

Applications are sent to Beaver College to be forwarded to Princeton University for evaluation in much the same way that applications for financial aid by students applying for admission to college are handled.

BRUCE GREENBLATT plans to major in Political Science or Accounting. While a student he spent much of his free time working at a local store to earn money for tuition.

HAE-EUN KANG will pursue a course in Biology or Pre-Med. At CHS she was active in all forms of musical productions including the Ensemble and the Fall production. Hae-Eun also served as a piano accompanist for these groups.

ZACHARY SHORE will concentrate on English, International Relations and Politics. He recently won second place in the local newspaper scholarship competition. He place fifth in the National Problem Solving Bowl.
