"Stay Tuned" is a memoir about Levinson & Link's working life in television. They are considered one of TV's best writing and producing teams.

One reviewer says, "Their overall opinion of TV is one of sober realism. Link & Levinson say in their book 'As the medium stumbles into the 80's, it trails a wake of failed promises and richly deserved critical abuse."
