### Alumni Book Corner

Robert J. Myers, '29, who at the age of 22 completed the actuarial formulas for FDR's "new" Social Security System and who now heads President Reagan's new National Commission on Social Security as its executive director has just published the second edition of Social Security. This book has been called the most "authoritative volume on the social security system ever written. Myers' book deals with both the factual aspects of the various government programs and the underlying policy issues, and it makes recommendations for program changes. "An unequaled reference book." And who better to have written this text than Myers, who for years was the chief actuary of the Social Security System.

Dr. Robert C. Solomon, '60, has just published his 11th book, entitled LOVE: EMOTION, MYTH AND METAPHOR (Doubleday, Inc., released September 1, 1981). He is currently visiting professor of philosophy at Harvard University and Mt. Holyoke. Solomon received his master's and doctoral degrees in philosophy and psychology from the University of Michigan.

His current book is a semi-pop psychological and philosophical survey of the Grand Passion.
